CCAA RETURNS TO LEAGUE WARFARE AS HOLIDAY CEASE-FIRE ENDS

LEAGUE BATTLES CARRY OVER TO A NEW CENTURY . . . The CCAA men's and women's basketball season resumes after a two-week holiday span that consisted exclusively of non-league encounters. Week number four of the league slates feature some intriguing matchups throughout California, including a battle of first-place teams on the women's side. League co-leader CAL STATE STANISLAUS, which has yet to lose at home in four games, hosts co-leader CHICO STATE on **Friday, Jan. 7** before CSUS hosts defending league champion UC DAVIS on Saturday. In men's basketball, 1999 West Region Champion CAL STATE, SAN BERNARDINO hosts CAL STATE L.A. (currently tied for second in the CCAA) on Friday. UC DAVIS takes on CAL STATE BAKERSFIELD in central California that same evening. CSUB, fresh off winning its own State Farm Roadrunner Classic tournament, was the only team to sweep 1999 CCAA Champion UCD in league play a year ago. Entering the week, four men's teams are tied for second place at 4-2, three are tied for sixth at 3-3 and three more are tied for ninth at 2-4. A similar story is unfolding on the women's side with a three-way first-place tie and a four-way tie for eighth, making the CCAA one of the most competitive leagues in the country.

OTHER CCAA NEWS AND NOTES... CAL POLY POMONA junior **Ruth Van't Land** has been named the *1999 NSCAA/adidas NCAA Division II Women's Soccer Player of the Year.* Van't Land, a two-time All-American forward from Chino, Calif., is the CCAA all-time career goals and points leader and was named CCAA Female Athlete of the Year last spring... Van't Land and Cal Poly Pomona alums **Gary Borbon** and **Aldora George** (track & field) were among the *Inland Valley Daily Bulletin* newspaper's Top 100 Athletes of the 20th Century... UC DAVIS men's soccer coach **Dwayne Shaffer** was named the 1999 NSCAA Far West Region Coach of the Year after leading the Aggies to the regional championship... UC Davis is currently ranked No. 6 and Cal Poly Pomona No. 14 in the Sears Directors' Cup standings. The Directors' Cup is awarded to the nation's most successful athletic department following the completion of each academic year.

CSUB'S JAMAL LIVINGSTON NAMED RAWLINGS PLAYER OF THE WEEK



WALNUT CREEK, Calif. -- CAL STATE BAKERSFIELD forward **Jamal Livingston** has been named the Rawlings California Collegiate Athletic Association Men's Basketball Player of the Week for the week of December 27-January 2.

Livingston, a 6-7 senior from Bronx, NY, led the Roadrunners to the State Farm Roadrunner Classic tournament championship with a pair of strong performances last week. In a 76-41 win over Evergreen State, Livingston was a defensive force with nine rebounds and five blocked shots to go with eight points on the offensive end. He was

named tournament most valuable player after leading CSUB to a 76-59 win over Molloy College in the title game with game-highs of 22 points and nine boards to go with two blocked shots and two steals.

For the week, Livingston averaged 15.0 points, 9.0 rebounds, 3.5 blocked shots and 1.0 steals while shooting 66.7 percent from the floor (12-18) and converting six of seven free-throw attempts. The Player of the Week honor is the second for Livingston this season. With seven blocked shots last week, Livingston now has 83 for his career, just 10 shy of the CSUB all-time record.
