## SATURDAY NIGHT FEVER RETURNS TO THE CCAA

**SATURDAY NIGHT'S ALL RIGHT FOR FIGHTIN'** . . . Davis and Pomona are the "first places" to be on Saturday night as the top teams in men's and women's basketball continue their quest to either defend or garner the league's top spots. Week five of the 11-week men's marathon pits No. 24 and league-leader CAL STATE, SAN BERNARDINO at No. 7 UC DAVIS on *Saturday, January 15 at 8 p.m. (Recreation Hall)*. The Ags have won four straight but will face a tough UC RIVERSIDE squad (tied for fourth in the CCAA) before playing CSUSB. The Coyotes likewise have a difficult encounter at CHICO STATE (4-4 in the CCAA) before playing Davis. Down south, league-leading and 17th-ranked CAL POLY POMONA hosts second-place CAL STATE STANISLAUS on Saturday at *Kellogg Gymnasium*. Stanislaus plays at GRAND CANYON on Friday before venturing to Pomona. The Stanislaus Warriors commence this week's action with a non-conference home game tonight against College of Notre Dame at 7 p.m.

## SAN BERNARDINO'S LOHNNIE TAPE' NAMED RAWLINGS PLAYER OF THE WEEK



WALNUT CREEK, Calif. -- CALSTATE, SAN BERNARDINO swingman **Lohinnie Tape'** has been named the Rawlings California Collegiate Athletic Association Men's Basketball Player of the Week for the week of January 3-9.

Tape', a 6-6 senior from Chicago, earned the award for the second time this season by leading the No. 24 Coyotes to a pair of CCAA victories over Cal State L.A. and Cal State Dominguez Hills last week. The wins preserved CSUSB's top spot in the league standings.

Tape' was a key factor in San Bernardino's 71-62 triumph over CSLA with 17 points, nine rebounds, two assists, two steals and zero turnovers in 27 minutes of action. The following night, Tape' was the driving force behind the Coyotes' 68-63 win over Cal State Dominguez Hills as he led all scorers with 25 points (8-12 FG, 8-9 FT) and added nine rebounds and three steals while again committing no turnovers. For the week, Tape' averaged 21.0 points, 9.0 rebounds and 2.5 steals and shot 57 percent from the floor (13 of 23).
