BASKETBALL SQUADS ENTER STRETCH RUN

SHARPENING THE SENSES AS THE REAL TEST BEGINS . . . Exactly four weeks remain in the CCAA basket-ball seasons and the postseason contenders have established themselves as upper-division clubs. The challenge before them to stay the course is to win the rest of their home games and split on the road. For squads aspiring to win the league crown, or defend it in the case of both UC DAVIS teams, the formula is simple: win out. The Ags' must become road warriors if they are to do so, as six of their remaining eight games are on opposing hardwood. The CAL STATE, SAN BERNARDINO men and the CAL POLY POMONA women, currently the league leaders (CSUSB is tied with UCD), face similar tasks if they are to unseat the Aggies. Two important matchups featuring the men's co-leaders commence the action on Friday. San Bernardino hosts third-place Pomona at Coussoulis Arena and UC Davis takes on fourth-place CAL STATE L.A. at the Eagles' Nest in Los Angeles on Friday, February 4 at 8 p.m. On the women's side, the top four squads take to the road with Pomona at the Inland Empire schools, CAL STATE STANISLAUS (second place) at the Bay Area schools, CHICO STATE and Davis (both tied for third) at the L.A. schools. In other news, lots of spring sports action is scheduled for this week, never mind that there are still seven official weeks of winter remaining. The featured CCAA spring sport event this week is the annual Cal State Stanislaus softball tournament in Modesto Feb. 4-6, as seven other conference clubs in addition to the host Warriors take part in the inviitational.

OTHER CCAA NEWS AND NOTES... UC Davis drew 7,199 fans, the third highest mark in school history, for its men's basketball game with SONOMA STATE last week. The women's contest drew 3,188 and ranked fifth all-time at UC Davis . . . UC SAN DIEGO has named **Earl Edwards** as the Director of Athletics, effective March 1, 2000. Edwards has been the Athletics Director at East Stroudsburg.

CAL STATE BAKERSFIELD'S SELLEAZE NAMED RAWLINGS PLAYER OF THE WEEK



WALNUT CREEK, Calif. -- CAL STATE BAKERSFIELD forward Ron Selleaze has been named the Rawlings California Collegiate Athletic Association Men's Basketball Player of the Week for the week of January 24-30.

Selleaze, a 6-5 senior from Oakland, Calif., kept the Roadrunners in contention for a postseason berth with a pair of strong performances in leading CSUB to home wins over Cal State, San Bernardino and UC Riverside last week. Selleaze scored 22 points, pulled down seven rebounds and added three steals and two blocked shots to lead the

Runners to a 61-58 upset of league co-leader San Bernardino. He then scored 16 of his game-high 26 points in the first half to power CSUB to a 67-53 win over UC Riverside. Selleaze added a season-high 12 rebounds and four steals in the victory over UCR, which improved Bakersfield's league standing to sixth at 8-6.

The pair of 20-point scoring performances gave Selleaze nine on the season, tying him for the conference lead. For the week, Selleaze averaged 24.0 points, 9.5 rebounds, 3.5 steals and 1.0 blocked shots per game while shooting 47.2 percent from the floor. The CCAA Player of the Week honor is the first of his career.
