THREE-WEEK RUN FOR THE HOOPS CROWNS

RAISING THE STAKES ... The CCAA men's basketball race enters the final three weeks with five teams still in contention. CAL STATE, SAN BERNARDINO, the league leader at 13-3, travels to the Bay Area this weekend while second place UC DAVIS (12-4) travels to GRAND CANYON (9-7, T6) and CAL POLY POMONA (10-6, T4). The marquee matchup on Friday, February 11 pits two programs looking to return to prominence when CAL STATE L.A. (11-4, 3rd) travels to CAL STATE BAKERSFIELD (10-6, T4). Gametime at Centennial Garden is 7 p.m. In women's basketball, Cal Poly Pomona controls its own fate. With six games remaining, the Broncos (13-1 CCAA) hold a two-and-a-half game lead over runner-up CHICO STATE(11-4) and can widen that gap when it meets Chico on Friday at 5:45 p.m. in Kellogg Gymnasium. The CCAA league season begins in softball this weekend with three twinbills on Friday and four on Saturday. Defending CCAA co-champion UC Davis hosts CAL STATE STANISLAUS on Friday at 1:30 p.m. and co-champion Cal State Bakersfield opens at CAL STATE DOMINGUEZ HILLS at 12 p.m. on Saturday. On the women's tennis front, defending league champion Cal State Bakersfield hosts a solid Grand Canyon club on Friday at 11 a.m. Canyon will then take on traditional power UC Davis in Bakersfield on Saturday, Feb. 12. Davis plays Bakersfield on Sunday, Feb. 13. In baseball, several non-league doubleheaders between CCAA members are on the slate, beginning Tuesday, Feb. 8 with UC RIVERSIDE playing at Cal State, San Bernardino, and SAN FRANCISCO STATE meeting SONOMA STATE in the North Bay. In track & field CAL POLY POMONA opens its outdoor season at the Long Beach Relays (marks DO NOT count until March 1).

CAL STATE L.A.'s QUINCY STINSON NAMED RAWLINGS PLAYER OF THE WEEK



WALNUT CREEK, Calif. -- CAL STATE L.A. guard **Quincy Stinson** has been named the Rawlings California Collegiate Athletic Association Men's Basketball Player of the Week for the week of January 31-February 6.

Stinson, a 6-0 junior from Altadena, Calif., carried the Golden Eagles to a pair of important home victories last week, keeping Cal State L.A. in the hunt for the league crown.

In a 53-50 win over then-No. 15 UC Davis, Stinson came through with a game-high 20 points on 58 percent shooting (7-12), including four of seven from three-point land. He added four rebounds, three steals and two assists as Cal State L.A. saddled the region's second-ranked team with just its fourth loss this season.

Stinson came back the following night to score a game-high-tying 24 points on 63 percent shooting (9 of 14) in a 78-68 win over Chico State. After spraining his ankle early in the contest and playing just eight minutes in the first period, Stinson returned for the entire second half to rally the Eagles from an 11-point halftime deficit with 12 points in a six-minute span. Stinson finished the game with three steals, three rebounds and two assists and completed the week averaging 22 points on 61.5 percent shooting (16 of 26), 3.5 rebounds, 3.0 steals and 2.0 assists. The Player of the Week honor is the second for Stinson this season.

WALNUT CREEK, Calif. -- CAL POLY POMONA forward **Lauri McIntosh** has been named the Rawlings California Collegiate Athletic Association Women's Basketball Player of the Week for the week of January 31-February 6.

McIntosh, a 5-10 sophomore from Diamond Bar, Calif., continued upward on the All-America campaign trail in a pair of wins at Cal State, San Bernardino and UC Riverside. The CCAA's leading scorer (20.9 ppg), McIntosh blazed her way to a game-high 30 points on 75 percent shooting (12 of 16, 6-7 FT), and a game-high nine rebounds and

two assists in only 24 minutes of action to lead the Broncos to a 100-65 romp of CSUSB.
