SPRINGING INTO ACTION

INSIDE AND OUT... A near-perfect blend of CCAA and non-league play highlights most of the schedules this week, with action beginning on **Monday, March 27** in golf with the *Geo Buzzini Invitational* hosted by CAL STATE STANISLAUS. The tourney, which features several CCAA and non-CCAA squads, lasts through Tuesday. Tuesday is the initial day of a full slew of baseball and softball contests. In baseball, an important series between SONOMA STATE and UC DAVIS begins **Tuesday, March 28 at 2:30 p.m.** in Rohnert Park. The Ags will travel to Sonoma once more on Friday for a single game and the two squads will meet for a twin bill in Davis on Saturday afternoon. Another key baseball series takes place in the Valley of the Sun as GRAND CANYON, ranked fifth nationally, hosts upstart CAL STATE L.A. in a four-game set beginning **Friday, March 31 at 3 p.m.** Softball action commences Tuesday with Chaminade taking on SAN FRANCISCO STATE in a non-league doubledip beginning at 2 p.m. Chaminade will then head up Highway 101 for a twin bill at Sonoma State on Wednesday. After that, it's full speed ahead with CCAA doubleheaders Friday and Saturday. Several non-conference women's tennis matches are on the schedule, with no fewer than three matches each day Friday through Sunday. The track & field season is heating up through California. Three noteworthy meets are scheduled for Saturday: the *San Francisco State Johnny Mathis Open*, the *UC RIVERSIDE Classic*; and a US Collegiate Track Series meet at UC Davis that will feature Division I powerhouse Stanford, defending Big West Champion Utah State, Nevada and CHICO STATE.

CCAA NEWS AND NOTES . . . UC Davis announced the class of 2000 for the Cal Aggie Athletic Hall of Fame. Among the honorees to be inducted on June 3 is current Aggie assistant cross country coach **Bret Kimple**, a two-time athletic All-American in cross country and the track steeplechase, and an academic All-American who received an NCAA Postgraduate Scholarship . . . UC Davis named Stephanie Hawbecker its new women's volleyball head coach. Hawbecker was the head coach at Virginia Tech for the past nine seasons, posting a 166-134 mark. She replaces Sharon King, who accepted the head coaching position at Butler . . . CAL POLY POMONA Athletic Director Karen Miller worked the last day of her 26-year career at the school on Friday, March 24. Dr. Ky Kugler, who was originally scheduled to take over the Director position on April 1, assumed the title immediately. Kugler had been the Assistant Director for Development at Poly, and has since appointed Business Manager Chris Ward and Head Athletic Trainer David Ramirez to assume a co-development director position in the interim . . . GRAND CANYON's 1974-75 NAIA men's basketball national championship team celebrated the 25th anniversary of the triumph on the GCU campus last weekend. Canyon is the first four-year institution from the state of Arizona to win a basketball national championship . . . Cal Poly Pomona women's basketball star and CCAA Player of the Year Lauri McIntosh was named to the WBCA Kodak Division II All-America Team last week . . . Cal State Bakersfield men's basketball star and CCAA Player of the Year Ron Selleaze was named to the Daktronics Division II All-America Second Team last week . . . UC Davis women's cross country All-American Sarah Shuler and All-CCAA men's soccer standout MattDeJong were named to the GTE All-Academic District VIII Teams last week (Shuler to the at-large team, DeJong to the soccer squad). Shuler carries a 3.75 grade point while double-majoring in anthropology and history, and DeJong is the owner of a 3.73 grade point in civil engineering. Both student-athletes are juniors.

CSLA'S MIKE BURNS NAMED RAWLINGS PITCHER OF THE WEEK



WALNUT CREEK, Calif. -- CAL STATE L.A. righthander **MikeBurns** has been named the Rawlings California Collegiate Athletic Association Baseball Pitcher of the Week for the week of March 20-26.

Burns, a 6-1 senior from Diamond Bar, Calif., fired the third no-hitter overall by a CCAA squad this year, and the CCAA's second nine-inning, complete-game no-hit performance of 2000. Burns was masterful in a 7-0 win at Cal State Dominguez Hills, narrowly missing a

perfect game by virtue of a CSLA fielding error. He faced just one batter over the minimum, walked zero and struck out five. Burns gave Cal State L.A. its second no-hitter in as many years, as former Golden Eagle Steve Brown accomplished the feat in 1999. The Pitcher of the Week honor is the first for Burns in 2000.

SONOMA STATE'S DEREK BELL NAMED RAWLINGS PLAYER OF THE WEEK



WALNUT CREEK, Calif. -- SONOMA STATE shortstop **Derek Bell** has been named the Rawlings California Collegiate Athletic Association Baseball Player of the Week for the week of March 20-26.

Bell, a senior from Bakersfield, Calif., powered the No. 11 Cossacks to four victories in five games last week, four of which were CCAA triumphs over NorCal rival Cal State Stanislaus.

Bell was solid at the plate (7 for 21, .333) and provided the impact blows that put SSU over the top in the four victories. He finished the week with four home runs to increase his season total to 10, which tied his 1999 season mark, and added another run, eight RBI and a stolen base.

Bell opened the week with three hits, two of which were round-trippers, and three RBI in an extra-inning defeat to Metropolitan State. He then belted another home run and had two RBI in a 19-4 romp at Stanislaus. Bell's three-run bomb over the center field wall was the crushing blow in Sonoma's 8-2 win over CSUS to conclude the series and a 4-1 week for the Cossacks.

Jeff Ellena - SS, CAL POLY POMONA: Was a main reason why Pomona split at No. 5 Grand Canyon last week. In four games, he hit .471 (8 for 17) with an .824 slugging percentage, 3 doubles, HR, 7 RBI last week. Went 4 for 5 with 6 RBI, including a two-run homer that provided the game-winning difference in an 11-6 win.

Luke Steidlmayer - RHP, UC DAVIS: Fired a complete-game, seven-inning win at then-No. 1 Chico State last week, scattering 7 hits and a walk, allowing 3 earned runs and striking out 2.

Jay Caligiuri - 3B, CAL STATE L.A.: Hit .533 (8 for 15) in a four-game series with Cal State Dominguez Hills. Had a H, 3 runs, 2 RBI in a game-one win over CSUDH. 2 hits, run, stolen base, RBI in game-two win. Two hits, HR, stolen base and an RBI in game-four win.

Alex Carbajal - LHP, CHICO STATE: Came on in relief of the series finale against UC Davis in the second inning with Chico in a 7-0 hole. Scattered 9 hits, 1 run and struck out 5 in 5.0 innings as Chico eventually came back to win. In another relief appearance, Carbajal shut out Willamette for 4.0 innings, giving up only 1 hit and striking out 10, six of those coming in the sixth and ninth frames when he struck out the side.

WALNUT CREEK, Calif. -- UC DAVIS outfielder **Shyamala White** has been named the CCAA Softball Player of the Week for the week of March 20-26.

White, a sophomore from Carmel, was the driving force behind five Aggie wins in six games at the Cal State Hayward Pioneer Classic last week. She hit .556 (10 for 18), with two doubles, nine runs and seven RBI last week as the Aggies defeated Cal State Hayward, Western Oregon, Cal Lutheran, College of Notre Dame and Central Washington before falling to tourney champion Humboldt State in the semifinals. CAL STATE BAKERSFIELD'S MELANIE WOOD NAMED PITCHER OF THE WEEK

WALNUT CREEK, Calif. -- CAL STATE BAKERSFIELD pitcher **Melanie Wood** has been named the CCAA Softball Pitcher of the Week for the week of March 20-26, the third consecutive time she has earned the award.

A junior righthander from Tujunga, Calif., Wood continues to dominate every lineup she faces. She pitched in five games last week, winning three and saving another. Two of Wood's victories were complete-game shutouts at Cal State, San Bernardino and Cal State Dominguez Hills, and she allowed just one run in her lone loss of the week, a 10-inning setback to regional rival Western Washington.

She threw her 10th and 11th games this season allowing four or fewer hits against CSUSB and CSUDH. She won both games against Cal State Dominguez Hills, pitching two innings of no-hit four-strikeout relief in the second game after blanking the Toros in the opener. She tossed a three-hitter in the first game of the twinbill at San Bernardino, then earned the save in the second contest. WALNUT CREEK, Calif. -- CAL STATE BAKERSFIELD high jumper **David Larsen** and UC DAVIS distance runner **Jeff Kaiser** have been named the California Collegiate Athletic Association Men's Track & Field Co-Athletes of the Week for the week of March 20-26.

Larsen, a senior from Bakersfield who is still recovering from an injury, won the high jump at the Northridge Invitational last week with an NCAA Division II season-best mark of 6-11.5 last week. Already a provisional qualifier for the national championship meet, Larsen produced an effort that bettered individuals from several Division I programs.
