CONTENDERS READY FOR STRETCH RUN

COUNTING DOWN . . . The CCAA spring sports title contenders test themselves in contests of added importance this week as the league championship events in men's golf, baseball and track & field near. Meanwhile, the women's tennis and softball schedules are nearing completion with every game among conference contenders becoming more and more critical. Any and all CCAA men's golf squads looking to earn their way to the NCAA Division II West Regional find themselves in Olympia, Wash. on Monday and Tuesday (**Apr. 3-4**) for the first District Qualifier of the spring season. The baseball scene continues to intrigue, with six teams still in contention for the four CCAA Championship Tournament berths. League leader CHICO STATE, ranked fourth in the nation, hosts No. 11 SONOMA STATE on Tuesday (**Apr. 4, 2:30 p.m.**) and Friday (**Apr. 7, 2:30 p.m.**) before the two squads meet in Sonoma for a Saturday afternoon doubleheader (**Apr. 8, 1 p.m.**). Also of note in baseball this week is the final CCAA series between longtime members CAL STATE L.A. and UC RIVERSIDE, as UCR is leaving the conference after the current academic year. In softball, the quest for the CCAA title could very well be decided this week as defending co-champion CAL STATE BAKERSFIELD, tied for seventh nationally, hosts defending co-champion UC DAVIS (**Fri., Apr. 7, 1:30 p.m.**) and second-place CHICO STATE (**Sat., Apr. 8, 12 p.m.**) this week after making up a previously rained out doubleheader at CAL STATE STANISLAUS (**Tues., Apr. 4, 1:30 p.m.**). Five weeks to go before the conference track & field championships and a pair of key competitions this week should serve as a preview of what to expect come May. CAL STATE STANISLAUS hosts its annual invitational and UC SAN DIEGO hosts a collegiate open meet in La Jolla on **Sat., Apr. 8**. In women's tennis, the scene shifts to Pomona as CAL POLY POMONA hosts several CCAA squads at its annual *Xenia Anastasiadou Memorial Tournament* Friday through Sunday.

SONOMA STATE'S DEREK BELL NAMED RAWLINGS PLAYER OF THE WEEK



WALNUT CREEK, Calif. -- SONOMA STATE shortstop **Derek Bell** has been named the Rawlings California Collegiate Athletic Association Baseball Player of the Week for the week of March 27-April 2. Bell, a senior from Bakersfield, Calif., earned the honor for the second consecutive week after providing the bulk of the Cossacks' offensive production to lead SSU to four wins in five games last week. Three of the triumphs were CCAA victories over rival UC Davis that gave the Cossacks a three and a half game lead for the third seed in the upcoming CCAA Championship tournament.

Bell finished the week with a solid .416 batting average (10 of 24); but as was the case a week ago, the impact of his blows far outweighed his average. He powered Sonoma to victory as he belted four home runs, one of which was a grand slam, and drove in a total of 13 runs. Bell clubbed a homer and had three RBI in an 11-10 home win over UC Davis, then ripped the grand slam to lead the Cossacks to a game one victory in a doubledip at UCD the following day. Bell's 14th home run of the year in a non-league win over Hawaii Pacific to cap the week established a new school record and added to his SSU career mark of 32 in a 5-2 Cossack win.

GRAND CANYON'S GERLACH NAMED RAWLINGS PITCHER OF THE WEEK



WALNUT CREEK, Calif. -- GRAND CANYON righthander **Brian Gerlach** has been named the Rawlings California Collegiate Athletic Association Baseball Pitcher of the Week for the week of March 27-April 2.

Gerlach, a 5-10 senior from Tempe, Ariz., was in command of a 7-0 series-opening shutout win over CCAA contender Cal State L.A. last week. In 9.0 innings pitched, Gerlach allowed six hits and one walk while striking out eight en route to the complete-game shutout. The Pitcher of the Week honor is the first of Gerlach's career.

Jason Vogel - 3B, SONOMA STATE: Hit .464 (13 for 28) with a double, triple and a home run in six games last week. **Vogel tied for second-most in NCAA D-II history for single-game assists with 12** in last week's 6-5, 12-inning win over UC Davis.

Ryan Vorell - 1B, CAL POLY POMONA: Was the driving force behind a four-game sweep of Cal State, San Bernardino last week, hitting .583 (7 of 12) with a double, 3 homers and 5 RBI. He had a 1.417 slugging percentage and did not strike out. Vorell ignited the Broncos offense in game one of the series with two round-trippers, going 4 for 5 with 4 runs and 3 RBI in the contest, a 20-8 Poly win.

Ryan Tash - 1B, CHICO STATE: Hit .600 in three games (all wins) for the Wildcats last week, going 6 for 10 with a double and 2 home runs. He scored 5 runs and drove in 6 and had a .692 on-base percentage. Tash belted a 3-run homer in a 17-7 win at Sacramento State. He then went 5 for 7 with a homer, 3 runs and 2 RBI in a doubleheader sweep of Hawaii Pacific.

Will Morris - P, CAL POLY POMONA: Picked up two saves in three appearances against CSUSB. He held the Coyotes scoreless in three innings of work, giving up one hit and striking out five. Recorded both of his saves in a doubleheader sweep, fanning three of four batters faced in the first game.

Chris Stretch - OF, UC DAVIS: Hit .429 (9 for 21) with 2 doubles, a triple, 2 homers and 9 RBI in a five-game series with Sonoma State. He went 7 for 9 with 8 RBI in a doubleheader split with the Cossacks.

Jjallil Sandoval - CAL STATE L.A.: Hit .533 (8 for 15) with 5 runs, 4 RBI and 4 stolen bases to lead the Golden Eagles to a four-game road split at then No. 5 Grand Canyon. He went 4 for 5 with a double, 3 runs, 4 RBI and 2 stolen bases in the Eagles' first win of the series.

WALNUT CREEK, Calif. -- CAL STATE STANISLAUS hurler **Jenny Brown** has been named the CCAA Softball Pitcher of the Week for the week of March 27-April 2.

Brown, a junior from Turlock, Calif., earned her third Pitcher of the Week honor of 2000 with a pair of dominating shutout wins at San Francisco State and Sonoma State last week. By throwing a two-hitter and a three-hitter last week, she has now allowed four or fewer hits in 13 of her last 17 starts and has thrown 28 and 2/3 consecutive scoreless innings dating back to March 22. WALNUT CREEK, Calif. -- CHICO STATE decathlete and pole vaulter **Trevor Papp** has been named the California Collegiate Athletic Association Men's Track & Field Athlete of the Week for the week of March 27-April 2.

Papp, a senior from Martinez, Calif., surpassed the NCAA Division II **automatic** qualifying standard in the decathlon and broke the school record in the process at the UC Multi-Events Meet in Sacramento last week.
