TOP TEAMS MEET ONE ANOTHER IN ALL SPORTS THIS WEEK

MARQUEE MATCHUPS ACROSS THE REGION . . . Some of the top teams in all the fall sports meet head on throughout California and Arizona this week. Perhaps the most anticipated matchup is a women's soccer contest featuring No. 12 Cal Poly Pomona at No. 3 Sonoma State on Sunday afternoon. On the men's side, Chico State meets No. 8 Grand Canyon down south in a rematch of last year's thrilling CCAA Tournament semifinal, in which Grand Canyon prevailed 3-2 in double overtime. Indoor war commences in the Inland Empire as CAL STATE L.A. and CAL STATE DOMINGUEZ HILLS take on CAL STATE, SAN BERNARDINO and UC RIVERSIDE in women's volleyball. More than half of the CCAA cross country squads will get a first-hand look at the 1999 CCAA Championship course as they take part in the UC Riverside Invitational on Saturday. Riverside will host the league championship meet four weeks from Saturday.

OTHER NEWS AND NOTES . . . The CCAA Executive Council voted to realign the soccer divisions for the 2000 season. Cal State Bakersfield moves to the North Division and UC San Diego enters the CCAA as a member of the South Division, giving each division six teams. The Council also approved UC San Diego and Grand Canyon to serve as travel partners and Cal Poly Pomona and Cal State, San Bernardino to do the same in all sports during the 1999-2000 academic year.

WALNUT CREEK, Calif. -- GRAND CANYON goalkeeper **Mark Wilson** has been named California Collegiate Athletic Association Men's Soccer Player of the Week for the week of September 13-19.

Wilson, a junior from Las Vegas, shut out Cal Poly Pomona and Cal State Bakersfield on the road last week as Canyon improved to 3-1 in CCAA play and 5-1 overall. In 180 minutes, Wilson faced 15 shots and six corner kicks and made six saves.

UC DAVIS' JILL MICONE NAMED CCAA PLAYER OF THE WEEK

WALNUT CREEK, Calif. -- UC DAVIS' **Jill Micone** has been named California Collegiate Athletic Association Women's Soccer Player of the Week for the week of September 13-19.

Micone, a senior midfielder from Elk Grove, Calif., led the Aggies to a pair of convincing triumphs last week with two fine offensive performances. She set a UCD single-game school record with four goals and added an assist for nine points in the Ags' 7-0 shutout of Cal State Stanislaus. Micone then tallied a goal and two assists in a 4-0 win over San Francisco State. She finished the week with five goals, three assists and 13 points.

VAN'T LAND SETS CCAA RECORD - Junior forward Ruth Van't Land of CAL POLY POMONA set the CCAA career records for goals (46) and points against Grand Canyon last week. Van't Land scored two goals and added an assist against GCU to become the first soccer player in CCAA history to eclipse two career marks in the same contest. She scored her record-breaking goal in the 17th minute and tallied her record-breaking 106th career point with an assist early in the second half of the Broncos' 4-2 win. With a goal and assist against Cal State, San Bernardino, Van't Land now has 47 career goals and 111 points.

WALNUT CREEK, Calif. -- CHICO STATE's **David Braund** has been named the California Collegiate Athletic Association Men's Cross Country Athlete of the Week for the week of September 13-19. Braund, a junior from Cottonwood, Calif., propelled the Wildcats to the team title at the Western Region Collegiate Open last week. He finished second in the 10K race with a time of 33:02 to lead No. 16 Chico State to victory over the likes of No. 4 UC Davis and No. 25 Cal Poly Pomona.

WALNUT CREEK, Calif. -- CAL STATE BAKERSFIELD middle blocker **Lisa Wilson** has been named the California Collegiate Athletic Association Women's Volleyball Player of the Week for the week of September 13-19.
