### MERCURY RISES IN THE DESERT THIS WEEK

SHOWDOWN IN THE VALLEY OF THE SUN. . . Plenty of great CCAA action this week is underscored by the showcase women's volleyball match in Phoenix on Friday night between the league's top two teams CAL STATE BAKERSFIELD and GRAND CANYON. Both enter the contest undefeated in league play (6-0) and both are looking to gain the inside track to the CCAA crown. The 'Runners, ranked 12th nationally (Sept. 21 ranking), are seeking to become the first school in CCAA history to win the league title an entire decade in one sport. The Antelopes (24th in the Sept. 21 poll), meanwhile, are hungry for their first CCAA women's volleyball title and understand they must beat Bakersfield if they are to taste overall victory at season's end. Canyon commences a busy week in CCAA athletics with an intersectional volleyball matchup against Montana State-Billings in Phoenix on Monday night. In women's soccer, archrivals SONOMA STATE and CAL STATE DOMINGUEZ HILLS collide in southern California in what could be another epic battle. The teams met twice in Rohnert Park a year ago, with the Cossacks winning in overtime during the regular season before the two teams tied 2-2 in the first round of the NCAA Championship (SSU advanced to the next round on a penalty kick tiebreaker). The Toros upended SSU in Carson in the first round of the 1997 NCAA Championship.

**OTHER CCAA NEWS AND NOTES** . . . The NCAA Division II Men's Basketball Championship Committee selected CAL STATE BAKERSFIELD as the host of the 2001 Elite Eight. The Roadrunners will host the four-day tournament March 21-24 at the Centennial Garden . . . UC RIVERSIDE named Rachel Miller-Reif as its head softball coach. Miller-Reif coached Bowling Green State for the previous five seasons . . . CAL STATE BAKERSFIELD named Jennifer (D'Amato) Watkins an assistant softball coach. Watkins was a three-time All-CCAA pitcher as a player for CSUB (1992-95) . . . Pacific Bell donated \$1.2 million in strength and conditioning equipment to UC RIVERSIDE last week, marking the largest donation ever received by the UCR Athletic Department . . . CAL STATE BAKERSFIELD assistant men's basketball coach **Eric Bridgeland** has accepted the head coaching position at UC Santa Cruz.

# GRAND CANYON'S NICOLE CYRUS NAMED CCAA PLAYER OF THE WEEK

WALNUT CREEK, Calif. -- GRAND CANYON middle blocker **Nicole Cyrus** has been named the California Collegiate Athletic Association Women's Volleyball Player of the Week for the week of September 20-26.

Cyrus, a 5-10 senior from Long Beach, Calif., kept the Antelopes tied for first place in the CCAA with strong performances in the San Francisco Bay Area last week. In a four-game victory over San Francisco State, Cyrus tallied a matchhigh 20 kills and added 16 digs, two block solos and five block assists. She then had 13 kills, two block solos, three block assists, all of which were match highs, and hit .478 in a three-game sweep of Sonoma State.

For the week, Cyrus averaged 4.71 kills, 2.71 digs, 1.71 blocks and hit .433.

#### UC DAVIS' BRIAN CANE NAMED CCAA PLAYER OF THE WEEK

WALNUT CREEK, Calif. -- UC DAVIS defender **Brian Cane** has been named California Collegiate Athletic Association Men's Soccer Player of the Week for the week of September 20-26.

Cane, a 5-10 junior from Escondido, anchored the Aggie defensive line that has shutout five straight opponents, a school record, including two straight on the road at Cal State L.A. and previous No. 8 Grand Canyon last week. Cane has been the mainstay of a defense that has allowed six goals in 10 matches this season, three of which came in the Ags' only loss thus far.

In a 1-0 win at GCU, Cane held the CCAA's leading scorer, Manoel Coehlo, in check. Coehlo had scored five goals in his previous two games.
