SOCCER SQUADS BATTLE IN NCAA CHAMPIONSHIP PLAY

ROUND FOUR IN WOMEN'S SOCCER, ROUND TWO ON THE MEN'S SIDE, ARMAGEDDON IN WOMEN'S VOLLEYBALL . . . Less than a week after CAL POLY POMONA wrested the CCAA Championship from CAL STATE DOMINGUEZ HILLS in women's soccer, the two squads meet again Saturday night in Pomona in the first round of the 1999 NCAA Championship. In addition to playing for the right to move on to the quarterfinals, also at stake is the Far West Region title. The CPP Broncos are currently ranked eighth nationally and CSUDH is No. 14. On the men's side, UC DAVIS takes on perennial powerhouse Seattle Pacific in the Emerald City in first round action of the NCAA Men's Soccer Championship. The 11th-ranked Aggies dropped a 3-0 decision at home to the No. 5 Falcons in September. Like the women's matchup, the winner of the UCD-SPU clash will be the Far West Region Champion. One week remains in the women's volleyball regular season, and CAL STATE BAKERSFIELD (18-2 in CCAA) holds a 1.5 game edge over both CAL STATE L.A. (16-3) and GRAND CANYON (16-3). CSUB has two league matches remaining, while the others in contention each have three contests left. Not to be forgotten is CAL STATE, SAN BERNARDINO (15-4), which hosts Bakersfield in the final match of the season on Saturday night. The Coyotes can still earn a share of the CCAA title if they a) win all three matches, b) CSLA and GCU lose one of their matches, and c) CSUB loses to UC RIVERSIDE before the Saturday night special.

CAL STATE, SAN BERNARDINO'S MARY THORNTON NAMED PLAYER OF THE WEEK

WALNUT CREEK, Calif. -- CAL STATE, SAN BERNARDINO outside hitter **Mary Thornton** has been named the California Collegiate Athletic Association Women's Volleyball Player of the Week for the week of November 1-7.

Thornton, a 5-10 senior from Hesperia, Calif., kept the Coyotes in the hunt for a postseason berth by powering CSUSB to victories over Chico State and UC Davis last week. She averaged 5.0 kills, 2.86 digs and 0.86 blocks per game, hit .417 (35-7-67) and added six blocks and four service aces in seven games.

Thornton opened the week with 18 kills, 10 digs and three blocks, and hit .471 (18-2-34) in a three-game sweep of Chico State. She then tallied 17 kills, 10 digs, three blocks and three service aces while hitting .364 (17-5-33) in a four-game triumph over UC Davis. The Player of the Week honor is the first of Thornton's career and the second for the Coyotes in 1999.
