## **CAL POLY POMONA COMPETES WITH WOMEN'S SOCCER'S ELITE TEAMS CCAA BASKETBALL LEAGUE RACES BEGINS THIS WEEK**

**WOMEN'S SOCCER CONCLUDES THIS WEEK; HOOPS KICKS INTO HIGH GEAR** . . . CAL POLY POMONA, the lone remaining CCAA fall sports team still playing, battles Barry in one of two NCAA Division II Women's Soccer Championship national semifinals this week. The game is scheduled for **Thursday, December 2 at 1:30 p.m. EASTERN** time on the campus of Barry University in Miami Shores, Fla. Should the Broncos prevail, Cal Poly Pomona would play the winner of the Franklin Pierce/Northern Kentucky semifinal on Saturday, December 4 at 1 p.m. Eastern time for the NCAA Division II National Championship. The Broncos have played four straight overtime contests and has played no fewer than two overtime periods in each of the last three games. In other action, the CCAA league schedule commences on Friday in both men's and women's basketball. Men's preseason coaches favorite CAL STATE BAKERSFIELD opens at UC RIVERSIDE, then meets 1999 postseason participant CAL STATE, SAN BERNARDINO on Saturday night. Women's basketball favorite UC DAVIS puts its two-game winning streak on the line against unbeaten SAN FRANCISCO STATE in the league opener for both squads. CHICO STATE, off to a 4-1 start this season, plays at SONOMA STATE, last year's CCAA runner-up, on Friday as well.

**CS, SAN BERNARDINO’S LONNIE TAPE’ NAMED RAWLINGS PLAYER OF THE WEEK**

WALNUT CREEK, Calif. -- CAL STATE, SAN BERNARDINO guard **Lonnie Tape’** has been named the Rawlings California Collegiate Athletic Association Men’s Basketball Player of the Week for the week of November 22-28.

Tape’, a 6-6 senior from Chicago, led the Coyotes to the championship of the Westmont College Tom Byron Classic last week. He was named the tournament’s most valuable player after averaging 16.5 points and 7.0 rebounds and shooting 67 percent from the floor (14-21) in the two contests.

Tape had 14 points, eight rebounds and two assists in a 69-56 win over Concordia, Neb. to open the tournament. He then led the way in the championship game with a team-high 19 points on 9 of 12 shooting, and six rebounds to defeat tournament host Westmont, 69-64. The wins improved CSUSB’s season record to 3-0.

The CCAA Player of the Week honors is the first of Tape’s career.

### ***LAST WEEK'S CCAA MEN'S BASKETBALL PRIMETIME PERFORMANCES***

Deon Robinson - CHICO STATE: Mac Martin Invitational Most Valuable Player after averaging 20.5 points, five rebounds, 3.5 assists and two steals in two games. Shot 45 percent from the floor (14-31) and 50 percent from beyond the three-point arch (8-16). Robinson hit two three-pointers in the final 34 seconds of regulation to send the game with Western State into overtime. Earlier in the week, Robinson tallied a team-high 11 points and eight rebounds in a loss at Oregon State. For the week, he averaged 17.3 points, 6.0 rebounds and 3.0 assists.

Pat Cleary - SONOMA STATE: Led the Cossacks to two victories at the Chico Mac Martin Invitational. He scored a team-high 17 points and added five assists, three rebounds and two assists in a win over Western State (11/26). He then had 11 points, four rebounds, two assists and a block in a win over Holy Names. Cleary shot a sizzling 73.3 percent from the floor (11-15) and 50 percent from three-point range. Averaged 14.0 points, 3.5 assists, 3.5 rebounds and 1.5 blocked shots per game last week.

Toure Knighton - GRAND CANYON: Averaged 18.0 points, 6.0 rebounds, 3.5 assists, 2.0 steals in two games last week during the 'Lopes Thanksgiving Classic. Shot 64.7 percent (11-17). Scored 26 points, including 14 free throws (in 19 attempts), and added six rebounds, four steals and three assists in a win over St. Martin's College.

**UC DAVIS' DES ABEYTA NAMED RAWLINGS PLAYER OF THE WEEK**

WALNUT CREEK, Calif. -- UC DAVIS post **Des Abeyta** has been named the Rawlings California Collegiate Athletic Association Women's Basketball Player of the Week for the week of November 22-28.

Abeyta, a 6-3 senior from Sacramento, was named the most valuable player of the Aggie Invitational after leading UC Davis to the tournament championship. In an 84-46 win over UC San Diego, Abeyta led the way with a game-high 24 points on 12 of 19 shooting, and added 10 rebounds and two steals. The following night, Abeyta tallied 19 points on eight of 11 shooting, and again pulled down 10 rebounds to go with two blocked shots and two steals.

For the week, Abeyta averaged 21.5 points, 10 rebounds, 2.0 steals and 1.5 blocks, and shot 67 percent (20 of 30). The CCAA Player of the Week honor is the second of Abeyta's career.

April Reed - SONOMA STATE: 20 points, 7-11 FG (63.4%), five reb, three ast at San Jose State (11/23); named to the Humboldt State All-Tournament Team after the following performances: 11 pts, six steals in versus Western Oregon (11/26); 18 pts, four reb, two ast, two stls in win over Humboldt State (11/27). Shot 48.4 percent from the floor (16 of 33), 61.5 percent from three-point land, and totaled 10 rebounds, seven assists and nine steals for the week.

Jessica Saltzman - CHICO STATE: Averaged 16.0 points, 10.5 reb and 1.5 blocks per game, and shot 61% from the floor (14-23) at the UC Davis Aggie Invitational last week. Was named to the all-tournament team. Had 18 pts, nine reb in win over Henderson State (11/26) and posted her first double-double of the year with 14 pts and 12 rebounds vs. UC San Diego (11/27).
