Most recent NCAA Championship experience: The Coyotes won the 1999 West Region Championship in Ellensburg, Wash. as a No. 5 seed with a 74-67 overtime win over No. 3 seed Seattle Pacific. CSUSB lost in the first round of the Elite Eight to Florida Southern, 84-69.

How CSUSB made the 2000 national tourney: Outlasted the rest of the CCAA members in the grueling 22-game league schedule, posting an 18-4 mark to win its first-ever CCAA Men's Basketball Championship.

Top players: All-CCAA, All-West Region senior guard Jimmy Alapag (5.48 apg, 1.52 3pt fgpg, 2.39 assist/turnover ratio); All-CCAA Second Team, All-West Second Team Lohnnie Tape' (13.1 ppg, 6.0 rpg, 0.78 bpg)

Most recent NCAA Championship experience: The Aggies, seeded second in the West Regional in 1999, relinquished a large lead and were upset by Seattle Pacific, 73-68, in the regional semifinal at Ellensburg a year ago.

How UCD made the 2000 national tourney: UC Davis won seven of its final 10 games down the stretch, most notably a 73-63 win at league champion Cal State, San Bernardino in the final weekend of the CCAA schedule.

Top players: All-CCAA forward Jason Cox (13.7 ppg, .804 FT Pct, 1.11 bpg); wing Scott Darmstadt (5.3 rpg); point guard Tyler Boyd (3.13 apg, 1.60 assist/turnover ratio)

CAL STATE L.A. GOLDEN EAGLES

1999-2000 W-L Record: 19-8 (16-6 CCAA, tied 2nd) **National Ranking:** Unranked

Coach: Dave Yanai - 68-41 (.624), four years

All-time NCAA Division II Championship appearances: 5 (1957-59-95-98-2000) All-time NCAA Division II Championship W-L Record: 9-6

Most recent NCAA Championship experience: Cal State L.A. battled eventual national champion UC Davis to the end on the Aggies' homecourt before falling, 53-51 in the regional semifinals in 1998. Cal State L.A. upended Grand Canyon, 58-53 in the opening round of the regional.

How CSLA made the 2000 national tourney: Cal State L.A. saved its finest moment for the very end of the regular season, beating rival Cal State Dominguez Hills, 54-53 on a stunning three-point buzzer-beater. Coach **Dave Yanai**, who had never beaten his previous team on a floor he knows all too well (Yanai coached CSUDH from 1977-96), orchestrated a final play during a timeout with eight seconds remaining after CSUDH had gone ahead, 53-51, on a basket by Earl Clark. All-CCAA guard **Quincy Stinson** took the inbound pass for CSLA, raced the length of the court, ascended for a jump shot, was contested and dished the ball to the left baseline where teammate **Ricky Smith** caught and launched the game-winning trey that traveled through the air as the horn sounded.

CAL STATE BAKERSFIELD'S RON SELLEAZE NAMED CALIFORNIA COLLEGIATE ATHLETIC ASSOCIATION MEN'S BASKETBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

BURBANK, Calif. -- CAL STATE BAKERSFIELD guard/forward **Ron Selleaze** has been selected the 1999-2000 California Collegiate Athletic Association Men's Basketball Player of the Year by the league coaches, who also named the All-CCAA First and Second Teams on Friday.

Selleaze, a 6-5 senior from Oakland, proved to be the dominating force in the CCAA, finishing the regular season atop the CCAA in both overall games (20.8 ppg) and conference games only (21.9 ppg) scoring averages. He additionally averaged 2.41 steals and 2.74 assists per game to rank third and ninth in the league, respectively. Selleaze earned three CCAA Player of the Week honors during the season and was recently named a consensus All-West Region selection. The Player of the Year honor marks the fourth time a CSUB player has received the award in the last five seasons (1996, 1997 Kebu Stewart; 1998 Marcus Moss).

CAL STATE, SAN BERNARDINO men's coach **Larry Reynolds** has been named the 1999-2000 California Collegiate Athletic Association Men's Basketball Coaches of the Year by the conference coaches.

Reynolds received his second league coach of the year award in as many seasons after guiding Cal State, San Bernardino to a 22-5 overall record, an 18-4 conference mark, and its first-ever CCAA Men's Basketball Championship. The Coyotes, the defending West Region Champions, are seeded third in the 2000 NCAA Division II Championship West Regional and will play conference rival Cal State L.A. in the opening round on Thursday in Seattle. Reynolds is 57-28 (.671) in three seasons at CSUSB
