CAL POLY POMONA'S LAURI McINTOSH NAMED CALIFORNIA COLLEGIATE ATHLETIC ASSOCIATION WOMEN'S BASKETBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

BURBANK, Calif. -- CAL POLY POMONA forward **Lauri McIntosh** has been named the 1999-2000 California Collegiate Athletic Association Women's Basketball Player of the Year in a vote of the league coaches. Also determined were the 1999-2000 All-CCAA First and Second Teams.

McIntosh, a 5-10 sophomore from Diamond Bar, Calif., powered the Broncos to their 16th CCAA title and an automatic berth in the 2000 NCAA Championship West Regional. With one game remaining in Pomona's regular season schedule, McIntosh is the CCAA's overall games scoring leader (20.0) and is tied for the conference games only scoring lead (20.1 ppg). She also ranks third overall in league field goal percentage (.526) and eighth in rebounding (7.0 ppg).

CAL POLY POMONA women's basketball coach **Paul Thomas** has been named the 1999-2000 California Collegiate Athletic Association Women's Basketball Coach of the Year by the conference coaches.

Thomas has led the Broncos to a 25-2 overall record and a 19-1 conference mark in guiding Pomona to its 16th CCAA women's basketball title overall and third in the last four years. Cal Poly Pomona received the top seed in the upcoming NCAA Division II Championship West Regional and will host the three-day event at Kellogg Gymnasium beginning Thursday, March 9. The Broncos are the lone CCAA member participating in the national championship tournament and will play the winner of the Seattle Pacific – Montana State-Billings matchup on Friday. Thomas has been named the CCAA Coach of the Year in three of the past four seasons.
