#### Mid-Con Tourney returns to Tulsa

The Mid-Continent Conference Championship will return to Tulsa and the John Q. Hammons Arena at the UMAC until 2007-08. The Tulsa Sports Commission was awarded the Championship bid at the Mid-Con Presidents Meeting in July.

#### Centenary has a new top Gentleman

**Rob Alaska** will roam the sidelines for Centenary this season, replacing **Kevin Johnson**. It is the first head coaching job for the former first assistant at the University of Arkansas. The Gents missed the 2004-05 Mid-Con Championship with a 3-24 overall record and a 1-15 mark in conference play.

#### Green looks to repeat as Player of the Year

Oral Roberts junior **Caleb Green** will look to become just the fourth player in conference history to win back-to-back Player of the Year awards. The forward finished the season in the Top 10 in the league in scoring (19.4), rebounding (9.3), field goal percentage (.552) and free throw percentage (.753). Green begins his junior season ranked 23rd on the Mid-Con's all-time rebounding list with 584 caroms in two seasons. Other first team all-stars returning for the 2005-06 campaign are ORU junior **Ken Tutt** and Valparaiso senior **Dan Oppland**.

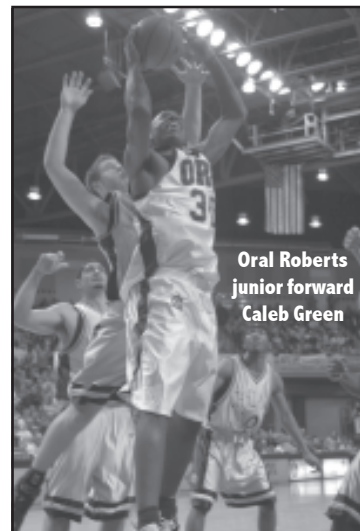
#### ORU on ESPN2 during Great Alaska Shootout

Oral Roberts earned a berth in the Great Alaska Shootout after a solid 2004-05 performance. The Golden Eagles will open the tourney against USC on ESPN2 at 10:30 p.m. CST. In addition to the Golden Eagles and Trojans, the Great Alaska Shootout field includes Eastern Washington, Marquette, South Carolina, Monmouth, Southern Illinois and Alaska Anchorage. ORU returns four starters, including Mid-Con Player of the Year **Caleb Green**, and its top reserve from last year's 25-8 squad.

#### Big name teams on Mid-Con schedules

Several nationally-ranked teams and perennial contenders will take on Mid-Con squads this season. Mid-Con teams are scheduled to face at least seven squads that finished 2004-05 with an RPI of 35 or better. The Mid-Con will also square-off against at least 31 teams that reached post-season play a year ago.

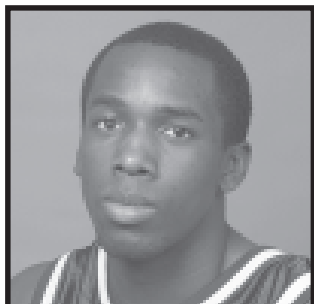

#### Valpo gets Berdiel back; loses Harris

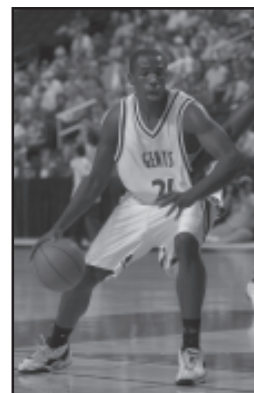

Berdiel is recovering from a leg injury that sidelined him for most of last season, while Harris is currently undergoing rehabilitation after collapsing during a supervised workout in April.

### IN MEMORIAM

On May 3, 2005, the Centenary College community suffered a tremendous loss when Chad MacLies was found dead in his Cline Hall dorm room. MacLies, a senior, was a leader for the Gents on the basketball court and was the epitome of the term student-athlete. Centenary President Kenneth Schwab called MacLies "a superb young man, a model student-athlete and an integral part of the Centenary family." He was scheduled to graduate in December 2005 and was a double major in math and physics with minor in computer science. MacLies, who was 22, was selected to the All Mid-Con second team after leading the Gents in scoring and rebounding.





## The Mid-Con's international flavor

There are 17 international players listed on the Mid-Con preseason rosters. Southern Utah and Valparaiso lay claim to the most foreign players on their rosters with four representatives apiece. UMKC and Western Illinois have three international student-athletes each, while Chicago State, IUPUI and Oakland all have one foreign player on their respective rosters.

## Akindele and Marshall head to the next level

Chicago State sophomore **Deji Akindele** will not be back in uniform for the Cougars as he forfeited his remaining eligibility after declaring for the NBA draft and signing with an agent. Akindele went undrafted despite impressive pre-Draft workouts. He also played with Dallas Mavericks squad in the Southern Cal Summer Professional League before signing a free agent contract with the Golden State Warriors this fall.

Former Oakland standout **Rawle Marshall** signed a free agent deal with the Dallas Mavericks during the summer after earning first team All-Conference honors a year ago.

Oakland head coach **Greg Kampe** is one win away from reaching the 350-victory mark for his career ... ORU's **Jonathan Bluiitt** will likely break into the Top 20 in conference history in assists. He enters the year with 385 helpers in three seasons ... CBS Sportsline Mid-Con Freshman of the Year **Tim Blackwell** of UMKC returns to the Kangaroos after averaging 10.1 points and 2.9 rebounds per game ... Valparaiso head coach **Homer Drew** ranks 15th in the NCAA among active coaches with 538 career wins ... UMKC's **Quinton Day** is the league's top returning steals threat. Last season, Day was second in the conference in thefts (2.03) ... Only three teams return their leading scorer from a year ago (**Brandon Cole**, IUPUI; **Caleb Green**, Oral Roberts; **Dan Oppland**, Valparaiso) ... ORU's **Caleb Green** is 12th on the Mid-Con's career field goal percentage chart with a .569 mark in two seasons ... Green is also 19th on the all-time free throws made list (339) and 20th in career free throws attempted (460) ... The Mid-Con Men's Basketball Championship game will appear on ESPN for the 12th consecutive year.

## Valpo and Oral Roberts selected to participate in the ESPN Bracket Buster Series again



The Oral Roberts and Valparaiso men's basketball teams have been selected to represent the Mid-Continent Conference in the 2006 ESPN Bracket Buster Saturday program. This is the second consecutive year that the Golden Eagles and the Crusaders will participate in the event, which is in its fourth season. Bracket Buster Saturday is scheduled for Saturday, February 18, 2006, with a total of 11 games (out of 50) being carried on either ESPN, ESPN2 or ESPNU.

The 2006 ESPN Bracket Buster includes a pool of 100 teams representing 18 conferences. The event has expanded each of the last three years, with 18 teams participating in 2003, 46 in 2004 and 64 in 2005. The selection of the 11 games that will be televised will be made by the staff of ESPN, in consultation with the commissioners of the participating conferences. Consideration will be given to avoiding match-ups between conference teams and between teams that previously met during the 2005-06 season. Pairings will be announced on January 29, 2006.
