goals to help forge a 2-2 tie. A similar situation played out in IUPUI's match against Western Illinois. After the Jaguars fell behind by a goal, Higginbotham again moved to the front, and this time scored the game-winning goal in overtime. The win over Western Illinois kept the Jaguars' Mid-Con Tournament hopes alive.

ALMOST TOO MANY SCENARIOS TO COUNT: Heading into the final week of conference play, all six Mid-Con teams have a shot at making next month's Mid-Con Tournament, and five of those teams could end up as the top seed and host the event. There are 27 different scenarios for seeding for the Mid-Con Tournament, far too many to count in a short space. IUPUI, UMKC, Oakland, Valparaiso and Western Illinois could all host the tournament, but all could miss the tourney as well.

PRETTY GOOD OFFENSE FROM A DEFENSIVE GUY: IUPUI's Ben Higginbotham became the first player this season to win both Mid-Con Offensive and Defensive Player of the Week honors. He emerged from the back to score a pair of goals against Butler, which erased a 2-0 deficit and led to a 2-2 tie with the Jaguars' region-ranked crosstown rival. He then netted the gamewinner in overtime against Western Illinois, giving the Jaguars a 2-1 victory that kept alive their Mid-Con Tournament chances. Higginbotham has nine goals this season, including a pair of game-winners.

RARITIES AMONG US: Valparaiso had played one scoreless tie in 19 seasons before this season, but the Crusaders have engaged in two such matches this season alone. After playing Evansville to a scoreless draw earlier in the season, Valpo managed a similar result against Oakland over the weekend, despite being outshot by a 28-9 margin. Mid-Con Defensive Player of the Week Jeff Oleck posted his fourth shutout of the season by making eight saves.

OTHER GOALIE NOTES: IUPUI's Jason Puskas made his first start since early in the season against Butler, and made eight saves in the 2-2 tie. UMKC's Beau Williams made five stops in a 3-0 win over Oral Roberts, the 13th shutout of his career, which moved him into seventh place on the Mid-Con's career list. Finally, Western Illinois' Chris Frenz made a Mid-Con season-best 13 saves in his team's 2-1 overtime loss to IUPUI.

MID-CON TEAM NOTES

IUPUI (3-12-2, 2-2 Mid-Con): IUPUI managed to forge a 2-2 tie with crosstown rival and regionally ranked Butler, and captured a 2-1 overtime win over Western Illinois in league play to keep its Mid-Con Tournament berth chances alive. Mid-Con Offensive Player of the Week Ben Higginbotham came up from the back to score a pair of second-half goals to tie Butler. Jason Puskas made eight saves to preserve the tie. Against Western Illinois, Jason Kunza netted his first goal of the season on a free kick in the 88th minute, and Higginbotham scored the game-winner in the 94th minute off a Kunza pass. The goal was the first of Kunza's goal and came on his Senior Night. Higginbotham is now tied for sixth in career goals at IUPUI (20), and also ranks sixth on its all-time points list (53). Each of IUPUI's last four matches have gone into overtime, and the Jaguars are 1-2-1 in those contests.

UMKC (5-8-1, 2-2 Mid-Con): UMKC dropped a 3-1 contest at Drury before keeping its Mid-Con Tournament hopes alive with a 3-0 win over Oral Roberts at home. Drew Perkins got the Kangaroos on the board at Drury, but the hosts scored three unanswered goals to close the game. UMKC was whistled for just three fouls in its match against Oral Roberts. Perkins netted the game-winner in the middle of the first half, while Mike Rosenthal and John Clark added insurance scores. Beau Williams made five saves to collect his second shutout of the season, which was also the 13th of his career. That moved him into seventh place on the Mid-Con's all-time shutouts list. Perkins' scores gave him 12 in his career, which ranks eighth on the school's career list. Dan Hilson picked up his sixth assist of the season on Clark's goal, tying him for the second-best total in school history. His 38 career points tie for fifth on the school's all-time chart.

Oakland (6-6-3, 2-1-1 Mid-Con): Oakland dropped a 3-0 decision at Cincinnati before settling for a 0-0 tie in league play against Valparaiso at home. The Golden Grizzlies allowed three first half goals at Cincinnati, and took just two shots in the entire match, both in the second half. Jeff Wiese made five saves in the shutout of Valparaiso, but his team couldn't find the back of the net despite outshooting the Crusaders by a 28-9 count.

Oral Roberts (7-8, 1-3 Mid-Con): Oral Roberts snapped a three-match losing streak with a 2-0 win over Northeastern State, but saw its Mid-Con Tournament berth hopes damaged with a 3-0 loss at UMKC. Stephen McCarthy and Trey Vaut netted first-half goals against Northeastern State, and Hector Zapata made four saves to post the shutout, his league-best fifth of the season. The Golden Eagles put five shots on goal at UMKC, but couldn't overcome a man-down difference for the final two-thirds of the game.

Valparaiso (5-8-2, 2-1-1 Mid-Con): Valparaiso played Oakland to a scoreless tie on the road in its only match last week. The Crusaders were outshot by a 28-9 margin in the game, but Mid-Con Defensive Player of the Week Jeff Oleck made eight stops to post the shutout. The whitewash was his fourth of the season, which ties for second on the school's season list. Valpo has played two scoreless ties this year after playing only one such match in its previous 19 seasons.

Western Illinois (7-9, 2-2 Mid-Con): Western Illinois fell short in a tough 2-1 overtime affair at IUPUI, and also dropped a 2-0 contest at region-ranked Ohio State. Jake Horn put the Leathernecks on the board early in the second half at IUPUI, but the host Jaguars scored late to tie the match and again early in overtime. Chris Frenz made a Mid-Con season-best 13 saves in the defeat. He made seven more stops at Ohio State, as Western Illinois was outshot by a 30-8 margin.

2002 Mid-Con Men's Soccer Tournament Nov. 15-17 • hosted by top seed

The 2002 Mid-Continent Conference Men's Soccer Tournament will be held on November 15 and 17, but the site of the tournament is still up for grabs. The team that earns the top seed for the single-elimination tourney will also serve as the host; the top four finishers in the league standings will qualify for the event, with the winner receiving the league's automatic berth to the NCAA Tournament.

Three teams have won their first Mid-Con Tournament crowns in the past three years - Oral Roberts (1999), IUPUI (2000), and UMKC (2001), while Valparaiso captured its only title in 1996. Former members Central Connecticut State (1994-95) and Howard (1997-98) are the only teams to post repeats.
