OAKLAND BREAKS HOME FIELD CURSE, WINS FIRST MID-CON TOURNEY TITLE: In eight previous Mid-Con Men's Soccer Tournaments, no team that had hosted the event had ever won it, including each of the last four (1998-2001) who served as the top seeds. However, Oakland snapped that streak in 2002, topping No. 4 UMKC (2-1) and No. 2 Western Illinois (3-0) to capture its first-ever Mid-Con Men's Soccer Tourney crown.

OAKLAND TO MAKE FIRST NCAA TOURNAMENT APPEARANCE: Though it could be considered the Mid-Con's most successful men's soccer program, Oakland will make its maiden voyage in the 2002 NCAA Division I Tournament. Long a power at the NCAA Division II level, the Golden Grizzlies made 14 trips to the NCAA Division II Tournament, and finished as the nation's runner-up three times. Head coach Gary Parsons' teams have won at least a share of the Mid-Con regular-season title each of the last three years, but Oakland won its first outright regular-season crown - as well as its first Mid-Con Tournament champion-ship - this season. Parsons' squads have posted a 299-93-42 (.737) record in his 22 years, and a win in the first round of the NCAA's would give him career win No. 300; he ranks in the top 20 among active NCAA Division I coaches in terms of both wins and winning percentage.

PANTHERS LOOK FAMILIAR: For the second straight season, the Mid-Con's representative in the NCAA Tournament will square off against UW-Milwaukee in the first round of the event. Last season, UMKC topped the Panthers, who were awarded an at-large bid to the tournament, by a 2-1 score in overtime, which was the Mid-Con's first-ever NCAA Men's Soccer Tournament win. This season could provide a more stern test for Oakland, as the Panthers enter the NCAA's ranked in the top ten in both the NSCAA (No. 8) and Soccer Times (No. 10) polls. UW-Milwaukee, sporting an 18-1-1 record, has won 18 consecutive matches, and won both the Horizon League regular-season and tournament crowns. The Panthers rank second in the country in scoring (3.40 goals per game), boast the nation's third-stingiest defense (0.54 goals per game against), and lead the nation in winning percentage (-925). UW-Milwaukee's Antou Jallow leads the nation in scoring with 2.83 points per game, having scored 23 goals this season. Goalie Chris Dadaian has allowed only five goals this season for a nation's best 0.34 goals against average.

NCAA TOURNEY TIDBITS: The Mid-Con holds a 1-5 record all-time in five NCAA appearances, with its only win coming by UMKC at the hands of UW-Milwaukee (2-1) in overtime last season...Oakland is the third Mid-Con men's soccer team to make its first NCAA Men's Soccer Tournament appearance in as many years...UW-Milwaukee played in the Mid-Con for one season before leaving for the Midwestern Collegiate Conference (now Horizon League). The Panthers went 14-4-2 in 1993, and boasted a perfect 8-0-0 record in league play. Mid-Con Player of the Year Tony Sanneh (star of the U.S. World Cup Team in 2002) led the league with 17 goals, 15 assists and 49 points...Oakland will be making its first NCAA Division I Tournament appearance in any men's team sport; the women have appeared in the NCAA soccer (2001, 02), basketball (2002) and softball (2002) tourneys.

MID-CON TEAM NOTES

IUPUI (3-14-2, 2-3 Mid-Con): IUPUI failed to make the Mid-Con Tournament field for the first time since the 1998 season. Ben Higginbotham repeated as a first-team all-conference honoree, but was the Jaguars' lone all-conference recipient.

UMKC (7-10-1, 2-3 Mid-Con): UMKC lost to eventual champion Oakland in the first round of the Mid-Con Tournament by a 2-1 score. The Kangaroos took a one-goal lead on Brian Wallace's score in the 54th minute, only to see the host Golden Grizzlies score twice in a three-minute span in the game's final ten minutes. Wallace and Jason Woods were named to the all-tournament team. Dan Hilson and Drew Perkins were each honored on the All Mid-Con first team, while Wallace, Woods and Eric Zobrist were second-teamers.

Oakland (10-7-3, 3-1-1 Mid-Con): Oakland became the first host school to win the Mid-Con Men's Soccer Tournament, prevailing over No. 4 seed UMKC (2-1) and No. 2 seed Western Illinois (3-0) in the semifinals and championship, respectively. Down by a goal heading into the last ten minutes of regulation against UMKC, the Golden Grizzlies rallied behind by scores by Shahar Ktovim and Bret McNabb in a span of 2:17. After a scoreless first half against Western Illinois in the championship, Oakland scored three second-half goals to take home the title. Ktovim, the Mid-Con Tournament MVP, got the team on the board in the 48th minute, and Philip Braathen and Mark Thomas added insurance scores in the final ten minutes. Ktovim was joined on the all-tourney team by Chris Edwards, Ryan Rzepka and Anders Vollen. Braathen was honored as the Mid-Con Player of the Year, and was a first-team all-league honoree along with Vollen, Jason Perry and Jeff Wiese, who also was honored as the Mid-Con Newcomer of the Year. Edwards and Rzepka were second-team honorees. Oakland will make its first-ever NCAA Division I Men's Soccer Tournament appearance this weekend at No. 8/10 (NSCAA/Soccer Times) UW-Milwaukee, which lost to UMKC by a 2-1 count in overtime in the first round of last season's NCAA Tournament.

Oral Roberts (9-8, 2-3 Mid-Con): Oral Roberts finished over .500 (9-8) for the second time since joining the Mid-Con in 1997, but failed to make the Mid-Con Tournament field for the second time in three years. Sun Potter and Trey Vaut were both named to the all-conference first team, while David Leung and Noah Braun were honored on the second team.

Valparaiso (5-10-2, 2-2-1 Mid-Con): Valparaiso yielded a Mid-Con Tourney match-record six goals in a 6-1 defeat at the hands of No. 2 Western Illinois in the Mid-Con Tournament semifinals. Ryan Wolin's score in the 81st minute averted the shutout for the Crusaders. Jon Flugstad and Ben Olson were named to the all-tournament team. Olson, Jeff Oleck and Billy Wanecke were all named to the all-conference second team, while Mis' Mrak was named the Mid-Con Coach of the Year for the third time in his career (he also won in 1997 and 1998).

Western Illinois (9-11-1, 3-2 Mid-Con): Western Illinois won its Mid-Con Tournament semifinal match handily, topping third-seeded Valparaiso by a 6-1 count, but lost in the title match to top seed and tourney host Oakland, 3-0. The Leathernecks exploded for a tourney match-record six goals against Valparaiso, and also set tourney records with five assists and 17 points. Justin Langan recorded his first hat trick of the season (his fourth multi-goal match of the year) in the match, tying a tourney record with the three scores. Jake Horn added a pair of tallies, while Bob Wallace put the finishing touches on with a score in the 89th minute. The Leathernecks were knotted with Oakland at the half, but allowed three second-half scores to finish as the Mid-Con Tourney runner-up, matching its best finish (1995) ever. Horn, Langan and Mike Smith were Western Illinois' all-tourney honorees. Langan was named to the all-conference first team for the third straight season, where he was joined by D.J. Harrington. Daniel Bustos and Lorenzo Zignago were cited on the second team.

2002 Mid-Con Men's Soccer Tournament Nov. 15-17 • hosted by Oakland

The 2002 Mid-Continent Conference Men's Soccer Tournament was held on November 15 and 17, with regular-season champion Oakland serving as the top seed and host. The Golden Grizzlies became the first Mid-Con Men's Soccer Tourney host to win the event, beating No. 4 UMKC (2-1) and No. 2 Western Illinois (3-0) on the way to their first-ever Mid-Con Tourney crown and an NCAA appearance.

Four teams have won their first Mid-Con Tournament crowns in the past four years - Oral Roberts (1999), IUPUI (2000), UMKC (2001) and Oakland (2002). Former members Central Connecticut State (1994-95) and Howard (1997-98) are the only teams to post repeats.
