OFFENSIVE Chris Edwards, Oakland Fr., F, Glasgow, Scotland

Oakland's Chris Edwards registered his third two-goal match of the season, which helped Oakland clinch the Mid-Con regular-season championship for the third straight season (its first outright league crown). Edwards got the Golden Grizzlies on the board in the 14th

minute with what turned out to be the game-winner, and added another goal for insurance late in the first half. Edwards' efforts led to Oakland serving as the top seed and host for the 2002 Mid-Con Men's Soccer Tournament; he is tied for first on his team with six goals.

A forward by trade (he's played 13 matches up front this season, including five as a starter), Western Illinois' Mike Smith made a position change that helped the Leathernecks lock up the No. 2 seed in the Mid-Con Tournament. Smith was moved to sweeper for the first

time this season, and helped keep Valparaiso's Ben Olson (tied for the league lead with nine goals) off the scoreboard until the 82nd minute in a 2-1 Western Illinois win. Smith helped to frustrate the Crusader offense with a variety of slide tackles and jump ball wins while committing only one foul in 90 minutes of work.

MID-CON TOURNAMENT FIELD SET; OAKLAND TO HOST TOURNAMENT: Heading into the last week of Mid-Con play, there were 27 different scenarios for seeding for the 2002 Mid-Con Tournament. Wins by Oakland, Oral Roberts and Western Illinois over the weekend cleared up the clouded picture, however, and solidified the tourney field. Oakland finished with a 3-1-1 record to earn the top seed and the right to host the tournament, which will be held on November 15 and 17. The Golden Grizzlies will host UMKC, which finished in a three-way tie for fourth place at 2-3 in the final league standings but won a tiebreaker over IUPUI and Oral Roberts. Western Illinois finished in sole possession of second place in the Mid-Con standings with a 3-2 record, and will face third-seed Valparaiso (2-2-1) in the other semifinal.

OLD FACES BACK AGAIN: Western Illinois has sponsored men's soccer within the Mid-Con since the first season in 1983, and Valparaiso joined in the mix in 1988. Neither of those two teams, who have the longest Mid-Con tenure in men's soccer, made the Mid-Con Tournament field last season (Valpo actually had not made it since a 1998 appearance), but the two will square off in the first semifinal of the Mid-Con Tournament at 11:30 a.m. on November 15. In the other semifinal, Oakland and UMKC will meet for the third straight season in the tourney's first round (Oakland prevailed, 4-3, in double overtime in 2000, while UMKC won a penalty kick shootout last year after a scoreless tie) at 2:30 p.m.

BIG EFFORTS HIGHLIGHT FINAL WEEK OF CONFERENCE PLAY: Each of the recipients of Mid-Con Player of the Week accolades had a big hand in helping their teams to seeds on the top half of the 2002 Mid-Con Tournament bracket. Oakland's Chris Edwards won offensive honors with his third two-goal game of the season in a 4-0 triumph over UMKC, which led to the Golden Grizzlies being the top seed and 2002 Mid-Con Tournament host. Western Illinois' Mike Smith moved to sweeper for the first time this season, and his efforts in keeping Valparaiso's top scorer Ben Olson in check led to his selection for the weekly defensive honor.

FUTURE MID-CON TEAM LEADS THE NATION IN SCORING: Centenary, which will join the Mid-Con next season, is posting a fine season in its last year as an independent. The Gents, who currently boast a 14-4 record, finish their season by hosting UMKC this week. Centenary's 17 goals against Wiley College are an NCAA Division I single-match high, and the Gents also led the nation in scoring (3.50 goals per game) according to the NCAA stats for the week of October 28.

MID-CON TEAM NOTES

IUPUI (3-14-2, 2-3 Mid-Con): IUPUI saw its Mid-Con Tournament hopes dashed with a 4-2 loss at Oral Roberts in the conference finale, then dropped a heartbreaking 2-1, double-overtime decision at No. 5/5 Indiana to close the season. IUPUI found itself down by a goal twice in the course of its game at Oral Roberts, but scores by Matt Hodges and Jason Kunza knotted the game each time. The Jaguars allowed two scores in the final six minutes of the match, however, preventing a berth to the Mid-Con Tournament for the first time in four seasons. IUPUI pushed state-rival Indiana to the brink, as Shane Bonin scored his first career goal early in the second half to tie the match. IUPUI hung with the Hoosiers the rest of regulation and through an overtime period before allowing the game-winner in the 103rd minute. Drew Deffner made a career-high 13 saves in the loss.

UMKC (6-9-1, 3-2 Mid-Con): UMKC dropped a 4-0 decision at Oakland in the final conference match of the year, but rebounded to snap an eight-match road losing streak with a 3-0 win at Western Michigan. Beau Williams made eight saves at Oakland, but allowed two scores in each half. UMKC, which finished in a three-way tie for fourth place in the league standings, made its way into the Mid-Con Tournament with IUPUI's 4-2 loss at Oral Roberts. The Kangaroos picked up the road win at Western Michigan behind scores by Drew Perkins, Dan Hilson and Tim Collico. Hilson, who assisted on the two goals he did not score, has established a school season record for assists (eight), and is tied for the team lead in goals scored with six. The school's career assists leader (20), Hilson has jumped into third place on the school's career points list (42). Williams, who made seven stops in the shutout win over Western Michigan, moved into fifth place on the Mid-Con's career list (15) in that category; the shutout was his third of the season.

Oakland (7-6-3, 3-1-1 Mid-Con): Oakland won its third consecutive Mid-Con regular-season crown (its first outright) with a 4-0 triumph over UMKC to close conference play. Mid-Con Offensive Player of the Week Chris Edwards posted his third two-goal game of the season, scoring twice in the first half. Philip Braathen and Shahar Ktovim added insurance in the second half, while Jeff Wiese made three saves for his fourth shutout of the season. Oakland will serve as the top seed and Mid-Con Tournament host for the first time since beginning league play in 1999.

Oral Roberts (8-8, 2-3 Mid-Con): Oral Roberts finished up its conference season with a 4-2 win over IUPUI. Thomas Jakobsen scored his first career goal on his "Senior Night," just 52 seconds into the match, and Jason Foster gave the Golden Eagles another lead in the first half. However, it was Alejandro Gaurdia's score in the 85th minute that proved to be the difference in the victory; Foster added insurance with his second goal of the contest with three seconds left in regulation. Hector Zapata faced 26 shots and made eight saves. The Golden Eagles finished in a three-way tie for fourth place in the Mid-Con standings, but missed out on a league tournament berth through a tiebreaker.

Valparaiso (5-9-2,2-2-1 Mid-Con): Valparaiso closed the regular season and conference slate with a 2-1 loss at Western Illinois. The Crusaders were kept off the board until Ben Olson's score in the 82nd minute. Mark Korba's point-blank shot in the 89th minute was stopped, preserving the victory for the hosts. Jeff Oleck made eight saves in the loss. Valparaiso still finished in third place, and will make its first Mid-Con Tournament appearance since 1998. Olson's nine goals tie for the league lead.

Western Illinois (8-9, 3-2 Mid-Con): Western Illinois finished strong in conference play, beating visiting Valparaiso by a 2-1 score to secure sole possession of second place in the Mid-Con standings. Daniel Bustos put the Leathernecks on the board late in the first half, and Cam Shepherd provided the eventual game-winner in the 72nd minute; P.J. Blackford assisted on both goals. Mid-Con Defensive Player of the Week Mike Smith moved to sweeper for the first time this season, and helped keep Valpo's top scorer (Ben Olson) off the board until the 82nd minute. Western Illinois closed its home schedule with four straight wins; it will return to the Mid-Con Tournament after missing the event last season.

2002 Mid-Con Men's Soccer Tournament Nov. 15-17 • hosted by top seed

The 2002 Mid-Continent Conference Men's Soccer Tournament will be held on November 15 and 17, but the site of the tournament is still up for grabs. The team that earns the top seed for the single-elimination tourney will also serve as the host; the top four finishers in the league standings will qualify for the event, with the winner receiving the league's automatic berth to the NCAA Tournament.

Three teams have won their first Mid-Con Tournament crowns in the past three years - Oral Roberts (1999), IUPUI (2000), and UMKC (2001), while Valparaiso captured its only title in 1996. Former members Central Connecticut State (1994-95) and Howard (1997-98) are the only teams to post repeats.
