Western Illinois' Lorenzo Zignago was a one-man wrecking crew in the Leathernecks' 3-0 win at Drury, their second win in three matches. Zignago assisted on Boris Bacsovics' game-winning goal in the 11th minute, then scored twice in less than three minutes late in

the match to put the contest away. Zignago had not previously scored a point in 2002, but is now tied for sixth in the league in scoring.

Oakland's Jeff Wiese became the second rookie netminder in as many weeks to win this award, after Valparaiso's Jeff Oleck did the trick last week. Wiese posted his first two career shutouts for the Golden Grizzlies, helping them even their record at 2-2-1 on the season.

Wiese stopped six shots, including one from point-blank range in the second half, in Oakland's 1-0 upset win at Marquette. Wiese backed that up by making five saves in a 3-0 shutout of Bowling Green. His efforts lowered his goals against average to 1.12.

#### Mid-Con Men's Soccer News and Notes



THREE MID-CON TEAMS EARN REGIONAL RANKINGS FROM NSCAA: The bad news last week was that the Mid-Con went 0-3 as a league on Sunday. The great news is that prior to that, the six Mid-Con programs went 7-1-1 last week, which helped vault two more teams into the NSCAA's regional rankings. Oral Roberts, which beat TCU and Drake and dropped its first match of the season to No. 17 (Soccer Times), has used its 5-1 start to achieve a No. 7 rank in the NSCAA's Midwest Region, one spot ahead of UMKC, which sits at No. 8 with its 2-2-1 record. Oakland, which beat Marquette and Bowling Green last week, reached the Great Lakes Region rankings, where it sits in tenth.

LOTS OF MID-CON SOCCER SUCCESS: The Mid-Con went 7-4-1 as a league last week, including a 7-1-1 start. Included among those wins were some victories over traditionally strong programs. Oakland topped Marquette on the road by a 1-0 score, just days after the Golden Eagles had beaten nationally ranked Saint Louis. Valparaiso upset No. 22 (NSCAA) Wisconsin, 2-1, handing the Badgers their first loss of the season. Oral Roberts posted a 1-0 win over Drake, and both Oral Roberts and UMKC managed wins over TCU. Two of the Mid-Con's four losses last week were to nationally ranked teams - UMKC fell to No. 17/12 (NSCAA/Soccer Times) SMU by a 1-0 count, and Oral Roberts lost to No. 17 (Soccer Times) Creighton, 2-0.

ZIGNAGO, WIESE USE PAIRS TO RECORD MID-CON ACCOLADES: Western Illinois' Lorenzo Zignago scored a pair of goals and assisted on the game-winning goal in the Leathernecks' 3-0 win at Drury, which secured him Mid-Con Offensive Player of the Week honors. Oakland's Jeff Wiese used a pair of shutouts to win Mid-Con Defensive Player of the Week accolades, as he blanked Marquette (1-0) and Bowling Green (3-0), making 11 saves in the two matches.

#### MID-CON TEAM NOTES

IUPUI (0-5-1, 0-0 Mid-Con): IUPUI snapped a season-opening four-match losing streak with a 2-2 tie at Akron, but then dropped a home decision to Wright State, 3-2. Ben Higginbotham scored on a penalty kick and assisted on Andy Wolf's first career goal against Akron, but a nullified goal turned out to be the difference in the 2-2 tie. Drew Deffner made nine saves for the Jaguars, who were outshot by a 20-5 margin. Higginbotham scored on another penalty kick against Wright State, and Shane McIntyre scored his first IUPUI goal, but the Jaguars couldn't overcome a two-goal deficit while playing a man down after Colby Kraft received his second yellow card in five minutes right before the half. Higginbotham has four goals in 2002, three of which have come on penalty kicks.

UMKC (2-2-1, 0-0 Mid-Con): UMKC lost by a 1-0 score at No. 17/12 (NSCAA/Soccer Times) SMU, but rebounded to snap a two-match skid by beating TCU, 3-2. The Kangaroos were outshot by an 18-3 margin against SMU, but Beau Williams made six saves to keep his team in the match, allowing only a goal in the 37th minute. Ryan Barber scored in the second minute against TCU, which snapped a UMKC scoreless streak of 144:20, dating to the team's match against Tulsa. John Clark scored a few minutes later, and Dan Hilson scored the game-winner on a penalty kick in the 74th minute. Williams, Barber and Eric Zobrist were all named to the SMU Nike Classic all-tournament team. Williams, who moved into sixth place on the Mid-Con's career minutes played chart (4,610), has allowed six goals in five matches this season. UMKC is ranked eighth in the NSCAA Midwest Region this week.

Oakland (2-2-1, 0-0 Mid-Con): Oakland evened its record at 2-2-1 with a 1-0 win at Marquette and a 3-0 defeat of Bowling Green at home. The Golden Grizzlies were outshot by a 15-3 margin at Marquette, but Mid-Con Defensive Player of the Week Jeff Wiese was up to the challenge, making six stops while not allowing a score for his first career shutout. Philip Braathen's rebound score in the 22nd minute was the difference. Matt Connor scored a pair of second-half goals for Oakland in the win over Bowling Green, while Bret McNabb also tallied a score. Wiese made five more saves for his second straight shutout. He has not allowed a goal in 202:23, lowering his goals against average to 1.12. The Golden Grizzlies' three-match unbeaten streak has lifted them to a tenth-place ranking in the NSCAA Great Lakes Region.

Oral Roberts (5-1, 0-0 Mid-Con): Oral Roberts extended its best start ever, beating TCU (2-0) on the road and edging Drake (1-0) at the Ameritas Classic, before falling to No. 17 (Soccer Times) Creighton (2-0) for its first loss of the season. Trey Vaut netted the game-winning goals against both TCU and Drake, while Sun Potter his league-best seventh goal of the year against the Horned Frogs. Hector Zapata made seven saves against TCU for the shutout, and posted his fourth consecutive whitewash by making eight stops against Drake. Potter, who tied for the nation's lead in scoring last week, left the Drake match with a separated shoulder and did not play against Creighton. The Golden Eagles stayed close with the nationally ranked Bluejays, but surrendered a pair of goals to preseason All-American Mike Tranchilla - one off of a defender deflection and another with 11 seconds left in the match. Zapata has allowed only three scores this season and has posted a goals against average of 0.50. Oral Roberts finished second in the Ameritas Classic, and Vaut and Zapata were named to the all-tournament team. Oral Roberts' 5-1 start has lifted the Golden Eagles to seventh in the NSCAA Midwest Region rankings.

Valparaiso (2-3-1, 0-0 Mid-Con): Valparaiso knocked off No. 22 (NSCAA) Wisconsin (2-1) at home before falling to visiting Xavier (2-0). The Crusaders earned the Mid-Con's first win over a nationally ranked opponent when it triumphed over previously unblemished Wisconsin. Valpo held a 1-0 lead on Mark Korba's goal in the 50th minute, but the Badgers tied the game with ten minutes left. Valparaiso answered quickly on Ben Olson's header off of a Jon Flugstad restart, and held on for the win. Valpo limited Wisconsin to just eight shots, and Jeff Oleck made three saves in the win. Valpo and Xavier battled in a scoreless match until the 74th minute, but the Musketeers scored twice in 15 minutes for the win. Valparaiso is 1-0-1 against region-ranked teams this season, and takes on two more this weekend in Michigan State and Detroit.

Western Illinois (2-3, 0-0 Mid-Con): In its only match of the week, Western Illinois topped Drury on the road (3-0). Mid-Con Offensive Player of the Week Lorenzo Zignago was the catalyst for the Leathernecks, scoring a pair of second-half goals and assisting on Boris Bacsovics' game-winner in the 11th minute. Chris Frenz made three saves for the shutout win. Western Illinois played without first-team all-conference performer Justin Langan, who booted two extra points in the Leatherneck football team's 14-0 upset of No. 21 (NCAA I-AA) Western Kentucky on the road.

#### 2002 Mid-Con Men's Soccer Tournament Nov. 15-17 • hosted by top seed

The 2002 Mid-Continent Conference Men's Soccer Tournament will be held on November 15 and 17, but the site of the tournament is still up for grabs. The team that earns the top seed for the single-elimination tourney will also serve as the host; the top four finishers in the league standings will qualify for the event, with the winner receiving the league's automatic berth to the NCAA Tournament.

Three teams have won their first Mid-Con Tournament crowns in the past three years - Oral Roberts (1999), IUPUI (2000), and UMKC (2001), while Valparaiso captured its only title in 1996. Former members Central Connecticut State (1994-95) and Howard (1997-98) are the only teams to post repeats.
