Mid-Con Men's Soccer News and Notes

OAKLAND BREAKS HOME FIELD CURSE, WINS FIRST MID-CON TOURNEY TITLE: In eight previous Mid-Con Men's Soccer Tournaments, no team that had hosted the event had ever won it, including each of the last four (1998-2001) who served as the top seeds. However, Oakland snapped that streak in 2002, topping No. 4 UMKC (2-1) and No. 2 Western Illinois (3-0) to capture its first-ever Mid-Con Men's Soccer Tourney crown. Oakland became the fourth team in as many seasons to win its first-ever Mid-Con Tournament title, joining Oral Roberts (1999), IUPUI (2000) and UMKC (2001).

OAKLAND MAKES FIRST NCAA TOURNAMENT APPEARANCE: Though it could be considered the Mid-Con's most successful men's soccer program, Oakland made its maiden voyage in the 2002 NCAA Division I Tournament. Long a power at the NCAA Division II level, the Golden Grizzlies made 14 trips to the NCAA Division II Tournament, and finished as the nation's runner-up three times. Head coach Gary Parsons' teams have won at least a share of the Mid-Con regular-season title each of the last three years, but Oakland won its first outright regular-season crown - as well as its first Mid-Con Tournament championship - this season. Parsons' squads have posted a 299-94-42 (.736) record in his 22 years. In their first appearance in the NCAA Division I Tournament, the Golden Grizzlies put up a good fight at No. 8/10 UW-Milwaukee before falling by a 2-1 score.

NCAA TOURNEY TIDBITS: The Mid-Con now holds a 1-6 record all-time in six NCAA appearances, with its only win coming by UMKC at the hands of UW-Milwaukee (2-1) in overtime in 2001... Oakland was the third Mid-Con men's soccer team to make its first NCAA Men's Soccer Tournament appearance in as many years... Oakland made its first NCAA Division I Tournament appearance in any men's team sport; the women have appeared in the NCAA soccer (2001, 02), basketball (2002) and softball (2002) tourneys.

LANGAN CONTINUES AS TWO-WAY TALENT: Western Illinois' Justin Langan continued his solid soccer career in 2002, and also continued to make a name for himself on the football field. Langan tied for the league lead with ten goals in 2002, and was honored as a first-team All Mid-Con honoree for the third straight season after leading his team with 21 points. When he wasn't helping the Leathernecks on the soccer field, he was busy racking up points for Western Illinois' highly successful football team, which ranked as high as No. 2 in NCAA Division I-AA and finished with an 11-2 record. Langan was the highest scoring place kicker in the nation, converting 20-of-27 field goals and 56-of-58 extra points for a school-record (for a kicker) 116 points. He was a third-team Associated Press All-American.

MID-CON TEAM NOTES

IUPUI (3-14-2, 2-3 Mid-Con): IUPUI failed to make the Mid-Con Tournament field for the first time since the 1998 season. Ben Higginbotham repeated as a first-team all-conference honoree, but was the Jaguars' lone all-conference recipient. He scored a career-high nine goals in 2002, and was selected by the A-League's Indiana Blast as a territorial pick.

UMKC (7-10-1, 2-3 Mid-Con): UMKC lost to eventual champion Oakland in the first round of the Mid-Con Tournament by a 2-1 score. Dan Hilson and Drew Perkins were each honored on the All Mid-Con first team, while Brian Wallace, Jason Woods and Eric Zobrist were second-teamers. Hilson tallied a school-record eight assists in 2002, and finished his third season at UMKC as the school's career leader in assists (20), a total which also ties for sixth on the Mid-Con's career list. His 42 career points rank third all-time at UMKC, while Perkins' 39 points rank sixth. Beau Williams finished his career ranked among the league's all-time leaders in minutes played (5th; 5661:03), goals against team (11th; 1.49), saves (4th; 289) and shutouts (6th; 14). Hilson and Perkins were both honored on the NSCAA All-Midwest Region third team. M.J. Serota was named to the Verizon Academic All-District VII team.

Oakland (10-8-3, 3-1-1 Mid-Con): Oakland, which earned its first-ever outright league regular-season crown, became the first host school to win the Mid-Con Men's Soccer Tournament, prevailing over No. 4 seed UMKC (2-1) and No. 2 seed Western Illinois (3-0) in the semifinals and championship, respectively. Shahar Ktovim was named the Mid-Con Tournament MVP after scoring the game-tying goal in the semifinals and the game-winner in the championship. Philip Braathen was honored as the Mid-Con Player of the Year, and was joined on the first team by Jason Perry, Anders Vollen and Mid-Con Newcomer of the Year Jeff Wiese. Chris Edwards and Ryan Rzepka were named to the second team. Oakland made its first NCAA Tournament appearance since moving to the NCAA Division I level, losing to UW-Milwaukee in the first round, 2-1. Perry was honored on the NSCAA All-Great Lakes Region third team.

Oral Roberts (9-8, 2-3 Mid-Con): Oral Roberts finished over .500 (9-8) for the second time since joining the Mid-Con in 1997, but failed to make the Mid-Con Tournament field for the second time in three years. Sun Potter and Trey Vaut were both named to the all-conference first team, while David Leung and Noah Braun were honored on the second team, Potter's 1.77 points per game in 2002 ranks 16th on the Mid-Con's single-season list, while his career average of 1.48 points per game ranks sixth on the league's charts. In addition, Potter ranks highly on the Mid-Con's single-season (12th; 0.77) and career (6th; 0.62) goals per game lists. Goalie Hector Zapata moved into the Mid-Con's career leaders in a variety of categories as well - minutes played (15th; 3549:39), goals against average (1-16th; 1.78), saves (18th; 213), saves per game (14th; 5.33) and shutouts (19th; 8).

Valparaiso (5-10-2, 2-2-1 Mid-Con): Valparaiso yielded a Mid-Con Tourney match-record six goals in a 6-1 defeat at the hands of No. 2 Western Illinois in the Mid-Con Tournament semifinals. Ben Olson, Jeff Oleck and Billy Wanecke were all named to the all-conference second team, while Mis' Mrak was named the Mid-Con Coach of the Year for the third time in his career (he also won in 1997 and 1998). Oleck's four shutouts rank second on the school's single-season list.

Western Illinois (9-11-1, 3-2 Mid-Con): Western Illinois won its Mid-Con Tournament semifinal match handily, topping third-seeded Valparaiso by a 6-1 count, but lost in the title match to top seed and tourney host Oakland, 3-0. The Leathernecks exploded for a tourney match-record six goals against Valparaiso, and also set tourney records with five assists and 17 points. Justin Langan tied a tourney record with three scores in the win. Langan was named to the all-conference first team for the third straight season, where he was joined by D.J. Harrington. Daniel Bustos and Lorenzo Zignago were cited on the second team. Langan finished the season ranked on the Mid-Con's career shots (119; 15th), goals per game (1-13th; 0.47) and points per game (1-14th; 1.16) lists, while Boris Bacsovcics ranks on the league's career assists per game chart (1-13th; 0.30). Langan, Bacsovcics and Ty Beckmann were all named to the Verizon Academic All-District V team; Langan was also cited as a second-team Academic All-American, while Beckmann was honored on the third team. Langan was also tabbed to the NSCAA All-Midwest Region second team.

2002 Mid-Con Men's Soccer Tournament Nov. 15-17 • hosted by Oakland

The 2002 Mid-Continent Conference Men's Soccer Tournament was held on November 15 and 17, with regular-season champion Oakland serving as the top seed and host. The Golden Grizzlies became the first Mid-Con Men's Soccer Tourney host to win the event, beating No. 4 UMKC (2-1) and No. 2 Western Illinois (3-0) on the way to their first-ever Mid-Con Tourney crown and an NCAA appearance.

Four teams have won their first Mid-Con Tournament crowns in the past four years - Oral Roberts (1999), IUPUI (2000), UMKC (2001) and Oakland (2002). Former members Central Connecticut State (1994-95) and Howard (1997-98) are the only teams to post repeats.
