AROUND THE MID-CON...

MID-CON SENDS TWO SQUADS TO COLLEGE CUP: For just the second time in league history - and for the first time in 20 years - the Mid-Continent Conference will send two teams to the NCAA Men's Soccer College Cup. UMKC earned its way into the postseason by upending top seed Oakland in the Mid-Con Men's Soccer Tournament title match. However, the Golden Grizzlies' season did not end with that setback, as they received an at-large berth to the NCAA's. UMKC will play its opening round match at Creighton on Friday, November 21st, while Oakland heads west to play at Tulsa on November 22nd.

UMKC: UMKC (10-6-3) heads into the tournament as one of the nation's hottest teams, having gone 9-1-2 in its last 12 matches. The Kangaroos started that hot streak with a 2-1 win over then-No. 5 Santa Clara, then reeled off wins in five of six conference matches before avenging that one league loss in the Mid-Con Tourney title match. UMKC will be making its second NCAA Tournament appearance, and hopes for a performance similar to the one it made in 2001; the Kangaroos knocked off UW-Milwaukee by a 2-1 count in overtime.

OAKLAND: Oakland (12-4-5) will make its second NCAA College cup appearance in as many seasons, but after earning the league's automatic berth last year, the Golden Grizzlies will be making this trip as an at-large selection. Oakland enters the NCAA's on a hot streak; it had gone nine straight matches without a defeat before falling to UMKC in the Mid-Con title match. The Golden Grizzlies played on the of the most difficult slates in the league in 2003, with eight matches against 2003 NCAA Tourney squads. Their first NCAA Division I appearance was a 2-1 loss at UW-Milwaukee in 2002.

MID-CON VS. MISSOURI VALLEY & THE NCAA: Both Mid-Con NCAA representatives will square off against Missouri Valley Conference foes in the first round; the league went 2-13-1 against the MVC in 2003. As a whole, the Mid-Con went 4-15-3 (.250) against non-league foes that made the NCAA College Cup Field. UMKC (4-0) and Oral Roberts (2-1, 2ot) both lost to Tulsa in the regular season, but no Mid-Con squad played Creighton.

MID-CON MEASURES UP: The Mid-Con received as many berths as traditional soccer power conferences such as the Big Ten (2), Big West (2), Conference USA (2), Colonial Athletic (2) and the Metro Atlantic (2). The Atlantic Coast and Big East led all leagues with six NCAA teams each. The Mid-Con is one of 12 conferences to send multiple teams to the 2003 College Cup.
