### AROUND THE MID-CON...

OAKLAND RANKED NO. 20 IN LATEST NSCAA POLL: Oakland has started the season in impressive fashion, earning a No. 20 ranking from the National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA) in just the second week of play. The Golden Grizzlies, ranked second in the Great Lakes Region, defeated No. 22 Portland (2-1) and tied Washington (1-1) in week one of action, while besting Marquette last week by a score of 4-1. Philip Braathen is currently leading the charge, as the junior tops Oakland in goals (3) and points (7). He also leads the Mid-Con in goals, points, points per game (2.33), and goals per game (1.00). The Golden Grizzlies, who currently lead the Mid-Con in goals per game (2.33) and goals against average (0.90), will play five of their next six games at home, including a Mid-Con match-up with IUPUI.

WESTERN ILLINOIS EARNS REGION RANKINGS FROM NSCAA: Western Illinois is off to its best start in eight years and has earned Midwest Region Rankings from the NSCAA for its efforts. The Leathernecks are ranked 10th in the current poll after ending the week with a 2-0 record, defeating Eastern Illinois (2-1) and Quincy (1-0). Lorenzo Zignago, Daniel Bustos and PJ. Blackford accounted for the three goals, while Justin Langan assisted on both game-winners. Western's 3-1 start is its best since the 1995 team started 2-1-1; it finished 15-4-1.

LANGAN ASSISTING LEATHERNECKS TO VICTORY: Western Illinois' Justin Langan helped the Leathernecks to a 2-0 record last week, and its best start in eight years, assisting on both game-winning goals against Eastern Illinois (2-1) and Quincy (1-0). With those assists Langan, a three-time all-conference first team selection, moved into seventh place on Western's alltime scoring list with 64 points. He currently leads the Mid-Con with five assists.

GARCIA PROVIDES SCORING PUNCH, ZAPATA THROWS UP ZEROES: In just his second game at UMKC, transfer Michael Garcia had a big impact on the offensive end of the field in a 3-3 tie at Loyola. Garcia, the Mid-Con Offensive Player of the Week, scored two goals and assisted on the third in the tie. Oral Roberts' Hector Zapata was named the Defensive Player of the Week after posting his second straight shutout, making seven saves in a 0-0 tie against Drake.

ROUGH ROAD AHEAD: While Oakland has achieved a national ranking, Oral Roberts will have its own close encounter with nationally ranked teams. The Golden Eagles play No. 9/6 SMU and No. 21/NR Tulsa on back-to-back days this weekend.

### 2003 MID-CON TOURNEY RETURNS TO OAKLAND

By virtue of winning the 2002 Mid-Con regular-season title, Oakland will again serve as the host for the 2003 Mid-Con Men's Soccer Tournament, which will be held on Nov. 14 and 16, at the OU Soccer Field in Rochester, Mich. The top four finishers in the Mid-Con regular-season standings will advance to the event, with the winner receiving the league's automatic berth to the NCAA Men's College Cup. Oakland became the first-ever tourney host to win the event last season. The Mid-Con has had four first-time champions in the last four years (Oral Roberts - 1999; IUPUI - 2000; UMKC - 2001; Oakland - 2002).
