Rapp scored three times, including a pair of game-winners, to help top-seeded Oakland to its second straight Mid-Con Tournament title and its first-ever NCAA Tournament appearance. Against No. 4 seed IUPUI in the Mid-Con Tourney semifinal. Rapp scored once in each half and assisted on a third score in the Golden Grizzlies' 4-0 win. She then scored the game-winning tally in a 3-0 win over No. 3 seed Oral Roberts. Rapp was also named the Mid-Con Co-Player of the Year after helping the Golden Grizzlies to their third straight regular-season crown.

2001 Mid-Con Women's Soccer Notebook

AROUND THE MID-CON...

IUPUI (3-14, 2-3 Mid-Con): IUPUI lost to Oakland (4-0) in the Mid-Con Tournament semifinal... Niki Hornyak and Karrie Reising were named to the all-tournament Team... Reising and Tara Latella were both honored on the all-conference second team.

Oakland (16-4-1, 5-0 Mid-Con): The Golden Grizzlies won their second-straight Mid-Con Tournament title after beating IUPUI (4-0) and Oral Roberts (3-0)... Mid-Con Tournament MVP Anita Rapp was joined on the all-tournament team by Ashley McGhee, Gail Wilson and Sarah Buckland... Rapp was honored as the league's Co-Player of the Year, and was one of six Oakland first-team all-conference honorees... McGhee. Wilson, Kim Moore, Shelly Piccirillo and Christine Selesky joined Rapp on the first team, while Buckland and Debbie Cartmel were second-team honorees... Katie Arnott was named the Mid-Con Newcomer of the Year... Oakland was consistently ranked in the Great Lakes Region by both the NSCAA and Soccer Buzz during the season... the Golden Grizzlies made their first-ever NCAA Tournament appearance, losing to Cincinnati in the first round... Oakland took a quick twogoal lead on scores by Rapp and Demers, but Cincinnati scored late in the first half, early in the second half, and tallied the game-winner in the waning moments... Oakland's 16 wins this season tied a school record.

Oral Roberts (11-8-1, 3-2 Mid-Con): The Golden Eagles beat Valparaiso (4-0) in the Mid-Con Tournament semifinal, but lost to Oakland (3-0) in the championship match... Tessa Long netted the second hat trick in the league tourney history in the win over Valparaiso... Long, Jodi Kirkhuff and Meghan Mitchell were all-tournament honorees... Kirkhuff was honored as the league's Co-Player of the Year, and was joined on the all-conference first team by Erin Hartog and Martha Owens... second-team selections included Kristi Bratkovich and Megan Utz.

Southern Utah (2-14, 1-4 Mid-Con): Southern Utah closed its initial season with a record of 2-14, and failed to qualify for the league tourney... llene Dixon was named second-team all-conference.

Valparaiso (10-9, 4-1 Mid-Con): Valparaiso lost to Oral Roberts (4-0) in the Mid-Con Tournament semifinal... Courtney Budd and Lori Moore were both named to the all-tournament Team... Holtkamp was the team's only first-team all-conference pick, while Budd, Moore, Jennifer Grupe and Lisa Springs were named to the second team... Valparaiso finished above .500 for the first time in school history, and its 10 wins established a new school season record.

Western Illinois (5-11, 0-5 Mid-Con): The Westerwinds completed their season at 5-11, and failed to make the Mid-Con Tournament... Amanda Wandtke was a first-team all-conference honoree.

GOLDEN GRIZZLIES WRITE NEW CHAPTER FOR MID-CON

Oakland became the first Mid-Continent Conference women's soccer team to appear in the NCAA Tournament, and the Golden Grizzlies almost posted a win in their first crack at the NCAA's. Anita Rapp and Erica Demers scored early to give Oakland a 2-0 lead, but the Golden Grizzlies could not hang on. Oakland still finished with 16 wins, which ties the school record set by the 1996 squad. Oakland earned the Mid-Con's first-ever automatic bid to the NCAA's.

OAKLAND WINS SECOND STRAIGHT MID-CON TITLE

The Oakland women's soccer team won its third straight Mid-Continent Conference regular-season title this season, and the Golden Grizzlies didn't stop their stranglehold of the league in the Mid-Con Tournament. Oakland beat IUPUI (4-0) and Oral Roberts (3-0) to win its second straight tournament title, as well as its first-ever berth to the NCAA Women's Soccer Tournament. Tournament MVP Anita Rapp scored three goals in the two wins, including gamewinners in both contests.

MID-CON BOASTS OLYMPIC GOLD MEDALIST

Oakland shared the Mid-Con regular-season crown last season, and also captured its first-ever Mid-Con Tournament title, beating Oral Roberts, 2-1, in overtime. This season, the Golden Grizzlies welcomed the return of a player that missed that championship season. Senior midfielder Anita Rapp, who earned Mid-Con Co-Player of the Year honors as a junior in 1999, returned to the Oakland squad this season after taking a redshirt season last year. Rapp had good reason to miss the 2000 campaign, as she was busy winning an Olympic Gold Medal as part of the Norwegian Women's Soccer Team. Rapp was named the Mid-Con Co-Player of the Year again this season, and was also honored as the Mid-Con Tournament MVP.

EIGHT OAKLAND PLAYERS HEADLINE ALL-CONFERENCE TEAMS

The 2001 Mid-Con all-conference teams were dominated by the team that dominated the league. Oakland placed eight players on the two all-conference teams. League Co-Player of the Year Anita Rapp (who won the same honor in 1999) was named to the first team, as were Ashley McGhee, Kim Moore, Shelly Piccirillo, Christine Selesky and Gail Wilson. Moore and Wilson were both honored on the first team for the third straight season. Sarah Buckland and Debbie Cartmel were both named to the second team. In addition, rookie Katie Arnott was honored as the Mid-Con Newcomer of the Year. Oakland has had a player win at least Co-Player of the Year honors each season since 1999.

OAKLAND EARNS NATIONAL RANKING FROM SOCCER BUZZ

Oakland's season-long wait for a national ranking from one of the major college women's soccer polls ended on October 22, when the Golden Grizzlies earned their first-ever national rank from Soccer Buzz. Oakland debuted in the poll at No. 23, riding its nine-match unbeaten streak. The Golden Grizzlies received votes in both the NSCAA and Soccer Times Top 25 polls that week.

OAKLAND TABBED TO WIN MID-CON SOCCER TITLE IN PRESEASON POLL

The Oakland women's soccer team has been the squad to beat in the Mid-Continent Conference since the league began sponsoring the sport in 1999. League coaches expected Oakland to be the at the top of the Mid-Con again this season, as the Golden Grizzlies were picked first in the coaches' preseason poll. Oakland received five first-place votes, while second-place finisher Oral Roberts received one. The rest of the preseason poll included, in order: IUPUI, Valparaiso (both tied for third), Western Illinois and Southern Utah.

SOUTHERN UTAH SPONSORS SOCCER FOR FIRST TIME IN 2001

For the first time in school history, Southern Utah sponsored an intercollegiate women's soccer team in 2001. The Thunderbirds, led by former Youngstown State assistant coach Brian Stock, filled the void left by Youngstown State's departure to the Horizon League over the summer. The Thunderbirds were rated the fifth-best new program in 2001 by Soccer Buzz.

BRINE IS OFFICIAL BALL OF MID-CON AGAIN IN 2001

The Mid-Continent Conference takes on a new look this season, thanks to Southern Utah sponsoring women's soccer for the first time. However, the league's official ball won't change, as the Mid-Con and Brine team up again in 2001. Brine soccer balls will be used in all league games as well as the 2001 Mid-Con Tournament.

OAKLAND'S RAPP EARNS SOCCER BUZZ ELITE TEAM HONOR

Oakland standout midfielder Anita Rapp earned Mid-Con Player of the Week honors after the first week of the year, but that wasn't the only accolade the at-large Hermann Trophy candidate received.
