## Mid-Con Players of the Week



OFFENSIVE Beth Howson, Oakland Jr., F, Grosse Pointe, Mich.

Oakland's Beth Howson helped the Golden Grizzlies wrap up the No. 3 seed in next month's Mid-Con Tournament with a pair of goals off the bench in a 3-0 win at IUPUI to close the conference season. She got Oakland on the board in the 40th minute by heading in a crossing

pass for the eventual game-winner. She added another score less than two minutes later, heading in a corner kick. Howson had scored only one goal this season prior to her two-goal contest.

Oral Roberts' Martha Owens helped her team push its win streak to a school-record nine matches and win its first-ever outright Mid-Con regular-season title with her play from the defensive end. In a 3-2 comeback win over Northeastern State, she helped keep the visitors

off the scoreboard for the final 36 minutes of the match. She then anchored the Golden Eagle defense that allowed just four shots to Southern Utah (none on goal) in a 4-0 win, which gave her squad its first-ever 5-0 Mid-Con regular-season finish. Oral Roberts is unbeaten in its last ten matches (9-0-1).

#### Mid-Con Women's Soccer News and Notes



MID-CON TOURNAMENT FIELD SET: The field for the 2002 Mid-Con Women's Soccer Tournament, which will be contested on November 8 and 10 in Tulsa, Okla., was set with the conclusion of conference play last week. Oral Roberts, which finished with a perfect 5-0 conference record for the first time in school history and won its initial outright regular-season crown, will serve as the top seed in the tournament, and will face fourth-seeded Southern Utah, which will make its first Mid-Con Tournament appearance in only its second year as an intercollegiate program. The other semifinal contest will pit second-seeded Valparaiso, which duplicated its 4-1 conference record from a year ago, against No. 3 seed Oakland, the two-time defending Mid-Con Tournament champion. The two winners will meet in the title contest on November 10. The host has never won the Mid-Con Tournament in the first three years of Mid-Con Women's Soccer history.

ORAL ROBERTS REMAINS HOTTEST TEAM AROUND: Oral Roberts extended its win streak to a school-record nine matches (and its unbeaten streak to ten) with a 3-2 overtime win over Northeastern State and a 4-0 shutout of conference foe Southern Utah. Jessica Kellogg netted her sixth game-winning score of the season in the first win, while fellow rookie Heather Hall scored twice in the second victory. Oral Roberts has not lost a match since a Sept. 22 defeat at SE Missouri State. The Golden Eagles finished conference play with a 5-0 record for the first time in school history, outscoring league foes by a 17-1 margin and not allowing a goal in the last four league matches.

HOWSON HEADS WAY TO AWARD: Oakland's Beth Howson made the most of her time on the field in her team's 3-0 win at IUPUI, which wrapped up the No. 3 seed in the Mid-Con Tournament. Howson scored a pair of goals on headers within a twominute span late in the first half, which proved to be more than enough for the win. She has only scored one goal in 2002 heading into the game.

SCHOOL RECORDS FALL, TO NO ONE'S SURPRISE: Southern Utah will make its first Mid-Con Tournament appearance in only its second season of NCAA Division I competition. It's no surprise that a program with little history has had three players set school records. Ilene Dixon's five goals tie the school record she established in the team's first season, while Annie Payne's five assists and Megan Flowers have established new school season marks with five assists and 100 saves, respectively.

#### MID-CON TEAM NOTES

IUPUI (3-13-2, 1-4 Mid-Con): IUPUI had its Mid-Con Tournament berth chances dashed with a 3-0 loss at home to Oakland to close the conference season. The Jaguars managed just three shots in the game, including only one on goal. Erica Hocking and Connie Bigott split time in goal, with each making two saves. This is the first time in four seasons that IUPUI will have failed to make the Mid-Con Tournament field in women's soccer.

Oakland (7-11, 3-2 Mid-Con): Oakland wrapped up the No. 3 seed in next month's Mid-Con Tournament with a 3-0 win at IUPUI in its final conference match of the year, then dropped a 2-0 contest to No. 21/17 (NSCAA/Soccer Times) Michigan. Mid-Con Offensive Player of the Week Beth Howson came off the bench and scored a pair of headers within a two-minute span late in the first half, and Kristi Swaving added an insurance goal late. Sarah Buckland faced only three shots (and made one save() in the shutout. Michigan netted a pair of second-half goals to top the Golden Grizzlies; Buckland made seven stops. Oakland will square off against second-seeded Valparaiso in the Mid-Con Tournament semifinals.

Oral Roberts (11-5-1, 5-0 Mid-Con): Oral Roberts pushed its win streak to a school-record nine matches with a 3-2 overtime win over visiting Northeastern State, and a 4-0 blanking of Southern Utah at home in the Mid-Con finale. Down 2-0 in the middle of the second half, the Golden Eagles rallied by scoring three times in 30 minutes. Tessa Long got Oral Roberts on the board, Jodi Kirkhuff tied the match in the 85th minute, and Jessica Kellogg scored her sixth game-winning goal of the season in the sixth minute of overtime. Kellie Fenton made seven saves in the win. Heather Hall netted a pair of goals in the win over Southern Utah, while Long scored an insurance tally as well. Mid-Con Defensive Player of the Week Martha Owens anchored a defense that allowed just four shots to Southern Utah (none on goal). Oral Roberts, which posted its first-ever perfect 5-0 Mid-Con record as well as its initial outright regular-season crown, outscored its Mid-Con foes by a 17-1 margin this season. The Golden Eagles will host fourth-seeded Southern Utah in the Mid-Con Tournament semifinals. Oral Roberts has not lost in ten matches, a span of more than a month.

Southern Utah (2-16, 1-4 Mid-Con): Southern Utah closed the regular season with a 4-0 loss at Oral Roberts and a 1-0 setback at Arkansas-Little Rock. The Thunderbirds managed only four shots in the loss to Oral Roberts; Megan Flowers made four saves in the loss. Flowers allowed only a penalty kick in the 69th minute at Arkansas-Little Rock while making six stops. Southern Utah will make its Mid-Con Tournament debut as the No. 4 seed in a semifinal match at top-seeded Oral Roberts. Annie Payne's five assists this season have established a school record, while Ilene Dixon's five scores equal her school record total from a year ago. Flowers' 100 saves have also set a new school standard. Southern Utah has been shutout in four straight matches, a span of 365:09.

Valparaiso (5-10-1, 4-1 Mid-Con): Valparaiso dropped a pair of home non-conference matches last week to DePaul (3- 2002 Mid-Con Women's Soccer Tournament 1) and Butler (3-0). DePaul scored three times in the first 23 minutes of the game, and only Emily King's penalty kick score in the 89th minute avoided the shutout. Danielle Guerra made four saves in the loss at Butler. Valparaiso will face third-seeded Oakland in the Mid-Con Tournament Semifinals.

Western Illinois (1-13-1, 1-4 Mid-Con): Western Illinois dropped a 3-1 contest to visiting IPFW in its only match last week. The Westerwinds allowed three first-half goals, and Katie Campion's eighth score of the season (a Western Illinois freshman record) averted the shutout. Western Illinois failed to make the Mid-Con Tournament field for the second straight season, and for the third time in four years.
