Oral Roberts' Jessica Kellogg helped the Golden Eagles push their unbeaten streak to four matches and reach their first 3-0 league start in school history by supplying offense in wins over visiting IUPUI (5-0) and defending Mid-Con champion Oakland (3-0). Against IUPUI,

Kellogg scored the first two goals of the match, including the game-winner, and added an assist. Against Oakland, she knifed a pass between a pair of defenders to set up Tessa Long's insurance score in first minute of the second half. Kellogg, who had two goals and two assists in two matches, leads the Mid-Con with 16 points.

DEFENSIVE Kellie Fenton, Oral Roberts Fr., GK, Calgary, Alberta

Oral Roberts' Kellie Fenton was perfect in a pair of Golden Eagle shutout wins in conference play, which extended their unbeaten streak to four matches and gave them their first-ever 3-0 start in Mid-Con play. Fenton made one save in 69 minutes before being relieved

in a 5-0 win over IUPUI, but turned in a better performance against defending Mid-Con champion Oakland. She shut down the Golden Grizzlies, who entered the match averaging a league-best 2.27 goals per game, by making four stops and altering several other shots. Fenton, who has a 0.36 goals against average in conference play, leads the Mid-Con with her 1.40 GAA and two shutouts.

ORAL ROBERTS OFF TO UNPRECEDENTED LEAGUE START: For the first time in school history, Oral Roberts has opened conference play with a 3-0 record. The Golden Eagles pulled off the feat by shutting out IUPUI (5-0) and defending Mid-Con regular-season and tournament champion Oakland (3-0). Mid-Con Offensive Player of the Week Jessica Kellogg had two goals and an assist against IUPUI, while Jodi Kirkhuff also chipped in a pair of scores. Mid-Con Defensive Player of the Week Kellie Fenton didn't allow a goal all weekend, including a four-save effort in blanking Oakland, which led the league in scoring entering the match. Kellogg and Fenton, both rookies, lead the league in scoring (16 points) and goals against average (1.40), respectively. Oral Roberts has not lost in four matches, pulling its record even at 5-5-1 on the season.

VALPARAISO LURKS WITH OWN 2-0 START: Not forgotten with the great start of Oral Roberts in conference play is Valparaiso's own unbeaten league record. The Crusaders, who finished second in the Mid-Con last season with a 4-1 record, are 2-0 this season in conference play. Emily King tallied her second game-winning goal in as many league matches against Western Illinois in her team's 2-1 win, as she scored just 25 seconds before the end of the first half. After starting the season slowly, Valpo's all-time leading scorer, Lori Moore, has tallied four goals in her last three contests.

WESTERN ILLINOIS SLOGAN: PLAY LIKE A CAMPION TODAY: It probably won't make its way onto a sign in Notre Dame's locker room, but if Western Illinois is going to do any scoring, Katie Campion is probably around the ball. Campion extended her goal-scoring streak to four matches when she tallied her team's lone goal in a 2-1 loss to Valparaiso. Her seven goals this season have already established a school freshman record, and also rank as the second-highest season total in school history.

MID-CON TEAM NOTES

IUPUI (2-9-2, 0-3 Mid-Con): IUPUI dropped a 5-0 decision in league play at Oral Roberts, then forged a 2-2 tie with visiting Loyola. The Jaguars were outshot by a 29-4 margin at Oral Roberts and put only one shot on goal. Loyola outshot IUPUI by a large margin as well (31-9), but goals by Sarah Leonard and Tara Latella erased a pair of one-goal deficits. Erica Hocking preserved the tie by making 10 saves; she also assisted on Latella's score with a long goal kick. Latella ranks second on the school's career goals (22) and points (55) lists.

Oakland (4-8, 1-1 Mid-Con): Oakland opened conference play with a 5-1 triumph at Southern Utah, but then suffered its first league loss since the 2000 season at Oral Roberts (3-0). Natalie Simas scored a pair of goals at Southern Utah, while Jenny Young, Erica Demers and Ingrid Mortensen also got in on the act. Sarah Buckland faced 16 shots and made eight saves. The tables were turned at Oral Roberts, as the Golden Grizzlies put only four shots on goal in the entire match. Buckland made six saves in the loss. Oakland is now 15-2 all-time in Mid-Con play, with its only two losses coming at the hands of Oral Roberts.

Oral Roberts (5-5-1, 3-0 Mid-Con): Oral Roberts achieved its first-ever 3-0 start in Mid-Con play by posting shutout wins over IUPUI (5-0) and Oakland (3-0) at home. The victories also pushed the team's unbeaten streak to four contests. Mid-Con Offensive Player of the Week Jessica Kellogg scored the first two goals against IUPUI, and assisted on Erin Hartog's goal. Jodi Kirkhuff added two tallies herself, while Heather Hall and Tessa Long each contributed a pair of assists. After making only one save in 69 minutes of work against IUPUI, Mid-Con Defensive Player of the Week Kellie Fenton had to work harder to shut out Oakland, making four saves. Megan Utz got the Golden Eagles on the board in the first half, and Long and Martha Owens added insurance tallies in the second half. Kellogg had two goals and two assists on the week, and leads the Mid-Con in scoring (16 points) as a rookie. Fenton lowered her league-best goals against average to 1.40; her two shutouts also lead the conference.

Southern Utah (1-12, 1-1 Mid-Con): Southern Utah dropped a 5-1 decision at home to Oakland in its only match last week. Elysia Cannon's score in the 69th minute, her first of the season, prevented the shutout. Megan Flowers made eight saves in defeat while facing 26 shots. Annie Payne assisted on Cannon's goal, extending her school-record season assists total to five

Valparaiso (3-6-1, 2-0 Mid-Con): Valparaiso edged Western Illinois (2-1) on the road in a conference match, but suffered a non-conference loss at Eastern Illinois (4-1). Lori Moore got the Crusaders on the board in the fourth minute, but it was an Emily King goal just 25 seconds before the half that proved to be the game-winner. King has scored both game-winning goals in Valpo's conference wins over IUPUI and Western Illinois. Kristen Templin made six saves in the win. Moore's goal in the 54th minute at Eastern Illinois prevented the shutout.

Western Illinois (1-9-1, 1-3 Mid-Con): Western Illinois dropped a 2-1 decision in conference play at home to Valparaiso, and lost by the same score at home against DePaul. Katie Campion scored for the fourth straight match to bring the Westerwinds to within a goal against Valparaiso. Andrea Fernandez tallied her first score of the season against DePaul to close the deficit, but Western Illinois got no closer. Carey Cowhey made a career-best 13 saves against DePaul while facing 30 shots. Campion has established a Western Illinois freshman record with her seven goals, which also ranks second on the school's season list.
