## Mid-Con Women's Soccer News and Notes



OAKLAND A SURPRISE WINNER IN 2002 MID-CON TOURNAMENT: Oakland suffered a school-record 11 losses in the regular season and entered the Mid-Con Tournament as the No. 3 seed, its lowest since the league started sponsoring women's soccer in 1999. However, that didn't stop the Golden Grizzlies from winning their third straight Mid-Con Tournament and advancing to their second straight NCAA Tournament appearance. Oakland captured the semifinal over second-seeded Valparaiso by a 1-0 score on Silje Moen's second-half score. The Golden Grizzlies then battled top seed and tournament host Oral Roberts to a 1-1 tie through regulation and two overtimes before prevailing in a penalty kick shootout, 4-2. Tournament MVP Sarah Buckland made seven saves in the final, and also stopped Oral Roberts' third shootout attempt.

GOLDEN GRIZZLIES HAVE BEEN HERE BEFORE: Oakland will make its second straight NCAA Tournament appearance in 2002, but under largely different circumstances than last year. A year ago, the Golden Grizzlies were led by 2000 Olympic Gold Medalist Anita Rapp, and ended the season with a 16-4-1 record, which tied a school record for wins. Oakland went 5-0 in the Mid-Con and coasted through the Mid-Con Tournament with a pair of shutout wins before falling to eventual "Sweet 16" participant Cincinnati, 3-2, in the first round after going up by a pair of goals. This season, Oakland has dropped eight games by one goal, but enters the NCAA Tournament having lost just once in the last six matches. The Golden Grizzlies are one of two teams to enter the 2002 NCAA Tournament with a sub-.500 record (Big Ten Tournament champ Ohio State is the other).

OAKLAND LED BY TWO OF THE LEAGUE'S BEST: Oakland boasts both the Mid-Con Player and Newcomer of the Year in 2002. Junior Erica Demers was voted as the league's top player after the directing the Golden Grizzlies all season from the midfield position; she has five goals and seven assists in 2002. Demers did a lot of her work getting the ball to top newcomer Kristi Swaving, who has eight goals and five assists in 2002, and led the league with five goals scored in conference play.

A CLUE AS TO WHY OAKLAND IS HERE: Four of Oakland's top five scorers from last season are not with the Golden Grizzlies in 2002 (three were lost to graduation, one to injury), so it's no surprise that Oakland needed some time to grow up, which it seems to have done by losing just once in the last six matches entering the NCAA's. Head coach Nick O'Shea's team easily had the toughest schedule in the Mid-Con, as it played seven NCAA Tournament teams; Oakland went 2-5 in those contests, with wins over UW-Milwaukee (2-1) and Marquette (2-0), and losses to Michigan State (2-0), Purdue (4-3, OT), Dayton (2-1), Cincinnati (1-0) and first-round NCAA opponent Michigan (2-0) (as a league, the Mid-Con went 2-11 against the 2002 NCAA Tournament field). Oakland played five matches against regionally ranked teams in 2002, and lost all five of those games.

#### MID-CON TEAM NOTES

IUPUI (3-14-2, 1-4 Mid-Con): IUPUI finished in a tie for fourth in the Mid-Con standings, but failed to make the Mid-Con Tournament field for the first time since the league started sponsoring women's soccer in 1999. Mari Jo Kohler and Tara Latella were both named to the all-conference second team.

Oakland (10-11-1, 3-2 Mid-Con): Oakland, which entered the postseason as the No. 3 seed in the Mid-Con Tournament (its lowest seed ever), captured its third consecutive Mid-Con Tournament crown after beating second-seeded Valparaiso (1-0) in the semifinals and winning a penalty kick shootout (4-2) over top seed Oral Roberts after battling to a 1-1 tie through two overtimes. Tournament MVP Sarah Buckland made seven stops in the title match, as well as a save on the Golden Eagles' third shootout attempt. Silje Moen scored the game-winning goal in the semifinal win, while Ingrid Mor tensen put the Golden Grizzlies ahead early in the championship. Buckland was joined on the all-tournament team by Mortensen, Debbie Cartmel and Erica Demers. Oakland was well represented on the all-conference teams - Demers, who was named the Mid-Con Player of the Year, was joined by Buckland, Cartmel, Kim Moore (the league's first-ever four-time first-teamer) and Mid-Con Newcomer of the Year Kristi Swaving. Second-teamers included Katie Arnott and Therese Bjorke. Oakland will make its second straight NCAA Tournament appearance in 2002 (the Golden Grizzlies lost to Cincinnati, 3-2, in the first round last year), and will play Michigan, against whom it dropped a 2-0 decision earlier in the year.

Oral Roberts (13-5-3, 5-0 Mid-Con): Oral Roberts won its first-ever outright Mid-Con regular-season championship by sporting a perfect 5-0 league record, but fell in a shootout to Oakland in the Mid-Con Tournament title match, the third straight season the Golden Eagles have lost to Oakland in the title match. The Golden Eagles topped No. 4 seed Southern Utah (1-0) in the semifinals, thanks to a second-half goal by Jodi Kirkhuff. Kellie Fenton made one save for her sixth shutout of the season. Jessica Kellogg knotted up the championship match against Oakland with her own second-half score. Oral Roberts outshot Oakland by a 7-0 count in the two overtimes, but lost the penalty kick shootout (4-2). Kirkhuff and Kellogg were joined on the all-tourney team by Kim Pangburn. Oral Roberts placed a league-high eight players on the all-conference teams - included in that group were first-team selections Kirkhuff, Erin Hartog, Tessa Long and Martha Owens, and second-teamers Fenton, Kellogg, Anne Schick and Megan Utz. The Golden Eagles ended the year with a school-record 14-match unbeaten streak.

Southern Utah (2-17, 1-4 Mid-Con): Southern Utah fell by a 1-0 score in the Mid-Con Tournament semifinals to top seed and host Oral Roberts. The Thunderbirds, who lost to the Golden Eagles by a 5-0 count in the regular season, were making their first Mid-Con Tournament appearance in only their second season of sponsoring NCAA Division I women's soccer. Megan 2002 Mid-Con Women's Soccer Tournament Flowers made six saves in the loss. Ilene Dixon and Liz Brooks were honored on the all-tournament team; Dixon was the Thunderbirds' lone all-conference honoree, as she was named to the second team for the second straight season.

Valparaiso (5-13-1, 4-1 Mid-Con): Valparaiso dropped a 1-0 decision to eventual champion Oakland in the semifinal round of the Mid-Con Tournament. The Crusaders, who matched their best efforts in the conference with a 4-1 record and a second-place finish in the league standings, were ousted as the No. 2 seed for the second straight season. Valparaiso was outshot by a 21-6 count in the match, as Kristen Templin made nine saves. Templin and Courtney Budd were named to the alltournament team. Budd and Lori Moore were honored on the all-conference first team, while Templin, Cathy DeVito and Emily King were cited on the second team. Moore was a first-team selection in three of her four years at Valpo.

Western Illinois (1-14-1, 1-4 Mid-Con): Western Illinois, which finished in a tie for fourth place in the Mid-Con standings, failed to make the Mid-Con Tournament for the second consecutive season, and for the third time in four years. The Westerwinds did not place a player on the league's all-conference teams, though Katie Campion did set a school freshman record with her eight scores in 2002.
