OFFENSIVE Ilene Dixon, Southern Utah Jr., F, Orem, Utah

Southern Utah's llene Dixon helped her team snap an eight-match, season-opening losing streak by providing half of the Thunderbirds' offense in a 4-0 win over league foe Western Illinois. Dixon posted the quickest score in Southern Utah history when she found the back

of the net just 1:18 into the contest for the game-winner, and added another score in the 60th minute to help seal up the win. Dixon has three multi-goal matches in her career, in which Southern Utah is a perfect 3-0.

# Mid-Con Women's Soccer News and Notes

SOUTHERN UTAH STOPS SKID WITH CONFERENCE WIN: Southern Utah started the 2002 season by losing eight straight matches, and had dropped 11 consecutive contests dating back to last season. That skid ended, however, when the Thunderbirds beat Western Illinois in their Mid-Con opener, 4-0. The match marked many milestones for the second-year program: the four goals scored by the Thunderbirds were a single-match school record, and the margin of victory was the most lopsided. Ilene Dixon scored a pair of goals on her way to being named the Mid-Con Offensive Player of the Week, including the quickest goal in school history, just 1:18 into the match. Mid-Con Defensive Player of the Week Megan Flowers, who had tied a school record with 11 saves in a loss to UNLV earlier in the week, made nine stops for her first career shutout.

CLOSE ONLY COUNTS...: A year ago, Oakland went 16-4-1, tying a school season record for wins, and made its first-ever NCAA Tournament appearance. This season's young team has not enjoyed as much success. After winning a pair of matches to start the season (including a 2-0 win over now-nationally ranked Marquette), the Golden Grizzlies have dropped a schoolrecord six straight contests. Of those four defeats, five have come by one goal, including each of the last four

KIRKHUFF, LATELLA REACH SCHOOL CAREER MARKS: Oral Roberts' Jodi Kirkhuff and IUPUI's Tara Latella each reached a career milestone in their team's losses last week. Kirkhuff netted her third goal of the season in a 2-1 loss at Western Kentucky, which gave her a school career-record 59 points. Latella assisted Angie Volovich on the Jaguars' only goal in a 4-1 loss at crosstown rival Butler, her 11th career helper, which tied the all-time assists mark.

#### MID-CON TEAM NOTES

IUPUI (2-6, 0-0 Mid-Con): IUPUI dropped its only match last week to crosstown rival Butler, 4-1. Angie Volovich gave the hosts an early lead when she scored in the fifth minute on a pass from Tara Latella, but the visiting Bulldogs scored four unanswered goals to take away the win. Connie Bigott made three saves and did not allow a goal in 30 minutes of relief in goal. A 1997 Butler grad, IUPUI coach Jean Delaski is 0-3 against her alma mater. Latella's assist was the 11th of her career, which ties her for the all-time record at IUPUI.

Oakland (2-6, 0-0 Mid-Con): Oakland lost a pair of 1-0 matches - to New Mexico and Kansas - at a tournament hosted by Evansville. Against New Mexico, the Golden Grizzlies managed only one shot on goal; Sarah Buckland made two saves in the loss. Playing without a sub against Kansas, Oakland pushed the Jayhawks with more offensive pressure, putting seven shots on goal, but could not find the back of the net. Buckland made eight saves in that loss. Oakland's six-match losing streak is the longest in school history, and the team's six losses in 2002 are its most in one season since joining the NCAA. Five of the team's defeats have come by one goal, including each of the last four.

Oral Roberts (2-5, 1-0 Mid-Con): Oral Roberts opened conference play with a 3-1 win at Western Illinois, but then lost at Western Kentucky (2-1) and SE Missouri State (3-0). Martha Owens scored a penalty kick in the 63rd minute to give the Golden Eagles the lead at Western Illinois, but the Westerwinds tied the match on their own penalty kick less than a minute later to tie the match. Jessica Kellog's score in the 69th minute proved to be the game-winner, while Lindsay Ruisch added insurance later in the match. After Western Kentucky built a 2-0 lead, Jodi Kirkhuff tried to being the Golden Eagles back in the match with her third goal of the season, but Oral Roberts got no closer. Despite outshooting host SE Missouri State by a 16-14 margin, Oral Roberts was shut out for the first time this season. Kirkhuff's score at Western Kentucky made her the school's career leader with 59 points.

Southern Utah (1-8, 1-0 Mid-Con): Southern Utah started the week by dropping a 3-0 decision at home to UNLY, but then snapped a season-opening eight-match losing streak with a 4-0 win over Western Illinois to start conference play. Mid-Con Defensive Player of the Week Megan Flowers tied a school record with 11 saves (while facing 30 shots) against UNLV. Flowers atoned for that loss by posting her first career shutout against Western Illinois, making nine saves in the process. Mid-Con Offensive Player of the Week Ilene Dixon did much of the damage for Southern Utah, scoring twice, including the quickest score in school history just 1:18 into the match. Lindsay Mulliner added a goal and an assist, as did Michelle Davis. Dixon now has three multi-goal matches in her career, and Southern Utah is undefeated in those matches. Coincidentally, those are also the only matches the Thunderbirds have won in their brief history. Southern Utah had scored only five goals in eight matches to start the year before its school-record output of four against Western Illinois.

Valparaiso (1-4-1, 0-0 Mid-Con): Valparaiso opened the weekend with a 2-0 loss at home to Drake, then snapped a season-opening five-match winless streak with a 3-0 win over visiting Northern Iowa. The Crusaders kept offensive pressure on Drake throughout the match, taking 16 shots and forcing 10 saves, but never lit the scoreboard. Kristen Templin made six saves in the loss. Valpo rebounded by shutting out Northern Iowa. Danielle Guerra made five saves in goal for her first career shutout, and the Crusaders got the game-winning goal from Lindsay Holley and a pair of scores from Lorna Torrez.


Western Illinois (0-5-1, 0-2 Mid-Con): Western Illinois suffered a pair of losses to open Mid-Con play - at home against Oral Roberts (3-1) and at Southern Utah (4-0) - and dropped a 5-2 decision at Northern Arizona. Casey Cox scored her first 2002 Mid-Con Women's Soccer Tournament goal of the season on a penalty kick against Oral Roberts, but the visitors quickly answered and went on for the win. At Southern Utah, the Westerwinds allowed four goals in the first 60 minutes of the match and couldn't find the back of the net on any of their 15 shots. Sarah Yakapovich made her first career start in goal at Northern Arizona and made 13 saves, but also allowed five scores, including three in the last 19 minutes of the match. Katie Campion scored twice in ten minutes to tie the match early in the second half before the hosts closed the match with three straight scores. Jenny Oxler and Sarah Lippert returned to Westerwinds' line-up after being out with injuries. Western Illinois has lost seven consecutive conference matches, dating back to last season.
