MID-CON TEAM NOTES

IUPUI (3-14-2, 1-4 Mid-Con): IUPUI finished in a tie for fourth in the Mid-Con standings, but failed to make the Mid-Con Tournament field for the first time since the league started sponsoring women's soccer in 1999. Mari Jo Kohler and Tara Latella were both named to the all-conference second team. Latella finished her third season ranked among the Mid-Con's career leaders in shots (7th; 156), goals (7th; 23), goals per game (7th; 0.42), assists (t-11th; 11), assists per game (t-11th; 0.20); points (8th; 57) and points per game (7th; 1.04). Erica Hocking made the Mid-Con's season leaders in goals against average (20th; 2.86), saves (18th; 84), and saves per game (t-11th; 6.00), while improving on the career lists in minutes played (5th; 2899:58); goals against average (10th; 2.45), saves (5th; 193), saves per game (9th; 5.68) and shutouts (t-11th; 2). Among career leaders, Katie Giger is ranked in minutes played (11th; 1728:34); goals against average (13th; 3.44), saves (9th; 142), saves per game (4th; 7.10) and shutouts (t-13th; 1), while Connie Bigott rates herself in minutes played (504:17) and saves (19th; 41).

Oakland (10-12-1, 3-2 Mid-Con): Oakland, which entered the postseason as the No. 3 seed in the Mid-Con Tournament (its lowest seed ever), captured its third consecutive Mid-Con Tournament crown after beating second-seeded Valparaiso (1-0) in the semifinals and winning a penalty kick shootout (4-2) over top seed Oral Roberts after battling to a 1-1 tie through two overtimes. Tournament MVP Sarah Buckland made seven stops in the title match, as well as a save on the Golden Eagles' third shootout attempt. Oakland was well represented on the all-conference teams - Erica Demers, who was named the Mid-Con Player of the Year, was joined by Buckland, Debbie Cartmel, Kim Moore (the league's first-ever four-time first-teamer) and Mid-Con Newcomer of the Year Kristi Swaving. Second-teamers included Katie Arnoit and Therese Bjorke. Oakland made its second straight NCAA Tournament appearance in 2002, losing to Michigan in the first round by a 1-0 score. Several Golden Grizzlies made their mark in the Mid-Con record book in 2002: Swaving's 102 shots were the second-most in one season in Mid-Con history and already rank 14th on the league's career list; Cartmel's nine goals (t-16th), six assists (t-11th), 24 points (t-14th) and 1.10 points per game (t-17th) all ranked on the Mid-Con's single-season list; Demers' 0.30 assists per game tied for 18th on the single-season list; Buckland's 2007:21 minutes played were the second-most in Mid-Con history, and she also made season lists in goals against average (6th; 1.30); saves (14th; 98), saves per game (19th; 4.26) and shutouts (t-7th; 5). Among the league's career leaders, Cartmel finished her career ranked in shots (9th; 139), goals (6th; 25); goals per game (t-11th; 0.32), assists (3rd; 19); assists per game (7th; 0.24), points (6th; 69) and points per game (10th; 0.87); Demers finished up her third year ranked among the conference's career leaders in shots (12th; 117); goals (t-12th; 12); goals per game (t-19th; 0.20); assists (6th; 16); assists per game (5th; 0.26), points (12th; 40) and points per game (15th; 0.66); Beth Howson ranks in goals (t-20th; 9) and assists per game (t-20th; 0.13); Arnoit rates in assists (t-17th; 8) and assists per game (t-9th; 0.21); Kelly Rieck is on the assists list (t-17th; 8); and Buckland ranks in all goalie categories, including minutes played (1st; 5158:17), goals against average (3rd; 1.13), saves (3rd; 237), saves per game (12th; 4.02) and shutouts (1st; 18).

Oral Roberts (13-5-3, 5-0 Mid-Con): Oral Roberts won its first-ever outright Mid-Con regular-season championship by sporting a perfect 5-0 league record, but fell in a shootout to Oakland in the Mid-Con Tournament title match, the third straight season the Golden Eagles have lost to Oakland in the championship. Oral Roberts placed a league-high eight players on the all-conference teams - included in that group were first-team selections Jodi Kirkhuff, Erin Hartog, Tessa Long and Martha Owens, and second-teamers Kellie Fenton, Jessica Kellogg, Anne Schick and Megan Utz. The Golden Eagles ended the year with a school-record 14-match unbeaten streak. A host of Oral Roberts players ranked on the Mid-Con's single-season charts: Kirkhuff ranked on the shots (t-14th; 60), assists (5th; 9), assists per game (6th; 0.45), points (13th; 25) and points per game (15th; 1.25) lists; Kellogg, who led the conference in scoring as a rookie; landed on the shots (t-14th; 60), goals (t-5th; 12), goals per game (12th; 0.57), assists (7th; 7), assists per game (t-13th; 0.33), points (t-5th; 31) and points per game (9th; 1.48) charts; Long ranked on the goals per game (t-17th; 0.47) list; Owens rated on the assists (t-11th; 6) list; and Fenton found herself on the season minutes played (7th; 1766:18), goals against average (2nd; 0.92) and shutouts (t-5th; 6) charts. Among career leaders: Kirkhuff ranked in shots (2nd; 212); goals (3rd; 30), goals per game (8th; 0.36), assists (5th; 17), assists per game (t-9th; 0.21), points (3rd; 77) and points per game (8th; 0.93); Long was among the leaders in shots (4th; 175), goals (5th; 28), goals per game (6th; 0.46), assists (t-7th; 14), assists per game (8th; 0.23), points (5th; 70) and points per game (5th; 1.15); Hartog rated in shots (10th; 134), goals (12th; 14), and points (13th; 35); Utz could be found on the goals (t-20th; 9) chart; Kellogg made the goals (t-13th; 12) and points (15th; 31) lists; Owens ranked in assists (10th; 12) and assists per game (t-11th; 0.20); her sister, Megan Owens, also ranked in assists (t-17th; 8) and assists per game (t-20th; 0.13); Fenton climbed into the rankings in minutes played (10th; 1766:18), saves (16th; 76) and shutouts (t-6th; 6); and Christy Chapman also stayed in the goalie rankings in minutes played (3rd; 4002:01), goals against average (4th; 1.37), saves (6th; 185), saves per game (t-12th; 4.02) and shutouts (2nd; 15).

Southern Utah (2-17, 1-4 Mid-Con): Southern Utah fell by a 1-0 score in the Mid-Con Tournament semifinals to top seed and host Oral Roberts in its first Mid-Con Tournament appearance. Ilene Dixon was the Thunderbirds' lone all-conference honoree, as she was named to the second team for the second straight season. Megan Flowers made the Mid-Con's single-season lists in minutes played (20th; 1181:04), goals against average (16th; 2.44), saves (10th; 106) and saves per game (5th; 8.18). Dixon found her way into the career leaders in goals (t-18th; 10), goals per game (14th; 0.29) and points per game (16th; 0.60), while Flowers ranks on career lists in minutes played (12th; 1723:49), goals against average (14th; 3.45), saves (8th; 150), saves per game (3rd; 7.14) and shutouts (t-13th; 1). In addition, Lyndsey Sobrero ranks in minutes played (14th; 1480:12), goals against average (12th; 2.92), saves (12th; 95), saves per game (10th; 5.59) and shutouts (t-13th; 1) Valparaiso (5-13-1, 4-1 Mid-Con): Valparaiso dropped a 1-0 decision to eventual champion Oakland in the semifinal round of the Mid-Con Tournament. The Crusaders matched their best efforts in the conference with a 4-1 record and a second-place finish in the league standings. Courtney Budd and Lori Moore were honored on the all-conference first team, while Kristen Templin, Cathy DeVito and Emily King were cited on the second team. Moore was a first-team selection in three of her four years at Valpo. Templin made the Mid-Con season leaders in minutes played (19th; 1266:37), goals against average (15th; 2.42); saves (12th; 101), saves per game (8th; 6.73) and shutouts (t-13th; 2). Moore finished her terrific career ranked among the conference's career leaders in shots (1st; 240), goals (2nd; 35), goals per game (5th; 0.47), assists (t-13th; 10), assists per game (t-18th; 0.14), points (2nd; 80) and points per game (6th; 1.08). Templin ranks among the Mid-Con's all-time leaders in minutes played (1888:13), goals against average (8th; 2.24), saves (7th; 156), saves per game (11th; 5.38) and shutouts (t-9th; 3), while Danielle Guerra ranks in minutes played (20th; 463:23), saves (20th; 26) and shutouts (t-13th; 1).

Western Illinois (1-14-1, 1-4 Mid-Con): Western Illinois, which finished in a tie for fourth place in the Mid-Con standings, failed to make the Mid-Con Tournament for the second consecutive season, and for the third time in four years. The Westerminds did not place a player on the league's all-conference teams, though Katie Campion did set a school freshman record with her eight scores in 2002. Carey Cowhey made the Mid-Con's season list in saves per game (9th; 6.27). Among the Mid-Con's career leaders, Jennifer Oxler ranked in shots (18th; 80); goals (t-18th; 10), assists (16th; 9), assists per game (17th; 0.16), points (16th; 29) and points per game (20th; 0.50). Cowhey made the Mid-Con's all-time leaders in minutes played (16th; 774:55) and saves (17th; 69), while Sarah Yakapovich ranked in minutes played (18th; 702:19), saves (18th; 62) and shutouts (t-13th, 1).
