# Team-by-Team Schedule and Results

## AROUND THE MID-CON...

**OAKLAND RULES MID-CON ROOST AGAIN:** Oakland continued to be the dominant team in the Mid-Con in 2003. The Golden Grizzlies won their fourth Mid-Con regular-season crown in five years, captured their fourth consecutive Mid-Con Tourney title, and went to the NCAA Women's College Cup for the third straight year. Oakland won 13 of 14 matches entering the NCAA's.

**DOMINANT DEFENSE:** The Oakland defense allowed just 19 goals in 21 matches in 2003. Mid-Con Defensive Player of the Year Therese Bjorke anchored that group, while goalie Sarah Buckland made 83 saves and a posted a conference record-low 0.83 GAA. Buckland had seven shutouts in 2003, lifting her conference career record total to 25. The team's 11 shutouts ranked second in league history, second only to the 2001 squad's 12.

**TOURNEY TIDBIT:** Oakland is the only team to represent the Mid-Con in the NCAA Women's College Cup. The Golden Grizzlies lost to Cincinnati (3-2) at Notre Dame in 2001, at Michigan (1-0) in 2002, and again to Michigan (1-0) at Notre Dame in 2003.

**SHE'S GRRRREAT:** Oral Roberts' Jessica Kellogg avoided the "sophomore slump" in 2003, collecting a team-high nine goals and 21 points to earn All Mid-Con first team accolades for the first time in her career. Through just 41 career games, Kellogg is already one of the Mid-Con's most prolific scorers in its brief women's soccer history. Kellogg ranks ninth on the Mid-Con's career goals scored list (21), is tied for 15th in career assists (10), and rates 12th on the conference's career scoring list (52). She's led her team in scoring two straight years.

**NEWBIE'S A LEAGUE LEADER:** She wasn't eligible for the conference's Newcomer of the Year award because she wasn't new to her team, but the top fresh face in the Mid-Con in 2003 belonged to Centenary's Mindi Levinski. She paced the Mid-Con with her 11 assists and 27 points, and also netted a team-high eight goals.

**THE OLD AND THE NEW:** Oakland's Shelly Piccirillo returned from an injury redshirt season to become the Mid-Con Offensive Player of the Year; she finished the season with 24 points and tied for the league lead in goals scored (11) with teammate and Newcomer of the Year Marianne Samdal, who led the squad with 25 points. Another Oakland freshman - Lisa-Marie Woods - was tabbed to the Great Lakes second team, as the Great Lakes Region Freshman of the Year and as a Freshman All-America by Soccer Buzz Magazine, while rookie Cat Panabaker was a region all-freshman performer as well.

• In its first season in the Mid-Con, Centenary finished third in the league standings, qualified for the Mid-Con Tournament, and played Oral Roberts to a 1-1 double-overtime tie before losing in PKs.

• First-team all-league honoree Mindi Levinski led the Mid-Con in scoring (27) and assists (11). Three of her team-high eight goals were game-winners. Samantha Savage joined Levinski on the league's all-conference first team, while Rebecca Swilley was a second-teamer.

• Goalie Lindsey Stafford ranks in the Mid-Con's single-season top ten in minutes (5th, 1840:00), goals against average (t-6th, 1.12), saves (t-9th, 109) and shutouts (t-6th, 6).
