AROUND THE MID-CON...



VALPARAISO TAKES HOME FIRST TITLE: Second-seeded Valparaiso won its first-ever Mid-Con Women's Soccer Championship by virtue of a 3-1 win over top-seeded Oakland. The Crusaders have appeared in the Championship match on two previous occasions but could not come away with the title. Oakland, which lost in the title match for the first time in school history, finished the season at 9-8-1 while the Crusaders improve to 12-7-1.

OF NOTE: Centenary's **Ali Hilsher** ended the season second on the Mid-Con single-season list for saves per game (9.47) and third in saves (142). Through Nov. 6, she ranks fourth in the NCAA in saves per game (9.47) and sixth in save percentage (.877) ... Oakland's **Kristi Swaving** ended the regular-season as the leader in goals (12) and points (27). Her 37 career goals and 91 career points are tied for third all-time in the Mid-Con ... Oral Roberts' **Jessica Kellogg** ends her career as the Mid-Con's all-time leader in goals (48) and points (114).

TEAM-BY-TEAM NOTEBOOKS:

CENTENARY: Centenary finished its season 6-12-1 ... Ali Hilsher had an outstanding season as she tallied a school-record 142 saves and the school single-game saves mark of 19. Through Nov. 6, Hilsher ranked third in the NCAA in saves per game (9.47) and ninth in save percentage (.877) ... Junior defender/midfielder Lauren Mills (1 g, 0 a) was named second team All Mid-Con.

IUPUI: IUPUI ended 2005 with a 3-11-2 mark ... Stacy Downing led the way for IUPUI in 2005 with six goals and 13 points while Sheri Levack (0 g, 4 a) and Lisa Gebhard (0 g, 0 a) earned second team All-Conference honors.

OAKLAND: Oakland (9-8-1) was the top seed in the Mid-Con Championship but fell in the title game to Valparaiso (3-1) ... OU advanced to the Championship match after topping #4 Western Illinois, 3-1 ... 2005 Offensive Player of the Year Kristi Swaving, a four-time league all-star, became the fifth player to post two goals in a tournament match with a pair of tallies against WIU. She ends her career with 37 goals and 91 points, both are third in Mid-Con history ... Cat Panabaker, Marianne Samdal, Jessica Boyle and Silje Peltopera joined Swaving as All-Conference selections.

ORAL ROBERTS: Oral Roberts wrapped up 2005 with a 10-9-0 record after coming into the year as the preseason favorite ...Four-time All Mid-Con selection **Jessica Kellogg** ended her ORU career as the Mid-Con's all-time leader in goals (48) and points (114). Her 114 points mark the first time in conference history a player has surpassed the 100 career points plateau. Joining Kellogg as All-Conference honorees are 2005 Defensive Player of the Year **Gentry Detter**, **Heather Hall** and **Tamara Waller** ... Detter is just the second player in Mid-Con history to win Player of the Year honors twice (**Anita Rapp**, Oakland).

SOUTHERN UTAH: Southern Utah finished the season with the best Mid-Con mark (3-1-2) and overall record (7-4-6) in school history ... Head coach **Brian Stock** was named 2005 Co-Coach of the Year for his efforts ... **Tara Olson**, **Liz Browning**, **Holly Davis**, **Catherine Johnson** and **Dani Lavigne** were all named All Mid-Con performers ... Olson was the leading scorer for the Thunderbirds with six goals and three assists for 15 points.

VALPARAISO: Valparaiso won its first ever tournament championship thanks to a 3-1 win over top-seeded Oakland. Valpo defeated Southern Utah, 2-0, in the semifinals to avenge its two regular season conference losses ... Head coach **Stephen Anthony** was named 2005 Co-Coach of the Year for leading the Crusaders to a share of the regular-season crown ... **Emily King** was selected as the Tournament MVP after setting the Mid-Con Championship record for goals (4) and points (8) in a tournament ... The Crusaders will play Notre Dame in the first round of the 2005 NCAA Women's College Cup on Friday, Nov. 11.

WESTERN ILLINOIS: Western Illinois finished a successful season under first-year **Kevin Sherry** with a 9-6-3 mark and a 3-2-1 record in Mid-Con play ... **Ashley Hoch** was named the 2005 Newcomer of the Year after she recorded seven goals and six assists for a team-leading 20 points ... Joining Hoch as All Mid-Con honorees were **Bess Rapp**, **Loes Geurts** and **Katelyn Wisner**.

2005 Championship Review

2005 Mid-Con Women's Soccer Championship ORU Soccer Complex • Tulsa, Okla.

November 6 - Championship Match #2 Valparaiso 3, #1 Oakland 1

Valparaiso senior defender **Emily King** tallied two goals to lead the Crusaders to their first-ever Mid-Con Championship. After a scoreless first half, King dribbled through the Oakland defense and put Valpo on the board in the 55th minute. Oakland would answer seven minutes later as **Kristi Vandeberghe** rippled the net after a pass from **Lia Williamson**.

The Crusaders would pull ahead again in the 74th minute as **Courtney Rahrig** blasted a shot past Oakland goalkeeper **Jessica Howard** from 25 yards out. Valparaiso, which outshot the Golden Grizzlies 10-5 in the second half, would not let up the pressure and were rewarded just three minutes later as King tallied her second goal of the match off a free kick. **Erin Murray** would lead the Crusader defense as they fended off the Golden Grizzlies in the final 13 minutes.

King was selected as the Tournament MVP after becoming the first player in Mid-Con history to record two multi-goal matches in the Mid-Con tourney. She also set the Mid-Con Championship record for goals in a tournament (4) and points in a tournament (8). She was joined on the All-Tournament team by fellow Crusaders Dana McGlone, Erin Murray and Rahrig. Oakland placed three players on the team in Jessica Boyle, Silje Peltopera and Kristi Swaving, while Western Illinois' Ashley Hoch and Bess Rapp and Southern Utah's Liz Browning and Tara Olson round out the All-Tournament team.

Valparaiso improves to 12-7-1 in 2005, while Oakland, which lost in the title match for the first time in school history, ends the season at 9-8-1.

November 4 - Semifinal #1 #1 Oakland 3, #4 Western Illinois 1

Kristi Swaving, the 2005 Offensive Player of the Year, scored two goals to lead top-seeded Oakland over #4 Western Illinois, 3-1, in the semifinals of the 2005 Mid-Con Championship. The Golden Grizzlies have come away with the trophy in all five of their Mid-Con Championship game appearances, posting a 4-0-1 record.

Swaving scored in the seventh minute off a pass from Marianne Samdal to give the Golden Grizzlies the early advantage. Then in the 36th minute, Silje Peltopera rippled the net off another assist from Samdal to give OU a 2-0 lead.

Western Illinois would cut the deficit in half in the 55th minute thanks to a goal by **Ashley Hoch**. The 2005 Newcomer of the Year scored off of a free kick from 25 yards out for her eighth goal of the year. However, the Westerwinds could not pull any closer as Swaving added an insurance tally for OU in the 74th minute. She is just the fifth player in conference history to score two goals in a Mid-Con tournament game. The goal was also Swaving's league-leading 14th of the season. The Golden Grizzlies defense would hold Western Illinois at bay for the final 16 minutes.

Oakland improves to 9-7-1 on the season with a 4-2-0 mark in conference play, while Western Illinois' season comes to a close with a 9-6-3 overall record and a 3-2-1 effort in Mid-Con action.

November 4 - Semifinal #2 #2 Valparaiso 2, #3 Southern Utah 0

Valparaiso senior defender **Emily King** provided all of the offense for the Crusaders as they downed No. 3 seed Southern Utah, 2-0, in the semifinals of the 2005 Mid-Con Championship. Valpo, which is making its second-straight appearance in the Mid-Con final and third overall, is in search of its first conference tourney title.

King would get Valpo on the board in the 10th minute off a corner kick from **Dana McGlone**. The corner kick was one of four in the first half for the Crusaders as they pressed the issue early and often. Southern Utah goalkeeper **Holly Davis** kept her squad in the match with three first-half saves but in the 42nd minute, King struck again as she took a pass from McGlone and fired it in the net. King became the sixth player in conference history to score two goals in a Mid-Con tournament game, accomplishing the feat just hours after Oakland's **Kristi Swaving** tallied two goals against Western Illinois.

Down 2-0, Southern Utah became the aggressor in the second half as it outshot Valparaiso by an 8-6 margin, but the T-Birds could not get anything by the Crusaders' **Erin Murray**. The sophomore keeper turned back each Thunderbird attempt on goal to preserve the 2-0 lead. In all, the first team All Mid-Con performer tallied 10 saves to post her league-leading sixth shutout of the season.

Valparaiso moves to 11-7-1 overall this season with a 4-2-0 mark in conference play, while Southern Utah ends 2005 with the best overall record (7-4-6) and Mid-Con mark (3-1-2) in school history.

Valparaiso draws Notre Dame in first round of NCAA Women's College Cup

Valparaiso, the 2005 Mid-Con Women's Soccer Tournament champions, will face off against #5/#5 Notre Dame in the first round of the 2005 NCAA Women's College Cup on Friday, Nov. 11 at 7:30 p.m. The Crusaders and Fightin' Irish are joined by Michigan State and Bowling Green in the regional bracket. The four squads will play in South Bend, Ind. on the campus of the University of Notre Dame.

Valparaiso (12-7-1, 4-2-0 Mid-Con) tied Oakland for its first regular season title with a 4-2-0 mark but lost the tiebreaker to the Golden Grizzlies giving them the #2 seed in the Mid-Con tourney. The Crusaders defeated third-seeded Southern Utah in the semifinals, 2-0, before upending top-seeded Oakland for the conference crown, 3-1. The Championship title gave the Crusaders their first-ever tournament crown after two previous losses in the title match. Senior defender **Emily King**, the Tournament MVP, led the way for Valparaiso as she set tournament records for goals (4) and points (8).

The Crusaders, a young but consistent squad, are solid on both sides of the ball. King, a first team All Mid-Con performer, provides the leadership from her backline position but also led the squad in scoring with 27 points (11 g, 5 a). Freshmen forwards **Kendall Brown** (10 g, 4 a) and **Lori Johnson** (6 g, 2 a) showed veteran poise in their rookie seasons and were second team All-Conference selections. Defensively, freshman defender **Jackie Thomas** and sophomore goalkeeper **Erin Murray** joined King on the first team All Mid-Con list. Thomas paired with King to form a solid backline that allowed 24 goals overall and just five in conference play. In net, Murray followed up an All-Conference rookie season with a solid sophomore showing. She posted a 1.07 goals against average, 77 saves and five shutouts, tying her for the league lead.

Notre Dame earned the automatic bid out of the Big East Conference after finishing the season 19-2-0 and 11-1-0 in conference play. The Fightin' Irish won their eighth conference tournament title in the last 11 seasons and are the defending NCAA champions. They also enter the NCAA tournament with a 10-match winning streak.

The Crusaders did not play a match against a Big East squad or a ranked opponent this season. Valpo played one match against an NCAA tourney team when the Crusaders played Creighton to a scoreless tie on Sept. 25. In addition, Oakland had a match against the Crusaders potential second-round opponent Bowling Green. The Golden Grizzlies posted a 4-1 win over the Falcons on Aug. 26.
