David Castillo, Oral Roberts So., C. Corpus Christi, Texas

Castillo earned all-tournament honors at the Johnny Quik Classic at Fresno State after posting a monster week at the plate. Castillo batted .500 (12-24) with four doubles, four home runs and 12 RBIs in six games, while helping his team to a thirdplace finish in the eight-team tourney. Castillo hit safely in five of six games, and posted four consecutive multi-hit games to start the tournament, including a pair of three-hit games in wins over Fordham and Illinois State.



Michael Rogers, Oral Roberts Sr., RHP, Artesia, N.M.

Rogers continued to pitch up to his All-America status at the Johnny Quik Classic. hosted by Fresno State. Rogers helped his team to a third-place finish in the eightteam tournament by tossing a pair of fivehit, complete game wins. Against Fordham to start the tournament. Rogers allowed one unearned run while striking out four in a 7-1 win. Then, in the third-place game, he went the distance again against Gonzaga in a 4-1 victory, striking out six and allowing just the one run. He was named to the all-tournament team for his efforts.

2002 Mid-Con Baseball Notebook

AROUND THE MID-CON...

Chicago State (1-7, 0-0 Mid-Con): Chicago State opened its season with an eight-game trip to Homestead, Fla., where it won once, beating St. Peter's (4-3)... the Cougars lost three games in the opponent's final at-bat, all by one run... Nick Troy opened the season well, batting .429 with 12 hits, while Torrence Profit batted .308 with a homer and five steals.

Oakland (1-13, 0-0 Mid-Con): Oakland played only twice last week, dropping a doubleheader to visiting Central Michigan (6-2 and 5-3) in its home opener... the Golden Grizzlies managed only 12 hits in the two games, three by Matt Gabrielli... Brad Morenko posted a decent performance in the nightcap loss, throwing five innings and allowing two runs.

Oral Roberts (12-8 Mid-Con): Oral Roberts finished third of eight teams at the Pepsi/Johnny Quik Classic, hosted by Fresno State... the Golden Eagles went 4-2 in the week-long event, beating Fordham (7-1), Liberty (21-5), Illinois State (16-3) and Gonzaga (4-1)... Mid-Con Player of the Week David Castillo had a monstrous week at the plate, batting .500 (12-24) with four doubles, four home runs and 12 RBIs... Wilton Reynolds hit .524 (11-21) with three homers, nine RBIs and 12 runs scored, while Eric Thornton batted .522 (12-23) with four extra base hits... Mid-Con Pitcher of the Week Michael Rogers continued to live up to All-America expectations with a pair of complete game five-hitters, beating Fordham and Gonzaga... he struck out 10 and allowed only one earned run in 18 innings of work, for a minute 0.50 ERA... Castillo, Reynolds, Rogers and Thornton were all named to the all-tournament team... Rogers is now 5-0 this season, and 19-1 over the past two years.

Southern Utah (2-21, 0-0 Mid-Con): In a series that was moved because of snow in the Cedar City area, Southern Utah dropped two of three games at Mesa State... the Thunderbirds saw their losing streak reach seven games with losses in the first two games, but snapped the skid with a 4-3 win in the last contest... Jake Reynolds had five hits in the three games, while Jona Droubay, Chris Nelson and Tom Ford all went deep... Shane Perkins posted a solid performance in the team's lone win, going the distance in a seven-inning game and allowing only two earned runs... Taylor Ehat put up a solid effort in relief in the first game of the series, throwing five shutout innings and striking out seven.

Valparaiso (0-6-1, 0-0 Mid-Con): Valparaiso went winless last week in four games, though it did manage to rally for a 12-12 tie at St. Joseph's (Ind.)... the Crusaders scored 10 runs in the final three innings to force extra innings, but the game ended in a tie due to darkness... Mark Pedersen batted .583 (7-12) for the week, drew five walks and drove in three runs... Marc Boggio batted .467 with seven hits, including three doubles... in three relief appearances, Rodney Benner allowed only one earned run in 4.1 innings of work.

Western Illinois (1-15, 0-0 Mid-Con): Western Illinois dropped six games last week, including two at Kansas State, one at Oklahoma and three at Tennessee-Martin... Joe Rooney had a good week at the plate, batting .450 (9-20) with a home run, while John Bertulis hit .391 (9-23) and Jeff Wellwood added seven hits, including a homer, and drove in five runs... Western Illinois had a rough week on the mound, as evidenced by its 9.47 team ERA... in his first start of the season, career reliever Brian Lewis went six innings and allowed only three earned runs in a loss at Tennessee-Martin... Ricky McCool stepped off the mound and into the batter's box in the final game at Tennessee-Martin, and had three hits, including a double, and two stolen bases, though he did eventually take the loss in relief.

ORAL ROBERTS SOLID AT JOHNNY QUIK CLASSIC

Oral Roberts posted a good showing in one of the premier annual college baseball tournaments, finishing third of eight teams at the Pepsi/Johnny Quik Classic, hosted by Fresno State. The Golden Eagles went 4-2 in the six-day affair, beating Fordham (7-1), Liberty (21-5), Illinois State (16-3) and Gonzaga (4-1). Some hot bats helped the Golden Eagles to the four wins, as they hit .341 as a team for the week. Mid-Con Player of the Week David Castillo was the offensive ringleader, as he posted four consecutive multi-hit games and batted .500 (12-24) with four doubles, four home runs and 12 RBIs. Wilton Reynolds (.524-3-9) and Eric Thornton (.522-1-6) also contributed, with the former scoring 12 runs. Mid-Con Pitcher of the Week Michael Rogers continued his All-America effort with a pair of complete game wins, beating Fordham and Gonzaga. He struck out 10 and allowed only 10 hits and one earned run, good for a 0.50 ERA. Castillo, Reynolds, Rogers and Thornton were all named to the all-tourney team.

SOME VOTES BETTER THAN NO VOTES AT ALL...

The strong performance of Oral Roberts at the Johnny Quik Classic in Fresno last week resulted in a bit of national attention in the polls. The Golden Eagles received two points in the ESPN Coaches poll, tying for 48th nationally.

VALPO WEARS THE RALLY CAPS

Valparaiso is still winless this season after seven games, but the Crusaders picked up their first non-loss with a terrific late effort at St. Joseph's (Ind.). Valparaiso was down 12-2 heading into the final three innings of play, but scored four runs in the seventh inning, five in the eighth and one in the ninth to knot the game at 12-12. The two teams played a scoreless tenth inning before the game was called due to darkness.

CHICAGO STATE STAYS AT HEARTBREAK HOTEL ON SPRING TRIP

Chicago State opened its season with an eight-game trip to Homestead, Fla., last week, and the Cougars' effort was not reflected in their record. Chicago State finished 1-7 on the trip, with its only win coming at the hands of St. Peter's (4-3). However, the Cougars lost three games in their opponent's final at-bat, all of which were one-run losses (St. Bonaventure, 6-5 - 11 inn.; Radford, 4-3; and UW-Milwaukee, 10-9).

ORAL ROBERTS TABBED TO WIN MID-CON BASEBALL CROWN

Once again, Oral Roberts was chosen as the favorite to win the Mid-Continent Conference baseball crown in a preseason vote of league coaches. The Golden Eagles, who have won three regular-season and four tournament titles since joining the Mid-Con in the 1998 season, received five of six first-place votes in the preseason poll, easily outdistancing second-place Valparaiso, which received the other first-place tally. Southern Utah finished third in the poll, and was followed by Oakland, Western Illinois and Chicago State.

MID-CON TOURNAMENT TO BE HELD IN TULSA; WINNER RECEIVES NCAA BID

The 2002 Mid-Continent Conference Baseball Tournament will take place at J.L. Johnson Stadium in Tulsa, Okla., on the campus of Oral Roberts University, from May 23-25. The top four teams (according to conference standings) will take place in the double-elimination event, and the tourney winner will receive the league's automatic berth to the NCAA Baseball Tournament. Oral Roberts will host the Mid-Con Tournament for the fifth straight season, and will be looking for its fifth NCAA trip in as many years.

ORAL ROBERTS' GOLLOWAY NAMED TO USA BASEBALL COACHING STAFF

Oral Roberts head coach Sunny Golloway received some good news earlier this spring, when he was named as one of three assistant coaches for the 2002 USA Baseball National Team, a squad of collegiate all-stars that will be play roughly 30 games this summer on the USA Baseball Red, White and Blue Tour. The team is scheduled to play against the Japanese Collegiate All-Stars in June and will then tour the United States on the Red, White and Blue Tour. After that, the team will compete in the Honkbal Baseball Classic in The Netherlands, as well as the FISU World Baseball Championships in Italy in August. This will be Golloway's first USA Baseball coaching experience.
