Castillo earned Player of the Week honors for the second time in as many weeks after continuing his hot streak at the plate for the Golden Eagles. Castillo batted .700 (7-10) in two games, as Oral Roberts beat Michigan (11-4) and Kansas (22-5). He went 5-for-6 against Michigan, which included a double and a home run, and drove in four runs. He followed that up with a two-hit game against Kansas, as the Golden Eagles set a school record with 29 hits. Castillo has lifted his average to .391.

Carmosino helped the Golden Grizzlies to their first back-to-back wins of the year by putting forth his best effort yet this season. Carmosino picked up the win in an 11-3 victory at Eastern Michigan by throwing seven innings and allowing six hits and two runs (one earned) and punching out seven. His teammates beat Madonna the next day, which provided the Golden Grizzlies with their first consecutive victories this season.

2002 Mid-Con Baseball Notebook

AROUND THE MID-CON...

Chicago State (1-8, 0-0 Mid-Con): Chicago State dropped its only game last week, a 12-2 decision at Northern Illinois... the Cougars managed just five hits in the in-state loss... John Jensen belted a solo home run in the defeat.

Oakland (3-13, 0-0 Mid-Con): Oakland posted its first consecutive wins of the season by beating Eastern Michigan (11-3) on the road and Madonna (3-2) at home... the Golden Grizzlies used a six-run sixth inning to pull away from Eastern Michigan... Matt Gabrielli had three hits and drove in two runs, while Mid-Con Pitcher of the Week Dominic Carmosino tossed seven innings, allowing six hits and two runs while striking out seven... Steve Kniebbe allowed only four hits and two runs in five innings against Madonna, and Oakland held on for the one-run win.

Oral Roberts (14-8 Mid-Con): Oral Roberts pushed its win streak to three games with lopsided wins over Michigan (11-4) and Kansas (22-5)... Mid-Con Player of the Week David Castillo earned that honor for the second time in as many weeks... he batted .700 (7-10) in two games, which included a 5-for-6 effort in the win against Michigan... he doubled, homered and drove in four runs in that win... Rene Recio snapped a personal three-game losing streak by throwing seven innings and striking out 11... the Golden Eagles established a new school record by pounding out 29 hits in the win at Kansas... every starter had at least two hits, and four players (Chad Stewart, Billy Joe Richardson, Erick Donaldson and Doug Bernier) had four hits each... Eric Thornton's grand slam highlighted an 11-run third inning... Michael Rogers earned the win, improving to 6-0 for the season... Reynolds has hit safely in 13 straight games... Danny Boyle tied a school record with his eight at-bats against Kansas.

Southern Utah (2-21, 0-0 Mid-Con): Southern Utah was idle last week.

Valparaiso (1-10-1, 0-0 Mid-Con): Valparaiso snapped a seven-game, season-opening winless streak by beating Lewis (6-3), but then lost once at Indiana and three times at Ball State... Brandon Sadler had three hits, including a home run, in the win at Lewis, while Marc Boggio and Sean Peickert also went deep... Brian Lewis lasted 8.1 innings and struck out six to earn his first win of the season... Indiana scored in each of the first five innings and held on for the win against the Crusaders... Joe Sester had a pair of doubles in the first loss at Ball State... Boggio went the distance on the mound in the second game, allowing only three hits in a 5-1 loss... the Crusaders managed only one run on five hits in the final two games at Ball State... three of Kyle Young's four hits last week were doubles... Mark Pedersen needs three doubles, nine runs and 11 hits to become Valparaiso's career leader in each of those categories.

Western Illinois (2-17, 0-0 Mid-Con): Western Illinois lost its first two games last week (at Eastern Illinois and Northern Illinois) to extend its losing streak to nine games, but rebounded with a 5-4 win in its home opener against Northern Illinois... Eastern Illinois battered Leatherneck pitching for 13 runs and 15 hits in a shutout win... Western Illinois was down by a 12-2 count heading into the final three innings at Northern Illinois before rallying... the Leathernecks scored once in both the seventh and eighth innings, before exploding for six runs in the ninth, which was highlighted by a Joe Rooney homer... Western Illinois then loaded the bases before the Huskies put out the fire... the Leathernecks exacted some revenge the next day, winning in the ninth inning against the same Huskies... Ricky McCool reached on an error to lead off the ninth inning, stole third, and came home on a Troy Shelby single... Josh Roach earned his second win of the season by throwing four innings of scoreless relief.

ORAL ROBERTS BATS ANNOUNCE THEIR PRESENCE WITH AUTHORITY

Oral Roberts has won seven of its last nine games, and pushed its current win streak to three games with a pair of offensive-minded wins over the weekend in Lawrence, Kan. The Golden Eagles dropped Michigan by an 11-4 score on Saturday, and then beat up the host Jayhawks by a 22-5 count on Sunday. Mid-Con Player of the Week David Castillo earned that honor for the second time in as many weeks by going 7-for-10 in the two games. He had five hits, including a double and a home run, and drove in four runs against Michigan. Every Oral Roberts starter had at least two hits in the win at Kansas, as the team set a school single-game record with 29 hits. Four players - Chad Stewart, Billy Joe Richardson, Erick Donaldson and Doug Bernier - had four hits each in the victory (the latter three made up the bottom third of the order). Eric Thornton's grand slam highlighted an 11-run third inning.

GOLDEN EAGLE ARMS HELP THE CAUSE AS WELL

Sure, Oral Roberts posted 33 runs in two wins last week, but the Golden Eagles got some great pitching too. In the Michigan win, Rene Recio snapped a personal three-game losing streak by throwing seven innings and striking out 11. Michael Rogers remained unbeaten the next day, lasting six innings and striking out five to move to 6-0 this year.

THAT'S NEW... A WIN STREAK

Oakland won back-to-back games for the first time this season last week, beating Eastern Michigan (11-3) on the road and Madonna (3-2) at home. Mid-Con Pitcher of the Week Dominic Carmosino lasted seven innings in his start at Eastern Michigan, and scattered six hits while striking out seven. Oakland is in good company as far as the league's win streaks go; besides Oakland, only Mid-Con preseason favorite Oral Roberts has posted consecutive victories this season.

ORAL ROBERTS TABBED TO WIN MID-CON BASEBALL CROWN

Once again, Oral Roberts was chosen as the favorite to win the Mid-Continent Conference baseball crown in a preseason vote of league coaches. The Golden Eagles, who have won three regular-season and four tournament titles since joining the Mid-Con in the 1998 season, received five of six first-place votes in the preseason poll, easily outdistancing second-place Valparaiso, which received the other first-place tally. Southern Utah finished third in the poll, and was followed by Oakland, Western Illinois and Chicago State.

MID-CON TOURNAMENT TO BE HELD IN TULSA; WINNER RECEIVES NCAA BID

The 2002 Mid-Continent Conference Baseball Tournament will take place at J.L. Johnson Stadium in Tulsa, Okla., on the campus of Oral Roberts University, from May 23-25. The top four teams (according to conference standings) will take place in the double-elimination event, and the tourney winner will receive the league's automatic berth to the NCAA Baseball Tournament. Oral Roberts will host the Mid-Con Tournament for the fifth straight season, and will be looking for its fifth NCAA trip in as many years.

ORAL ROBERTS' GOLLOWAY NAMED TO USA BASEBALL COACHING STAFF

Oral Roberts head coach Sunny Golloway received some good news earlier this spring, when he was named as one of three assistant coaches for the 2002 USA Baseball National Team, a squad of collegiate all-stars that will be play roughly 30 games this summer on the USA Baseball Red, White and Blue Tour. The team is scheduled to play against the Japanese Collegiate All-Stars in June and will then tour the United States on the Red, White and Blue Tour. After that, the team will compete in the Honkbal Baseball Classic in The Netherlands, as well as the FISU World Baseball Championships in Italy in August. This will be Golloway's first USA Baseball coaching experience.

ORAL ROBERTS SOLID AT JOHNNY QUIK CLASSIC

Oral Roberts posted a good showing in one of the premier annual college baseball tournaments, finishing third of eight teams at the Pepsi/Johnny Quik Classic, hosted by Fresno State. The Golden Eagles went 4-2 in the six-day affair, beating Fordham (7-1), Liberty (21-5), Illinois State (16-3) and Gonzaga (4-1). David Castillo was the offensive ringleader, as he posted four consecutive multi-hit games and batted .500 (12-24) with four doubles, four home runs and 12 RBIs. Michael Rogers continued his All-America effort with a pair of complete game wins, beating Fordham and Gonzaga. He struck out 10 and allowed only 10 hits and one earned run, good for a 0.50 ERA.
