Peter Varon, Oakland Jr., 1B, Bloomfield Hills, Mich.

Varon helped Oakland to a big win over Big Ten foe Michigan, as well as a weekend split with Southern Utah in league play. Against the Wolverines, Varon had a double and a triple and scored twice in a 17-3 win. He then went on a power barrage against Southern Utah. He belted a two-run homer and added an RBI single in an 8-5 win in the opener, hit another two-run dinger in a game two loss, and slugged a game-winning solo shot in the fifth inning of a 4-3 triumph in the final game of the series. For the week, he batted .375 with three homers, eight RBIs and seven runs scored.



Jared Thomas, Oakland Jr., LHP, Clarkston, Mich.

Thomas started the Golden Grizzlies' series against Southern Utah off with a dominating effort in an 8-5 win. Thomas fanned a career-high 14 batters in eight innings of work against the Thunderbirds, doing so without issuing a walk. He scattered five hits and allowed four runs (only two of which were earned) for his first victory of the season. Thomas increased his league-best strikeouts-per-nine innings average to 14.66 with his effort, which was just one punchout short of the school game record.

2002 Mid-Con Baseball Notebook

AROUND THE MID-CON...

Chicago State (3-18, 0-2 Mid-Con): Chicago State dropped four games last week, including a pair to start conference play... John Jensen belted two home runs in a loss at home to Northwestern... Chicago State rallied from a pair of threerun deficits against Valparaiso in the first game of their twinbill, but lost in the bottom of the ninth... Nick Troy had two hits and two RBIs in the loss... Chicago was shut out over the last six innings in the second game loss to Valpo.

Oakland (10-23, 2-2 Mid-Con): Oakland split six games last week, posting a 17-3 win at Michigan and splitting a Mid-Con series with Southern Utah... Oakland used a seven-run fifth to pull away from Michigan... Mid-Con Player of the Week Peter Varon had a double and a triple and scored twice... Varon gave Oakland an early lead in game one against Southern Utah with a two-run homer... Mid-Con Pitcher of the Week Jared Thomas fanned a career-high 14 in eight innings of work to earn his first win of the season... Varon also homered in game two of the series, and slugged a game-winning solo shot in the final game, a 4-3 win... for the week, Varon batted .375 with three homers and eight RBIs and scored seven runs.

Oral Roberts (23-14, 2-0 Mid-Con): Oral Roberts dropped five straight games last week, losing to Oklahoma State and Arkansas before falling three times against Oklahoma... the team's five-game losing streak is its longest since 1997... Michael Rogers needs 38 strikeouts to become the school's career leader... the Golden Eagles led throughout in the second game against Oklahoma, but the Sooners rallied with two runs with two outs in the ninth for a 6-5 win... Chad Stewart went 4-for-5 in the final game against Oklahoma... Rene Recio's streak without allowing an earned run was stopped at 26.1... Doug Bernier had six hits and six walks in five games.

Southern Utah (7-27, 2-2 Mid-Con): Southern Utah started the week with a loss at UNLV, and split a Mid-Con series at Oakland... the Thunderbirds rallied for 18 hits in an 11-3 win in the second game... Aaron Lancaster had four hits, including a homer, and drove in four runs, while Rick White struck out eight in seven innings for his first win of the season... James Anderson became the school's career shutouts leader when he fired his fourth in a 7-0 win... Jake Reynolds and Ryan DuVall each had two hits... Reynolds had at least one hit in each game last week, with two doubles, a triple and a homer... his five triples tie for second on the school's season list... Chris Nelson was hit four times at Oakland, becoming the school's career leader with 44 (in 87 games).

Valparaiso (6-19-1, 2-0 Mid-Con): Valparaiso dropped three non-conference games before sweeping two Mid-Con games from Chicago State... Sean Peickert had four hits, including a double and a triple, in the loss at Manchester... the Crusaders led UW-Milwaukee 4-1 heading into the final three innings but lost 8-4... Peickert earned wins in both ends of the doubleheader against Chicago State, the first in relief and the second in a complete game effort... Kyle Young drove in the game-winning run in the ninth in the first game with an RBI single... Jeff Mandsager and Dan Schrum each homered in the second game, while Mark Pedersen had two hits and scored twice... Pedersen became the school's career leader in both hits (225) and runs scored (146) in the twinbill.

Western Illinois (5-27, 0-2 Mid-Con): Western Illinois won two of five games last week, including doubleheader splits at Coe and at home against IPFW... Joe Rooney's RBI single was the difference in an 8-7 win at Coe in the first game... the Leathernecks scored six times in the seventh in game two, but lost in the bottom of the inning, 7-6... Bradley rallied from a 5-1 deficit to beat Western Illinois, 11-9... Rooney had three hits and three RBIs... IPFW scored three in the 11th inning in an 8-5 win... Rooney doubled and homered in the loss... Ricky McCool fired a three-hit shutout to beat IPFW, 2-0, in the nightcap... Jeremy Lee's two-run double provided all of the offense... Rooney batted .500 (9-18) with two homers and eight RBIs in five games.

VALPO STARTS MID-CON PLAY WITH TWO WINS

Valparaiso had just four wins heading into its first Mid-Con series of the season against Chicago State, and all of those wins were against non-NCAA Division I competition. However, the Crusaders proved they could win against NCAA Division I teams with a pair of wins (9-8, 6-1) over Chicago State. After the visiting Cougars had rallied from a pair of three-run deficits to tie the first game in the ninth inning, Valparaiso's Kyle Young won the game in the bottom of the ninth with an RBI single. In the second game, Dan Schrum and Jeff Mandsager both homered. Sean Peickert earned the win in both ends of the doubleheader, tossing two-thirds of an inning in relief in the first game before tossing a six-hitter in the nightcap.

OAKLAND'S BIG NUMBERS MERIT AN AWARDS SWEEP

Oakland's Peter Varon and Jared Thomas swept Mid-Con Player and Pitcher of the Week accolades this week after they each posted some big numbers in a successful week for the Golden Grizzlies. Varon had a double and a triple in a 17-3 win over Michigan (Oakland's second victory over a Big Ten team in as many weeks), then homered three times in a Mid-Con series split with Southern Utah. Varon hit a two-run shot in the first inning of an 8-5 win, and also slugged a solo shot in the fifth inning of a 4-3 victory in game four. Thomas, meanwhile, fanned a career-best 14 in eight innings of work in the first game against Southern Utah, earning his first win of the season in the process. Thomas, who allowed two earned runs in the game, did not walk a batter.

OUCH! SOUTHERN UTAH'S NELSON SETS RECORD

Southern Utah's Chris Nelson was hit by a pitch four times in his team's series split at Oakland, which is nothing new for the Thunderbird catcher. Nelson's four plunkings gave him a school career-record 44 in just 87 games over his two seasons at Southern Utah. Last season, he was hit 26 times, which tied for the seventh-highest total in NCAA Division I history.

ORAL ROBERTS TABBED TO WIN MID-CON BASEBALL CROWN

Once again, Oral Roberts was chosen as the favorite to win the Mid-Continent Conference baseball crown in a preseason vote of league coaches. The Golden Eagles, who have won three regular-season and four tournament titles since joining the Mid-Con in the 1998 season, received five of six first-place votes in the preseason poll, easily outdistancing second-place Valparaiso, which received the other first-place tally. Southern Utah finished third in the poll, and was followed by Oakland, Western Illinois and Chicago State.

MID-CON TOURNAMENT TO BE HELD IN TULSA; WINNER RECEIVES NCAA BID

The 2002 Mid-Continent Conference Baseball Tournament will take place at J.L. Johnson Stadium in Tulsa, Okla., on the campus of Oral Roberts University, from May 23-25. The top four teams (according to conference standings) will take place in the double-elimination event, and the tourney winner will receive the league's automatic berth to the NCAA Baseball Tournament. Oral Roberts will host the Mid-Con Tournament for the fifth straight season, and will be looking for its fifth NCAA trip in as many years.

ORAL ROBERTS' GOLLOWAY NAMED TO USA BASEBALL COACHING STAFF

Oral Roberts head coach Sunny Golloway received some good news earlier this spring, when he was named as one of three assistant coaches for the 2002 USA Baseball National Team, a squad of collegiate all-stars that will be play roughly 30 games this summer on the USA Baseball Red, White and Blue Tour. The team is scheduled to play against the Japanese Collegiate All-Stars in June and will then tour the United States on the Red, White and Blue Tour. After that, the team will compete in the Honkbal Baseball Classic in The Netherlands, as well as the FISU World Baseball Championships in Italy in August. This will be Golloway's first USA Baseball coaching experience.

ORAL ROBERTS SOLID AT JOHNNY QUIK CLASSIC

Oral Roberts posted a good showing in one of the premier annual college baseball tournaments, finishing third of eight teams at the Pepsi/Johnny Quik Classic, hosted by Fresno State. The Golden Eagles went 4-2 in the six-day affair, beating Fordham (7-1), Liberty (21-5), Illinois State (16-3) and Gonzaga (4-1). David Castillo was the offensive ringleader, as he posted four consecutive multi-hit games and batted .500 (12-24) with four doubles, four home runs and 12 RBIs. Michael Rogers continued his All-America effort with a pair of complete game wins, beating Fordham and Gonzaga. He struck out 10 and allowed only 10 hits and one earned run, good for a 0.50 ERA.

SOUTHERN UTAH'S ANDERSON METHODICAL IN SHUTOUT WIN

Southern Utah topped Air Force by a score of 9-0 on Mar. 27, thanks to a terrific effort from starter James Anderson. Anderson used only 97 pitches in the nine-inning, complete game effort, striking out three and scattering six hits. The whitewash was the third of his career, making him the school's all-time leader in that category.

ORAL ROBERTS' RECIO EARNS NATIONAL HONOR

Oral Roberts beat visiting Kansas by an 8-0 score on Apr. 2, thanks to a noteworthy performance by starter Rene Recio. He tossed a one-hit, complete game shutout at the Jayhawks, struck out 13 batters, and faced just one hitter over the minimum. He struck out more than one hitter in five of nine innings, and set down 15 in a row after allowing a single in the third. Recio was named the Mid-Con Pitcher of the Week for the second time this season, and was also honored as the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association Pitcher of the Week.

ORAL ROBERTS EARNS RANKING FROM NCBWA

An 11-game win streak and an 8-3 win over nationally ranked Oklahoma State helped Mid-Con preseason favorite Oral Roberts earn its first ranking this season. The Golden Eagles were ranked No. 32 in the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association poll for the week of April 10.
