Mid-Con Player/ Pitcher of the Week

Pete Tronick, Western Illinois So., 2B, Morton, III.

Tronick helped lead the Leathernecks to their only four-game sweep in league play this season by batting .500 (7-14) in four games against Chicago State. Tronick hit safely in each game in the series, including a pair of two-hit games in games three and four. Tronick came up with a game-winning, two-run double in the ninth inning of a 6-4 win in the third game of the series, and belted an RBI single in the seventh to win the final game, 3-2. He drove in four runs in the four games.

Mark Pedersen, Valparaiso Sr., RHP, North Oaks, Minn.

Pedersen tossed one of the finest games of his career at the right time for the Crusaders. In the series finale, he hurled a three-hit shutout at Southern Utah to win by a 5-0 count, which clinched Valparaiso a berth in the Mid-Con Tournament. Pedersen fanned a career-high 14 and did not walk a batter in the seven-inning, complete game effort. All three of the hits that he allowed were singles; he faced three batters over the minimum in the win. Pedersen also batted .368 (7-19) with a home run and three RBIs and scored five times in five games during the week.

Michael Rogers, Oral Roberts Sr., RHP, Artesia, N.M.

Rogers, who last season won league Co-Pitcher of the Year honors, posted the best effort of his career in his final regular-season start. Rogers allowed only one baserunner while tossing a one-hit shutout in a 6-0 win over Oakland to open a four-game series, fanning nine and walking none in the process. He needed only 98 pitches to pick up the win, which was his league-leading 10th in 13 decisions.

2002 Mid-Con Baseball Notebook

AROUND THE MID-CON...

Chicago State (5-36, 0-14 Mid-Con): Chicago State closed its season on an eight-game losing streak, which included six games in the final week... John Szykowny had five hits in a four-game series sweep at the hands of Western Illinois... the Cougars finished the conference slate with an 0-14 mark, becoming the first Mid-Con team ever to finish a league base-ball schedule without a conference win.

Oakland (18-33, 9-8 Mid-Con): Oakland salvaged the last game of a four-game series at Oral Roberts... Jared Thomas allowed two runs and struck out seven in the series opener but took the loss... after collecting 10 hits in three losses at Oral Roberts, the Golden Grizzlies racked up 11 hits in a 6-3 win in the final game of the series... Erik Crossley had two hits and drove in three... Oakland will be the No. 3 seed in the Mid-Con Tournament.

Oral Roberts (43-17, 16-2 Mid-Con): Oral Roberts beat Texas-San Antonio twice before taking three of four from Oakland to close league play... Stockton Davis fanned eight in six relief innings in a 10-5 win over Texas-San Antonio... David Humen allowed one run in six innings in a 3-1 victory... Mid-Con Co-Pitcher of the Week Michael Rogers tossed a one-hit shutout, striking out nine, in a 6-0 win in the opener over Oakland... David Castillo had four hits, including a two-run homer... Castillo drove in four, which included another two-run homer, in a 7-1 win in the second game... Rene Recio fanned eight in six innings of work... Dennis Bigley tossed six shutout innings in a 6-0 win in game three, while Davis and Danny Boyle each drove in two... Castillo batted .438 with two homer and 10 RBIs for the week... his 73 RBIs this season rank sixth on the school's season list... Oral Roberts will serve as the top seed in the Mid-Con Tournament for the fifth straight season.

Southern Utah (16-35, 11-7 Mid-Con): Southern Utah took three of four games at Valparaiso to finish in second place in the Mid-Con standings... the Thunderbirds played two extra-inning games on the first day, winning them by scores 2-1 and 6-5, both in 11 innings... Chris Gardner tossed 4.2 scoreless innings of relief in the first game to earn the win... Wes Matthews used 3.2 scoreless relief innings in the second contest... those were the first extra-inning contests in 114 games for Southern Utah, dating to 2000... James Anderson allowed one run in a 5-1 win in game three, striking out six... his start was the school-record 39th of his career... Chris Nelson's hit-by-pitch in the second game of the series was his school-record 27th of the year... Southern Utah will be the No. 2 seed in the Mid-Con Tournament.

Valparaiso (15-30-1, 7-9 Mid-Con): Valparaiso beat Western Michigan (9-1) before dropping three of four to visiting Southern Utah to close league play... eight pitchers combined to allow five hits to Western Michigan... Sean Peickert had three hits, including a homer, while Mid-Con Co-Pitcher of the Week Mark Pedersen belted a two-run shot... Valpo was in danger of missing the Mid-Con Tournament before Pedersen saved the day... he tossed his first complete game of the year, fanning a career-best 14 in seven innings of work while allowing three hits in a 5-0 win... Marc Boggio had three hits and scored twice... Valparaiso will be the No. 4 seed in the Mid-Con Tournament.

Western Illinois (12-39, 6-9 Mid-Con): Western Illinois closed the season with a four-game sweep at Chicago State, but the Leathernecks missed out on a Mid-Con Tournament berth by percentage points... Bryan Hinson had three hits and drove in two in a 4-1 win in the first game... Brian Lewis gave up six hits and fanned nine in the win... Joe Rooney's two-run homer was the difference in a 3-1 victory in game two... Mid-Con Player of the Week Pete Tronick sparked the wins on the second day, as he recorded a two-run double in the ninth inning of a 6-4 win in game one, and added a game-winning RBI single in a 3-2 victory in the last game of the series... he batted .500 in the series and drove in four.

MID-CON TOURNAMENT SET FOR THIS WEEKEND

The field is set for the 2002 Mid-Con Baseball Tournament. Oral Roberts, which finished with a 16-2 league record, captured its fourth straight Mid-Con regular-season crown, and will be the top seed in tournament for the fifth straight season. The Golden Eagles will square off against fourth-seeded Valparaiso in the first round, which squeaked into the tournament by winning its final game of the regular season. Southern Utah took three of four games at Valparaiso in the final weekend of league play to move in as the second seed in the tournament. No. 3 seed Oakland, which became the second league team to earn a win over Oral Roberts in the final game of the Mid-Con slate, will play the Thunderbirds in the first round.

TOO TOUGH TO CHOOSE...

A pair of Mid-Con pitchers posted spectacular outings in the final week of the regular season, making it impossible to differentiate between the two for Mid-Con Pitcher of the Week accolades. Oral Roberts' Michael Rogers fired a complete game one-hitter in a 6-0 win over Oakland, striking out nine and facing just one better over the minimum for his first shutout of the season. Not to be outdone, Valparaiso's Mark Pedersen clinched his team a berth in the Mid-Con Tournament with a three-hit shutout in a 5-0 win over Southern Utah. Pedersen struck out a career-high 14 in seven innings of work while walking none.

LEATHERNECKS FINISH ON A STRONG NOTE

Western Illinois needed a bunch of things to happen in the final week of Mid-Con play if it was to make the league tournament. The Leathernecks took care of their own business by sweeping four tight games at Chicago State. Western Illinois triumphed by scores of 4-1 and 3-1 on the first day, and won by 6-4 and 3-2 counts in the second doubleheader. Mid-Con Player of the Week Pete Tronick batted .500 (7-14) in the series, and collected gamewinning hits in the final frame of each of the second-day wins.

ORAL ROBERTS TABBED TO WIN MID-CON BASEBALL CROWN

Once again, Oral Roberts was chosen as the favorite to win the Mid-Continent Conference baseball crown in a preseason vote of league coaches. The Golden Eagles, who have won three regular-season and four tournament titles since joining the Mid-Con in the 1998 season, received five of six first-place votes in the preseason poll, easily outdistancing second-place Valparaiso, which received the other first-place tally. Southern Utah finished third in the poll, and was followed by Oakland, Western Illinois and Chicago State.

MID-CON TOURNAMENT TO BE HELD IN TULSA; WINNER RECEIVES NCAA BID

The 2002 Mid-Continent Conference Baseball Tournament will take place at J.L. Johnson Stadium in Tulsa, Okla., on the campus of Oral Roberts University, from May 23-25. The top four teams (according to conference standings) will take place in the double-elimination event, and the tourney winner will receive the league's automatic berth to the NCAA Baseball Tournament. Oral Roberts will host the Mid-Con Tournament for the fifth straight season, and will be looking for its fifth NCAA trip in as many years.

ORAL ROBERTS' GOLLOWAY NAMED TO USA BASEBALL COACHING STAFF

Oral Roberts head coach Sunny Golloway received some good news earlier this spring, when he was named as one of three assistant coaches for the 2002 USA Baseball National Team, a squad of collegiate all-stars that will be play roughly 30 games this summer on the USA Baseball Red, White and Blue Tour. The team is scheduled to play against the Japanese Collegiate All-Stars in June and will then tour the United States on the Red, White and Blue Tour. After that, the team will compete in the Honkbal Baseball Classic in The Netherlands, as well as the FISU World Baseball Championships in Italy in August. This will be Golloway's first USA Baseball coaching experience.

ORAL ROBERTS SOLID AT JOHNNY QUIK CLASSIC

Oral Roberts posted a good showing in one of the premier annual college baseball tournaments, finishing third of eight teams at the Pepsi/Johnny Quik Classic, hosted by Fresno State. The Golden Eagles went 4-2 in the six-day affair, beating Fordham (7-1), Liberty (21-5), Illinois State (16-3) and Gonzaga (4-1). David Castillo was the offensive ringleader, as he posted four consecutive multi-hit games and batted .500 (12-24) with four doubles, four home runs and 12 RBIs. Michael Rogers continued his All-America effort with a pair of complete game wins, beating Fordham and Gonzaga. He struck out 10 and allowed only 10 hits and one earned run, good for a 0.50 ERA.

SOUTHERN UTAH'S ANDERSON METHODICAL IN SHUTOUT WIN

Southern Utah topped Air Force by a score of 9-0 on Mar. 27, thanks to a terrific effort from starter James Anderson. Anderson used only 97 pitches in the nine-inning, complete game effort, striking out three and scattering six hits. The whitewash was the third of his career, making him the school's all-time leader in that category.

ORAL ROBERTS' RECIO EARNS NATIONAL HONOR

Oral Roberts beat visiting Kansas by an 8-0 score on Apr. 2, thanks to a noteworthy performance by starter Rene Recio. He tossed a one-hit, complete game shutout at the Jayhawks, struck out 13 batters, and faced just one hitter over the minimum. He struck out more than one hitter in five of nine innings, and set down 15 in a row after allowing a single in the third. Recio was named the Mid-Con Pitcher of the Week for the second time this season, and was also honored as the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association Pitcher of the Week.

ORAL ROBERTS EARNS RANKING FROM NCBWA

An 11-game win streak and an 8-3 win over nationally ranked Oklahoma State helped Mid-Con preseason favorite Oral Roberts earn its first ranking this season. The Golden Eagles were ranked No. 32 in the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association poll for the week of April 10.
