2002 Mid-Con Baseball Notebook

AROUND THE MID-CON...

Chicago State (5-36, 0-14 Mid-Con): Chicago State closed the season on an eight-game losing streak and finished the conference season 0-14, becoming the first Mid-Con team ever to finish a league baseball schedule without a win.

Oakland (19-35, 9-8 Mid-Con): Oakland beat Southern Utah in the first round of the Mid-Con Tournament (8-6), but lost its next two games to Oral Roberts (12-3) and Southern Utah (7-6)... Ty Herriot had two homers and drove in four in the first-round win... Herriot batted .545 (6-11) in three tourney games, and was named to the all-tournament team along with teammates Ryan Freiburger and Peter Varon.

Oral Roberts (46-17, 16-2 Mid-Con): Oral Roberts won its fifth straight Mid-Con Tournament title by beating Valparaiso (8-0), Oakland (12-3) and Southern Utah (7-1)... Mid-Con Tournament MVP Erick Donaldson went 4-for-4 and drove in two in the first-round wins... Danny Boyle added three hits, and the Golden Eagles collected 16 as a team... Dennis Bigley hit a three-run homer and drove in four in the second-round win... the Golden Eagles scored seven times in the final two innings... Michael Rogers earned his 11th win of the season, allowing one earned runs in 6.1 innings... Donaldson and David Castillo each had three hits in the championship game win, while Bigley worked 5.1 innings for the win... Donaldson was joined on the all-tournament team by Bigley, Boyle, Castillo, Doug Bernier and Stockton Davis... only SW Missouri State, with its six Mid-Con titles from 1984-89, has won more league tourney crowns than Oral Roberts... Castillo was named the Mid-Con Player of the Year, while head coach Sunny Golloway was cited as the Coach of the Year... the Golden Eagles are 98-14 in Mid-Con play since the 1998 season, and 18-1 in Mid-Con Tournament play.

Southern Utah (18-37, 11-7 Mid-Con): Southern Utah reached the championship game of the Mid-Con Tournament for the third straight season before losing to Oral Roberts... the Thunderbirds lost in the first round to Oakland (8-6)... Jake Reynolds and Ryan DuVall each had three hits in the loss... Jona Droubay had three hits and scored three times in a 10-4 win over Valparaiso... Rick White struck out seven in the complete game win... Kelcey Kemp's bases-loaded infield single in the ninth gave Southern Utah a 7-6 win over Oakland... Shane Perkins pitched eight relief innings to pick up the win... DuVall, Perkins, Reynolds, White and Chris Nelson each were named to the all-tournament team.

Valparaiso (15-32-1, 7-9 Mid-Con): Valparaiso lost its first two games in the Mid-Con Tournament... Kyle Young had two hits in an 8-0 loss to Oral Roberts in the first round... the Crusaders fell behind by ten runs before finally falling to Southern Utah, 10-4, in the first elimination game... Mike Jaroscak had three hits in the loss, while Jeff Mandsager homered.

Western Illinois (12-39, 6-9 Mid-Con): Western Illinois closed the season with a four-game sweep at Chicago State, but the Leathernecks missed out on a Mid-Con Tournament berth by percentage points.

ORAL ROBERTS WINS FIFTH STRAIGHT MID-CON TOURNAMENT TITLE

Oral Roberts was predicted to be the top team in the Mid-Continent Conference this season in a preseason poll of league coaches, and that prediction proved to be true. The Golden Eagles, who won their fourth straight league regular-season title after finishing with a 16-2 conference mark, swept three games in the Mid-Con Tournament to win their fifth straight tourney crown. Tournament MVP Erick Donaldson batted .667 (8-for-12) in three tourney games, and was one of six Oral Roberts players named to the all-tournament team. Oral Roberts moved to 18-1 all-time in Mid-Con Tournament play, and has won nine straight league tournament games since the 2000 season.

CASTILLO, ANDERSON, THOMAS EARN MID-CON BASEBALL ACCOLADES

Oral Roberts' David Castillo capped a terrific sophomore season by earning Mid-Con Player of the Year honors. Castillo was one of seven Golden Eagles who earned first-team all-conference accolades; Doug Bernier, Danny Boyle, Dallas Martin, Rene Recio, Wilton Reynolds and Michael Rogers joined him. Southern Utah's James Anderson earned first-team all-conference honors as both a starting pitcher and as a utilityman, and was also cited as the Mid-Con Pitcher of the Year after posting a 4-1 league mark. Oakland's Jared Thomas, who joined Anderson, Recio and Rogers as first-team all-conference starters, was named the Mid-Con Newcomer of the Year.

NCAA TOURNAMENT TIDBITS

Mid-Con teams are 3-18 all-time in NCAA Tournament play, with Oral Roberts posting a 2-8 record since joining the league prior to the 1998 season... the Golden Eagles picked up a win over UNC Charlotte (20-13) in 1998, and against Delaware (4-2) in 2000... league teams collected a 2-33 record against the NCAA Tournament field, with Oakland (10-5 over Ohio State) and Southern Utah (9-4 over BYU) earning the only wins... nine of Oral Roberts' 17 losses came against the NCAA Tourney field... only Southern Utah, which played ten games against the NCAA field, played more than Oral Roberts' nine... Oral Roberts lost three times to Oklahoma (6-2, 6-5, 7-5) and twice to Arkansas (14-0, 6-3), two teams that complete the Wichita State Regional... the Golden Eagles are lost three times at Baylor (7-3, 9-8, 4-2) and once to Arizona State (5-4)... six of the nine losses were by three runs or fewer.

ORAL ROBERTS TABBED TO WIN MID-CON BASEBALL CROWN

Once again, Oral Roberts was chosen as the favorite to win the Mid-Continent Conference baseball crown in a preseason vote of league coaches. The Golden Eagles, who have won three regular-season and four tournament titles since joining the Mid-Con in the 1998 season, received five of six first-place votes in the preseason poll, easily outdistancing second-place Valparaiso, which received the other first-place tally. Southern Utah finished third in the poll, and was followed by Oakland, Western Illinois and Chicago State.

ORAL ROBERTS' GOLLOWAY NAMED TO USA BASEBALL COACHING STAFF

Oral Roberts head coach Sunny Golloway received some good news earlier this spring, when he was named as one of three assistant coaches for the 2002 USA Baseball National Team, a squad of collegiate all-stars that will be play roughly 30 games this summer on the USA Baseball Red, White and Blue Tour. The team is scheduled to play against the Japanese Collegiate All-Stars in June and will then tour the United States on the Red, White and Blue Tour. After that, the team will compete in the Honkbal Baseball Classic in The Netherlands, as well as the FISU World Baseball Championships in Italy in August. This will be Golloway's first USA Baseball coaching experience.

ORAL ROBERTS SOLID AT JOHNNY QUIK CLASSIC

Oral Roberts posted a good showing in one of the premier annual college baseball tournaments, finishing third of eight teams at the Pepsi/Johnny Quik Classic, hosted by Fresno State. The Golden Eagles went 4-2 in the six-day affair, beating Fordham (7-1), Liberty (21-5), Illinois State (16-3) and Gonzaga (4-1). David Castillo was the offensive ringleader, as he posted four consecutive multi-hit games and batted .500 (12-24) with four doubles, four home runs and 12 RBIs. Michael Rogers continued his All-America effort with a pair of complete game wins, beating Fordham and Gonzaga. He struck out 10 and allowed only 10 hits and one earned run, good for a 0.50 ERA.

SOUTHERN UTAH'S ANDERSON METHODICAL IN SHUTOUT WIN

Southern Utah topped Air Force by a score of 9-0 on Mar. 27, thanks to a terrific effort from starter James Anderson. Anderson used only 97 pitches in the nine-inning, complete game effort, striking out three and scattering six hits. The whitewash was the third of his career, making him the school's all-time leader in that category.

ORAL ROBERTS' RECIO EARNS NATIONAL HONOR

Oral Roberts beat visiting Kansas by an 8-0 score on Apr. 2, thanks to a noteworthy performance by starter Rene Recio. He tossed a one-hit, complete game shutout at the Jayhawks, struck out 13 batters, and faced just one hitter over the minimum. He struck out more than one hitter in five of nine innings, and set down 15 in a row after allowing a single in the third. Recio was named the Mid-Con Pitcher of the Week for the second time this season, and was also honored as the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association Pitcher of the Week.

ORAL ROBERTS EARNS RANKING FROM NCBWA

An 11-game win streak and an 8-3 win over nationally ranked Oklahoma State helped Mid-Con preseason favorite Oral Roberts earn its first ranking this season. The Golden Eagles were ranked No. 32 in the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association poll for the week of April 10.
