ORAL ROBERTS GETS ON TRACK WITH HOME WINS: Oral Roberts, picked to win the Mid-Con in a preseason poll of league coaches, found itself below the .500 mark before returning home for a 10-game homestand. Apparently the accomodations at J.L. Johnson Stadium turned out to be the right medicine for the Golden Eagles, who won eight of ten games to move to 13-10 on the season. Oral Roberts won three of four games last week, including a come-from-behind 11-5 win over Wichita State.

WHO CAN GET THIS GUY OUT?: Oral Roberts' Matt VanDerBosch was an offensive machine for the Golden Eagles last week as they won three of four games. VanDerBosch was named the Mid-Con Player of the Week after batting a sizzling .600 (9-15); he posted at least two hits and scored twice in each game. In addition, VanDerBosch stole three bases and posted an on-base percentage of .684. He lifted his batting average to .355 with his big week.

THE YOUNGER, THE BETTER: Oral Roberts' Taylor McIntyre has proven to be a pretty decent performer in his rookie season for the Golden Eagles. He was named the Mid-Con Pitcher of the Week after tossing 9.2 innings without allowing an earned run in two starts. Vicitimized by poor defense behind him against Wichita State (he allowed five unearned runs before being chased), McIntyre allowed just an unearned run in seven innings of work in a 7-3 win over Northeastern while fanning nine. He has lowered his league-best ERA to 0.70.

VALPO LIKES HOME COOKIN' TOO: Valparaiso finally played at home for the first time this season last week, and the Crusaders won three games in as many outings. They needed a ninth-inning comeback to beat St. Joseph's in their home opener (10-9), but then swept Butler in a pair of low-scoring games, 3-2 and 2-0. Kevin Kutansky's RBI double in the sixth inning made a winner out of Marc Boggio in the first game; Boggio went the distance and struck out six in the win. In the nightcap, Elliot Gibbs tossed 5.1 no-hit innings, striking out nine in six shutout innings, before giving way to Adam Paetznick in the seventh, who earned his second save.

ROUGH WEEK: Mid-Con teams have some stiff competition ahead of them this week, as four of six teams face ranked competition. Oral Roberts is scheduled to face No. 24 (ABCA) Arkansas on the road before playing three games at Miami (Fla.), which is ranked ninth in both the ABCA and Baseball America poll. Southern Utah will host No. 24 (BA) UNLV in its only game this week, Valparaiso plays at No. 19 (BA) Notre Dame, and Western Illinois will play a pair at No. 14/11 Nebraska.

RIGHTING A WRONG: Oakland lost by an 18-3 count against Indiana Tech in its home opener last week, but the Golden Grizzlies took out their frustrations from that loss in game two of the doubleheader, scoring nine times in the first inning. Oakland went on to sweep Siena Heights (3-2, 1-0) later in the week.
