#### PLAYER

David Castillo, Oral Roberts  
Jr., C, Corpus Christi, Texas

Oral Roberts' David Castillo batted a scorching .769 (10-13) in a weekend sweep of Chicago State on the road, reaching base in 16 of his 20 plate appearances. Castillo had three extra-base hits (including a pair of homers), scored 11 times and drove in nine runs.

Castillo went 3-for-3 and scored three times in a 9-5 win to open the series, and in the second day's doubleheader, went 6-for-7 with a pair of home runs, seven runs scored and six RBIs. Castillo, who walked six times in four games, leads the Mid-Con in homers (12) and RBIs (50), and has lifted his average to a season-best .350.

Valparaiso's Tom Starck put together a masterful performance to beat Oakland by a 4-1 score in the opening game of the series between the two teams. Starck went all nine innings in the win, fanning a career-high 12 batters without a walk. Starck, who scattered eight

hits and allowed one earned run in his gem, struck out eight of the final 14 batters he faced, and retired 15 of the Golden Grizzlies' last 20 hitters. Starck lowered his ERA from 4.18 to 3.48 with the win.

**NO ANSWER:** Chicago State had no answer for Oral Roberts' David Castillo last weekend, as the reigning Mid-Con Player of the Year started campaigning for a repeat honor. Castillo led the Golden Eagles to a series sweep of the Cougars by batting a scorching .769 (10-13) in four games; he reached base in 16 of his 20 plate appearances, thanks to six walks. Castillo had a double and two home runs, scored 11 times and drove in nine runs in his most successful streak of the year. Castillo, who was named the Mid-Con Player of the Week for the fourth time this season, lifted his batting average to a season-high .350. Castillo leads the Mid-Con with his 12 home runs and 50 runs batted in.

**STARCK LEAVES OAKLAND RAVING AND MAD:** Valparaiso's Tom Starck became the second Crusader pitcher in as many weeks to earn Mid-Con Pitcher of the Week honors after tossing a gem against Oakland in a 4-1 win to open the series. Starck went the full nine innings for his first complete game of the season; he struck out 12 batters without issuing a walk, and scattered eight hits while earning his second win of the season. Starck, who lowered his ERA from 4.18 to 3.48 in the process, seemed to get stronger as the game wore on. He fanned eight of the last 14 hitters he faced.

**LATE HEROICS SAVE DAY ONE FOR WESTERN ILLINOIS...** Western Illinois held an 11-4 lead heading into the ninth inning of game one of its series against Southern Utah, but the Leatherneck bullpen squandered that lead, coughing up seven runs in the top of the inning. Blake Schultz eventually gave the hosts a 12-11 win, however, with a bases-loaded RBI single in the bottom of the tenth inning. Western Illinois rallied for another win in its last at-bat in the nightcap of that twinbill, scoring three runs in the bottom of the seventh for a 6-5 win.

**...BUT SOUTHERN UTAH RETURNS THE FAVOR ONE DAY TWO:** A day after dropping two heartbreakers at Western Illinois, Southern Utah moved back into sole possession of second place in the league standings with a sweep that salvaged a series sweep. The visiting Thunderbirds scored five runs in the tenth inning to take away an 11-6 win in the first game, and held on for a 6-5 win in the nightcap. Kurt Elliott batted .500 (7-14) with two doubles, a triple, a home run, six RBIs and five runs scored in the series split.

**OF NOTE:** With its sweep of Chicago State over the weekend, Oral Roberts has now won 105 of 120 conference games since joining the Mid-Con, good for an .875 winning percentage... the Golden Eagles rallied for a 3-2 win over state rival Oklahoma earlier in the week, giving them a season sweep of the Sooners... Oakland's Dominic Carmosino went the distance in a 4-1 win over Valparaiso in the nightcap of the first day's doubleheader between the two teams, striking out eight for his third win of the season... Western Illinois' Corey Ferger fired a one-hitter to beat Coe College, 1-0, for his first career win. He struck out seven in seven innings of work... the Leathernecks' Ryan Cougill entered the week on an 11-game hit streak. Cougill batted .467 (7-15) in the series against Southern Utah... Oral Roberts' Justin Ramsey earned relief wins against both Oklahoma and Chicago State last week, striking out 10 in eight innings without allowing an earned run.
