ORAL ROBERTS WINS SIXTH STRAIGHT MID-CON TITLE: Oral Roberts won its sixth straight Mid-Con Baseball Tournament by sweeping three games at its own J.L. Johnson Stadium. Mid-Con Tournament MVP Dennis Bigley homered in each game and drove in six runs over the three contests, and took a perfect game into the seventh inning in the opener against Valparaiso. He settled for a one-hit shutout, in which he struck out 12, and beat Valparaiso by an 8-0 count. The Golden Eagles also topped second-seeded Southern Utah twice, including an 8-2 win in the championship game. They are now 21-1 all-time in the Mid-Con Tournament.

TOURNEY ODDITIES: The 2003 Mid-Con Baseball Tournament featured a great deal of "free baseball." Three of the six tourney games went into extra innings, the most in any one season in the history of the tournament. Prior to the 2003 event, there had been only six extra-inning games in the previous 18 tournaments, and none since the 1999 season. Southern Utah topped Western Illinois (11-10) in 12 innings in the first round, Valparaiso beat Western Illinois (6-5) in 11 innings in the first elimination game, and Southern Utah topped Valpo (16-12) in the last elimination game to earn a bid to the championship round.

CASTILLO BECOMES FIRST TWO-TIME PLAYER OF THE YEAR: Oral Roberts' David Castillo became the first player in Mid-Con history to win multiple Player of the Year awards - let alone back-to-back awards - when he was honored again in 2003. Castillo, who won the honor in 2002 on his way to finishing with .398-14-79 numbers, belted a league- and career-high 17 home runs this season and also led the conference with his 70 RBIs. Castillo, who batted .583 (7-12) in the Mid-Con Tournament, finished with a .344 batting average.

MARTIN SHARES PITCHER OF THE YEAR HONOR WITH STARCK...: Oral Roberts' Dallas Martin, who was named as a first-team all-conference relief pitcher in both 2001 and 2002, was honored as a starter in 2003 after tossing five straight complete game wins in league play. Martin, who went 5-0 with a 2.31 ERA and 34 strikeouts in conference games, shared Mid-Con Pitcher of the Year honors with Valparaiso's Tom Starck, who went 3-0 with a 1.64 ERA and 50 strikeouts (in 39.1 innings) in conference play.

...BUT BIGLEY MIGHT BE THE BEST OF THEM ALL: Oral Roberts' Dennis Bigley, who earned two National Pitcher of the Week citations and was a three-time Mid-Con Pitcher of the Week honoree, won his last nine decisions prior to the NCAA Tournament. He finished the season with a 10-3 record, a 3.06 ERA and 85 strikeouts (against 13 walks) in 94.0 innings. Bigley had wins over both Miami (Fla.) and SW Missouri State in 2003.

MID-CON IN THE NCAA'S: The Mid-Con has sent a team to the NCAA tournament each season since 1994, and Mid-Con squads are now 5-22 all-time in 11 tourney appearances. Oral Roberts has represented the league six straight seasons, posting a 4-12 mark.

NOTABLES

- Chicago State nearly doubled its win total from the 2002 campaign under first-year coach Terrence Jackson. The Cougars went 9-47 in 2003, which included a 4-16 mark in Mid-Con play. Last season, Chicago State went 5-38, and became the first team in league history to go winless in league play (0-14).
- Chicago State failed to make the Mid-Con Tournament for the fourth straight season. The Cougars have made only one tourney appearance (1999) in their nine seasons in the Mid-Con.
- Catcher Brian Grippo and outfielder Mike Slowik were each honored on the All Mid-Con second team. The Cougars did not have an all-league selection in 2002; Slowik led the team with three home runs and 27 RBIs, while Grippo's .287 batting average topped the squad.
- Jason Stamper's best performance of his career came in his final outing, as he threw a one-hit shutout, in which he fanned, to beat Valparaiso by a 3-0 score in the Cougars' season finale. The win was Stamper's first in ten decisions on the mound in 2003.
- Chicago State's six games against the 2003 NCAA Tournament field were the third-most in the Mid-Con behind Oral Roberts' 15 and Oakland's seven.

- Oral Roberts won its fifth straight Mid-Con regular-season championship, doing so with a 19-1 league record. The Golden Eagles lost just one conference game for the third time in five seasons.
- The Golden Eagles also captured their sixth Mid-Con Tourney crown, improving to 21-1 all-time in tourney play. Oral Roberts made its 15th NCAA Tourney appearance in 2003, its sixth in as many years.
- Oral Roberts entered the NCAA Tournament having won 25 of its last 27 games, including 19 in a row over league foes (including the Mid-Con Tourney).

- On the verge of missing the Mid-Con Tournament for the first time since joining the league prior to the 2000 season, Southern Utah won its final six Mid-Con games to finish in second place in the league standings for the third straight season.

NOTABLES

- Western Illinois posted a 25-38 record in 2003, which marked its first 20-win season since 1995, and its highest single-season win tally since the 1985 squad posted 25 victories.
- Head coach Stan Hyman, whose team more than doubled its win total from his first year on the job, was named the Mid-Con Coach of the Year.
- The Leathernecks made their first appearance in the Mid-Con Tourney since the 2000 campaign, thanks to their 10-10 league record that led to a third-place finish in the conference standings.
- Blake Schultz, who led Western Illinois with his .366 batting average, was named the Mid-Con Newcomer of the Year. A first-team all-conference outfielder, he was joined on that team by second baseman Ryan Cougill (.361) and shortstop Ryan Schmidgall (.329).
- Schultz, who had hitting streaks of 18 and 19 games in 2003, set school season records with his 90 hits and 25 doubles, and also led the team with seven home runs, 56 RBIs and 52 runs scored.
- First baseman Joe Rooney (.293) and starting pitcher Nathan Miller (4-6, 5.34 ERA) were named as second-team all-league honorees.
