

This World War II-era time-lapse photograph, taken by a high-speed camera, shows a P-47 Thunderbolt fighter-bomber test-firing its relatively new rocket guns. Late in the war, the "Jug" became what many believe was USAAF's best fighterbomber. The Thunderbolt could carry about 2,500 pounds of bombs or M8 4.5-inch or 5-inch rockets, not to mention eight ma-chine guns. All of this ordnance allowed P-47 pilots to destroy 86,000 rail cars, 9,000 locomotives, 6,000 armored fighting vehicles, and some 68,000 trucks, among other targets.
